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2009 Season Preview Q&A

After a record-breaking Ivy League season in 2008, Princeton head coach Trina Salcido sizes up the '09 Tigers.

With everyone who contributed to Princeton's team-record 55 home runs a year ago back this season, should Princeton fans expect a similar display in 2009?

From day one I have always said that Princeton softball fans can expect that we will be exciting to watch, play the game hard, and that we will get better every day. It is our team philosophy that when you focus on the fundamentals, what we like to consider the "controllables," then you can definitely expect great things to happen. Last year "great things" translated into amazing team chemistry which led to a 17th Ivy League Championship. The 55 home runs were just the by-product of 13 athletes committed to a common goal.

How will the pitching staff look with 2008 innings leader Kristen Schaus having graduated?

The Tiger pitching staff will look different only in the regard that Kris Schaus will not be in the circle. While we will miss her workhorse attitude and output, we now have three pitchers mentally and physically prepared to share the roles of "starters" and "closers." Michelle Tolfa, Jamie Lettire and Kelsey Quist will be combining for innings and fans can expect a return to a true "pitching staff."

Tolfa, a sophomore, is coming off of an impressive rookie season which earned her honorable mention All-Ivy, and she is eager to get back onto the field after suffering an injury late last season which sidelined her for the final three weeks. She has worked hard on her mechanics and movement in the offseason. We expect her to pick up right where she left off and look for an explosive sophomore spring.

Jamie Lettire, a junior All-America and Ivy Co-Player of the Year at first base, will be splitting

her playing time between first base and the circle, and we anticipate great things from her this season as she has become an even more focused athlete who continues to make adjustments and improvements daily. She has the most experience of our staff, and we look to her to be a leader on the field.

Kelsey Quist, our first-team All-Ivy outfielder, is making her return to the circle in her junior year and is excited to be back on the mound. A recruited pitcher, she moved to right field her freshman year and has now willingly shifted

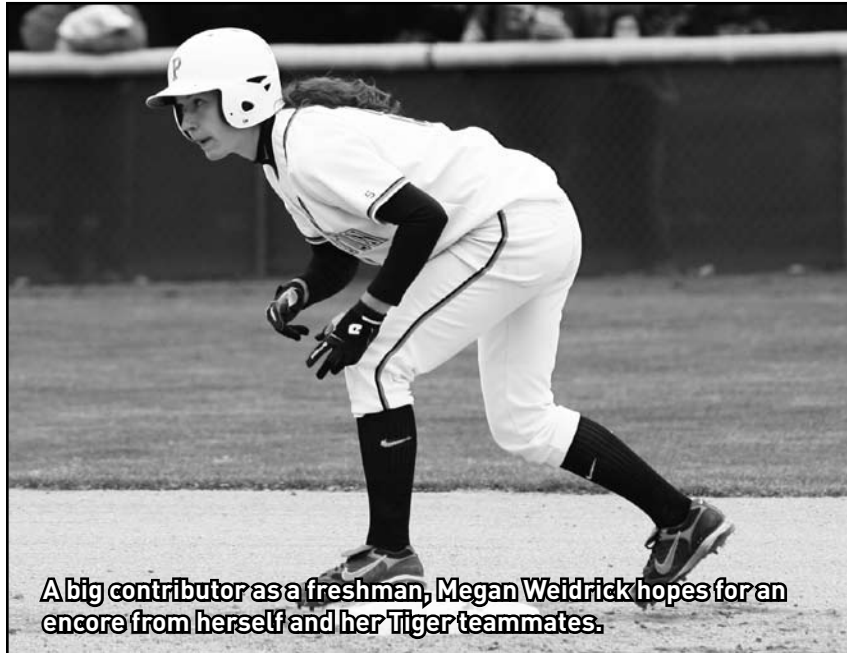
batting lineup at the three, four and five spots. Their talent to consistently create offense as a collective trio is a testament to their character as individuals who elect to work as teammates rather than compete as rivals. I absolutely expect them to continue contributing to our teams success. By doing so, I believe they will continue to achieve recognition as standout players.

Megan Weidrick and Brittney Scott, freshmen a year ago, showed some pop in their bats in their rookie seasons. What do you expect from the sophomore class this season?

The sophomore class is extremely talented and will broadly impact the lineup this season. Brittney Scott is prepared to take on catching duties and become a young leader in the bullpen. Megan Weidrick's quick glove and excellent range in the infield will play a huge role on defense. With a year of experience and training under their belts, we are excited to see them blend the "pop" in their bat with their ability as disciplined hitters to become even more of a threat on offense.

What will freshmen Kelsey VandeBergh and Nicole Ontiveros bring to the team?

Kelsey VandeBergh will be a new face in the infield, adding depth to our defense as another talented glove. Her line-drive hitting ability will make her a major RBI contributor and add another offensive threat in the middle of the batting order. Nicole Ontiveros is our newest outfield addition whose speed and athleticism will be hard to overcome on both defense and offense. Nicole's ability to get on base will create many opportunities for our hitting lineup and her speed will be difficult to keep from scoring. These two young athletes are prepared to take on a key role and contribute to the success we are aiming for this season.

Trina Salcido

**Head Coach • 2nd Season
Oregon '97**

Trina Salcido begins her second season as head coach of the Princeton softball team in 2009 after guiding the Tigers to the NCAA tournament in her first season in 2008.

Named Princeton's head softball coach on June 19, 2007, Salcido was an assistant with the Tigers for three seasons from 2005-2007, two of which resulted in NCAA tournament bids. As the team's hitting coach, Salcido helped guide Princeton to a program-record 55 home runs in her first season as head coach while shattering the previous standard of 38 set in 2005. The record total put Princeton into the top 15 in Division I in home runs per game (1.12) in 2008.

The team also set an Ivy League record with 18 wins in the second season of the league's expanded 20-game schedule. During Salcido's four seasons with the program, Princeton has had an Ivy League record of 54-14 with three league titles and three NCAA tournament bids.

Prior to Princeton, Salcido was the head coach of the El Camino High School (Sacramento, Calif.) varsity softball team from 2002-2004, winning league titles in all three seasons along with one sectional title. In 2003, Salcido was named the *Sacramento Bee's* Coach of the Year and earned an assistant coaching role with the National Pro Fastpitch All-Star Tour team that summer.

From 1999-2001, Salcido was an assistant softball coach at Sacramento City College, serving as the team's hitting instructor and conditioning coach. As a collegian, Salcido was a four-year starter at third base for the University of Oregon from 1993-96, earning honorable mention All-Pac-10 honors as a sophomore and a first-team all-region honor as a freshman. She was named to Oregon's Female All-Decade team on April 2, 1996.

Salcido earned her bachelor's degree in general science from Oregon in 1997 and is a certified fitness trainer. Salcido went on to earn her master's degree in kinesiology from Saint Mary's College (Calif.) in 2007.

Alexis Alcantara

**Assistant Coach • 2nd Season
Hofstra '04**

Alexis Alcantara enters her second season as the top assistant coach and pitching coach at Princeton in 2009.

In 2008, while helping guide the Tigers to an Ivy League title and NCAA tournament berth, Alcantara coached a trio of Princeton pitchers to league honors. Kristen Schaus became the eighth Tiger to win the Ivy League Pitcher of the Year award, while Jamie Lettire was a first-team all-leaguer at first base and rookie Michelle Tolfa earned honorable mention all-league.

An assistant coach on back-to-back Ivy South championship teams, Alcantara came to Princeton from Penn after helping the Quakers to a division title in 2007. Schaus' first-team All-Ivy honor was the second straight for an Alcantara-coached pitcher after Penn's Emily Denstedt earned one of the two first-team pitching spots in 2007.

Prior to Penn, Alcantara spent one year following her 2004 graduation from Hofstra as a graduate assistant in her alma mater's athletic department. In that capacity, she coordinated community outreach events and fundraising efforts.

As a senior in the circle for the Pride, Alcantara helped lead Hofstra to the final game in the last year of the eight-team regionals at the NCAA tournament as a seventh seed. Hofstra appeared in the NCAA tournament in three of her four years.

Alcantara, who earned an English degree at Hofstra, is a native of Levittown, Pa. and is pursuing a master's degree at Penn.



Cristina Cobb-Adams

**Assistant Coach • 2nd Season
Princeton '06**

Cristina Cobb-Adams, a 2006 Princeton graduate and two-time All-Ivy honoree, is in her second season as an assistant coach with the Tigers in

2009.

"It's great to have an alumna of the program working with our current student-athletes," Princeton head coach Trina Salcido says. "Cristina was a tremendous leader and player during her career as a Tiger. Her work ethic and knowledge of the game contributed to her success as a player and are what make her a valuable asset to this program's future."

Cobb-Adams, an outstanding shortstop, earned honorable mention from the Ivy League in 2003 and 2005, helping lead the Tigers to the NCAA tournament in those two seasons as well as her senior campaign of 2006.

While playing in and starting 200 of Princeton's 202 games during her career, Cobb-Adams logged 627 at-bats, the fourth most in program history. Cobb-Adams finished with 161 hits, 32 doubles, five triples and 69 RBIs while compiling a .257 career batting average.

A native of Dublin, Calif., Cobb-Adams earned her Princeton degree as a geoscience major.

Daniel is a lecturer in the English department, and she also teaches at the New School University in New York City. She received her Ph.D. from Princeton in 1999, specializes in Irish literature and High Modernism, and is currently finishing her first novel. Daniel is currently completing a book on cultural and literary representations of redheads. **Kinsey** is an Associate Director in the Office of Capital Giving at Princeton. As a Tiger, Kinsey played on two Women's College World Series teams and was a three-time All-Ivy outfielder. A 1997 Princeton graduate in English, Kinsey lectures in the subject at Princeton today. She went on to receive a Ph.D. in English at Emory University, where she was also an assistant softball coach. **Murray**, in his fourth year at Princeton and third as a softball academic-athletic fellow, is a lecturer in the Princeton Writing Program who teaches a freshman seminar called Theatre of Everyday Life. He received his undergraduate degree from George Mason University and a doctorate in folklore and folklife from Penn.

The Academic-Athletic Fellows Program

The integration of athletics and academics is a challenge at any university or college. In an attempt to strengthen the true student-athlete ideal while continuing to preserve and advance the University's overall educational mission, the Department of Athletics launched the Princeton Academic-Athletic Fellows initiative in 1996.

The coach of each varsity team is required to identify a faculty member or administrator who will serve as its academic-athletic fellow. His or her mission is to strengthen and reinforce the ties between a student's academic and athletic pursuits and act as a resource for the student-athletes, coaches, academic administrators and faculty.

The creation of the academic-athletic fellows initiative was conceived by director of athletics Gary Walters, who recalls how an experience from his days as a Princeton student-athlete impacted him and his teammates.

"I remember the impact that [then sociology professor] Marvin Bressler had on members of the basketball team," Walters says. "My hope was that we could replicate that model for other athletic programs. I believe this makes Princeton unique in the way it facilitates harmony between academic and athletic pursuits."

This academic and athletic link provides athletes with a central point when attempting to identify various University resources, such as advice to resolve specific academic and social issues.

Fellows recognize the value of athletic participation and realize that it is a complement to an undergraduate education. Role models themselves, fellows will help to enhance the relationship between the academic and athletic cultures.

"We are fostering the conceptual idea of the integration of mind, body and spirit," Walters says. "We are providing a non-threatening academic and social support system for athletes that also will strengthen the relationships of coaches and faculty. We want to ensure that our athletes explore the many great opportunities that are available to them during their four years at Princeton."

When Walters was appointed athletic director in 1994, one of the primary charges from the Board of Trustees was to strengthen the ties between athletics and academics. Throughout the years a number of initiatives have been instituted to better promote that relationship. The "fellows" concept is the latest vehicle designed to improve student-athlete welfare and bridge the academic and athletic interests.

Carrie Malone is in her fourth year working at Princeton. In addition to covering softball, Malone is also the athletic trainer for the sprint football and women's hockey teams.

Malone is a native of Sioux Falls, S.D., who attended the University of South Dakota. She earned her NATA certification in 2003 and spent two years prior to Princeton earning a Master's Degree at the Arizona School of Health Sciences in Mesa, Ariz.

While receiving her master's, Malone worked as an Assistant Athletic Trainer at Grand Canyon University in Phoenix and at a local physical therapy clinic. Malone is a member of the National Athletic Trainers Association.

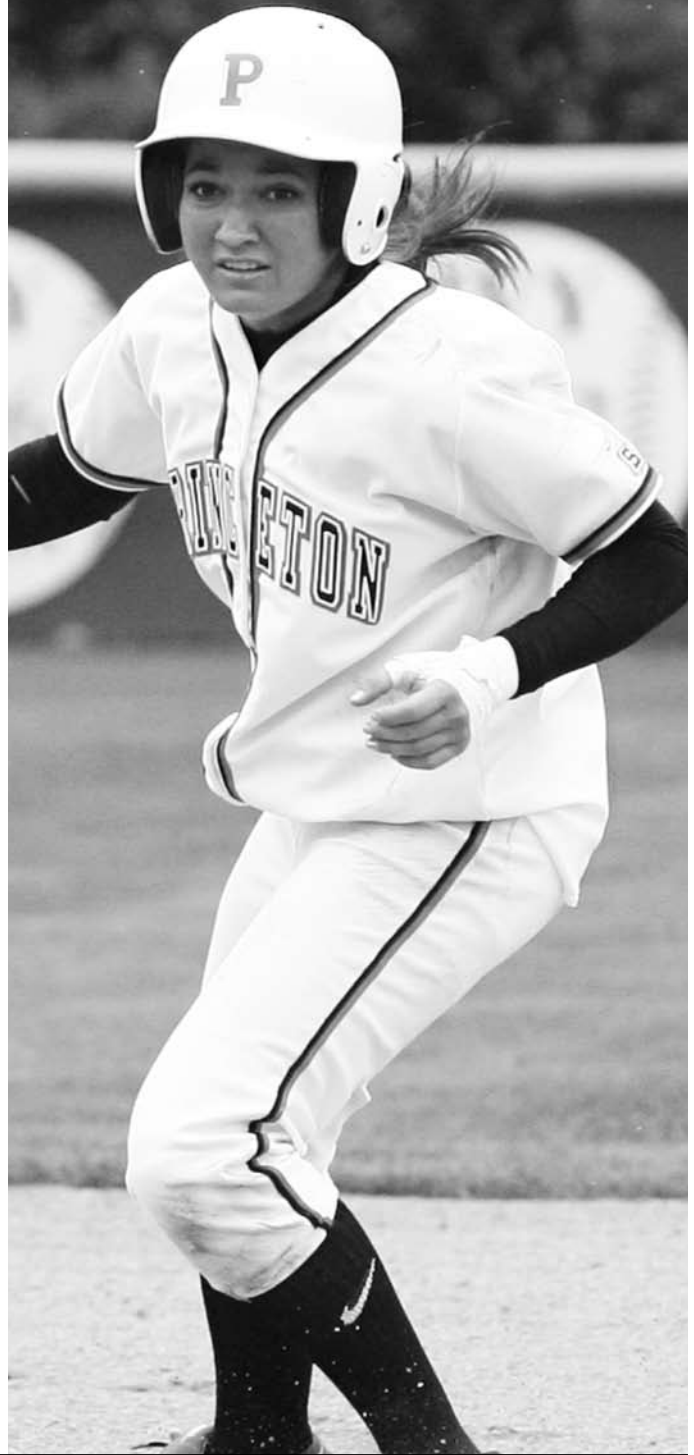

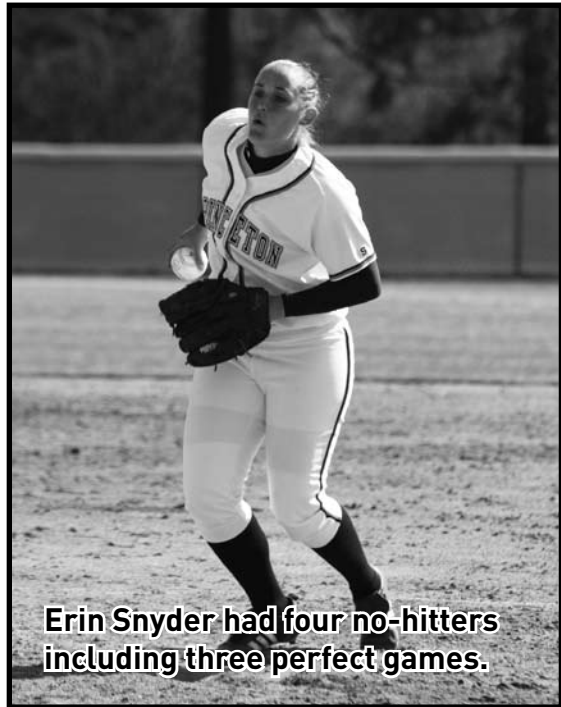

Class of 1895 Field • Home of Princeton Softball

In 2009, the Princeton softball team will play its 25th season at Class of 1895 Field. It is just the second home of Princeton softball since it gained varsity status for the 1982 season.

The field took the place of Broadmead Field, which is located adjacent to Clarke Field, home of the Princeton baseball team. In 23 seasons at 1895 Field, the Princeton softball team has a 297-110-1 record (.729). The first game at the facility was a 14-0 win over Lehigh in 1985.

Bleacher seating is available for several hundred fans down either side past each dugout. The team seating areas are adorned with distinctive orange and black awnings, making Princeton's colors an eye-catching part of the field.

The field is spacious by collegiate softball standards. The field's measurements are 205' down the lines and 208' to straight-away centerfield.



Along the outfield fence are 25 signs commemorating Princeton's 16 Ivy League titles, seven NCAA Tournament appearances and two Women's College World Series appearances. The scoreboard site is just over the wall down the left-field line.

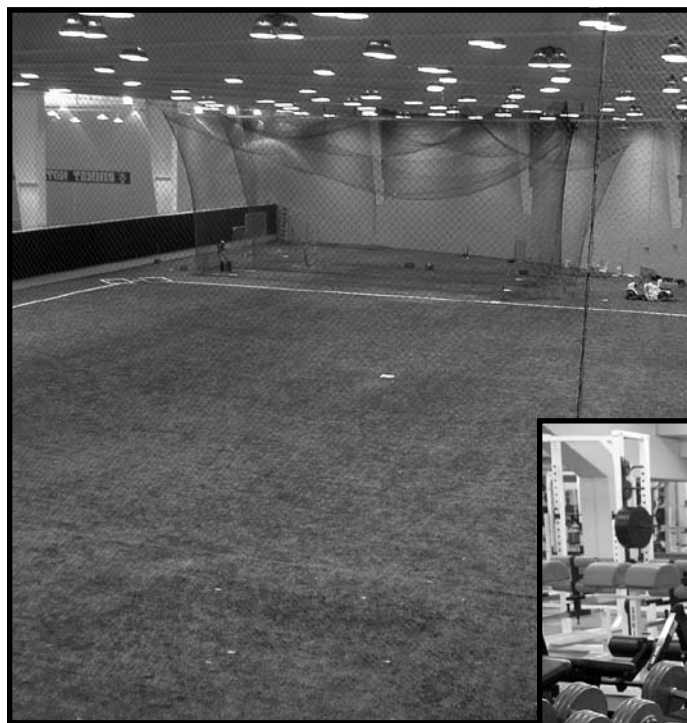
Two outdoor batting lanes and bullpens, one for each team, are beyond the foul fences on either baseline. The view from home plate beyond outfield fence in springtime is of verdant trees, and those standing on the path behind the outfield fence look back at Bloomberg Hall, a recently constructed student-housing facility, and the Poe intramural fields. Roberts Stadium, constructed in 2008 as the home of the Princeton soccer teams, is beyond the third-base line, placing 1895 Field in the heart of both the academic and athletic areas on Princeton's campus.

Jadwin Indoor Facility

The Princeton softball and baseball teams have been using the facility in Jadwin Gym for many years as an indoor training facility, but thanks to a major renovation during the summer of 2004, the teams now have a top-notch indoor training location.

To begin the project, the ground was leveled and state-of-the-art field turf was installed over the whole surface. The turf features a diamond complete with bases, home plate and batters boxes, which allow the team to simulate hitting and fielding situations while indoors.

The pit also contains pitching areas and batting cages to allow players from different positions to work on their skills at the same time.



Weight Room

The Princeton weight room is housed in Princeton Stadium, centrally located near 1895 Field, Jadwin Gym, and the softball locker room in Caldwell Field House. The weight room features the most modern equipment in a pristine setting, designed for maximum efficiency. Among the amenities are free weights, weight machines, dumbbells and aerobic equipment.

Princeton's main campus covers 600 acres, and its more than 135 buildings exemplify a wealth of architectural styles, ranging from colonial buildings to collegiate Gothic dormitories to modern structures by eminent architects.

Coeducational since 1969, (women comprise about 45% of an average freshman class), Princeton enrolls approximately 7,200 students (4,900 undergraduates/2,300 graduate students). Coming from all 50 states and from more than 70 foreign countries, Princeton students are an unusually talented and diverse group that represents many economic, ethnic, social, cultural and religious backgrounds.

Students are apt to choose Princeton for the strength of its academic program, its relatively small size combined with the resources of a major research university and the personal attention its undergraduates enjoy. Men and women who seek a quality education in the liberal arts, architecture, engineering or public and international affairs will discover that Princeton has much to offer.

Princeton offers an abundance of extraordinary resources, including a library system that holds almost five million books and almost 35,000 current journals and periodicals — nearly all on accessible open-stack shelving; an art museum that exhibits works from its own and other outstanding collections, complementing courses in art and archaeology; a natural history museum; a computing center and clusters of microcomputers throughout the campus; and outstanding recreational and athletic facilities.

Living up to its motto "In the Nation's Service and in the Service of All Nations," Princeton University has educated thousands of individuals

who have dedicated their lives to public service, including two U.S. Presidents (Woodrow Wilson and James Madison); hundreds of U.S. and state legislators (the House of Representatives, for example, has housed a Princeton alumnus every year since it first met in 1789); and 44 governors, including 11 New Jersey governors. Each year more than 2,500 members of the student body, faculty and staff volunteer in community service projects throughout

the region. Reflecting this public service spirit, the University as an institution supports many service initiatives.

Beyond the University's historic campus is the town of Princeton, a community of 30,000 people. The Historical Society of Princeton, located in the colonial Bainbridge House, two blocks from the University's main gate, offers information on the town's early years. Princeton conscientiously preserves many of its historically and architecturally important buildings, making the town an unofficial museum of American architecture from colonial times to the present.

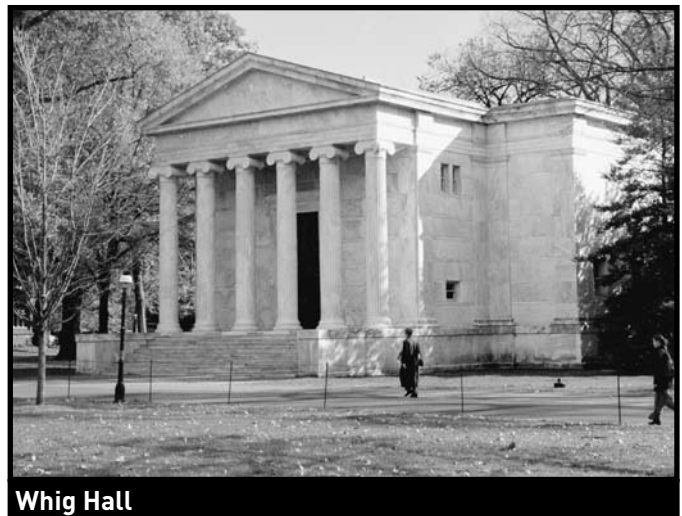
Within this historic setting, institutions and individuals, including many writers, artists, scientists and business executives, create an intellectual and cultural climate of unusual diversity. In addition to the University, Princeton is the home of the Institute for Advanced Study (where Albert Einstein spent the last 22 years of his life), Princeton Theological Seminary, Westminster Choir College of Rider University and Educational Testing Service. Cultural activities approach the variety ordinarily found in large cities; the town supports a resident repertory theater, several orchestras, a ballet troupe, several choral groups and an opera festival.

Although the Princeton community is small and semirural, it is far from isolated. Both New York City and Philadelphia are about 50 miles away and readily accessible by either bus or train.

Princeton also frequently plays host to traveling art shows, dance and musical groups and solo performers by virtue of its convenient location along the Boston/Washington, D.C., corridor.
