## GAME NOTES • WEEK 3

### A FEW FAST FACTS TO GET YOU READY...

#### Opening Night

While Princeton and Columbia have both played two games this season, each is making its Ivy League debut tonight. Princeton has won 10 of its last 13 Ivy openers, although it lost each of its last two.

#### Two Much

Princeton is in the midst of its first two-game losing streak ever to Columbia. The Tigers have been outscored 80-14 in the last two meetings, including a 38-0 loss at Princeton Stadium two seasons ago.

Prior to the 2009 game, Princeton had been in control of the rivalry. The Tigers had won five straight, including three by double digits, and still own a 64-15-1 advantage in the series.

#### Bombs Away

Princeton is off to its first 0-2 start since the 2003 season. In its third game that year, Columbia earned its first win at Princeton with a 49-yard "Hail Mary" touchdown on the final play of regulation.

#### Imperfect Ten

Princeton will be looking to end its longest losing streak ever in football; the streak, which began last season with a 42-14 loss at Columbia, is currently at 10.

#### History Lesson

The longest losing streak in Columbia history was 44 games, and it ended at the expense of Princeton during the 1988 season. Solomon Johnson's 2-yard touchdown run with 5 minutes 13 seconds left provided the margin of victory for the Lions, and Princeton missed a 48-yard field-goal attempt on the last play.

#### Seeing Red

Princeton has had issues in the red zone through the first two weeks of the season. In seven offensive trips inside the opponent's 20, the Tigers have scored one touchdown and kicked three field goals. Defensively, Princeton has allowed eight trips to the red zone and given up six touchdowns.

### A PRINCETON WIN WOULD ...

- end a program-record 10-game losing streak.
- end a two-game losing streak to Columbia, the longest Tiger losing streak in a rivalry that dates back to 1874.
- be Princeton's first home win in eight tries.
- be the first Ivy League victory for head coach and former All-Ivy player Bob Surace.
- give Princeton its first winning record in the Ivy League since Week 1 of the 2008 season.

# Covering Princeton Football

## Very Special

Princeton has had several special teams highlights through the first two games, including:

- Joe Cloud leads the Ivy League with a punting average of 48.6 yards per punt; he was a second-team All-Ivy pick last season after leading the Ivy League in punting average.
- Patrick Jacob leads the Ivy League with 2.0 field goals per game. He is the reigning first-team All-Ivy placekicker and made 14 field goals last season.
- Ivan Charbonneau rans second in the Ivy League with a 32.4-yard average on kickoff returns. He has the league's only touchdown return, which came on a 92-yard score against Lehigh.
- Caraun Reid blocked a field goal attempt in the season opener against Lehigh.

## Captain America

Princeton is led by three senior captains this season. Steven Cody, voted captain of the 2010 team as well, has returned to that position. He is joined by quarterback Tommy Wornham, who is playing his first game since Week 5 of last season, and defensive lineman Mike Catapano.

## Poll Position

Princeton was picked to finish in a tie for seventh with Cornell in the 2011 Ivy League preseason poll; the Tigers have never been picked below sixth in the poll. The last two times Princeton was picked sixth were 2010, when the team finished last in the league, and 2006, when the team finished first.

- **Isaac Serwanga** leads all returning wideouts with three catches for 26 yards in last season's meeting.
- **Andrew Starks**, who was just named to the All-Ivy Honor Roll, led Princeton with 12 tackles in last season's game.
- **Adam Shippey**, who could return to the field this week after a preseason injury, recorded a career-best 10 tackles, in last season's game.

## Welcome Matt

Freshman Matt Costello had a memorable game against Bucknell last weekend, catching five passes for 70 yards, including a long of 20. Each of Costello's catches were for at least 10 yards, and each gave Princeton a first down.

## Fresh New Faces

Matt Costello's performance against Bucknell came one week after fellow freshman Chuck Dibilio rushed for 86 yards on 14 carries and scored on a 26-yard reception in the fourth quarter. His performance earned him Ivy League Rookie of the Week honors.

## Elite Eight

Senior Tommy Wornham became the eighth Princeton quarterback to throw for more than 3,000 yards in his career when he completed a 15-yard pass to Akil Sharp during Princeton's opening possession last weekend.

Wornham currently has 3,141 passing yards in his career; he is 305 yards behind David Splithoff '04 for seventh on the Tiger passing chart.

## Wind-Mills

Sophomore Brian Mills scored his second career touchdown last weekend on a 12-yard reception in the fourth quarter. Both of Princeton's offensive touchdowns this season have come on passes to running backs. Mills is currently the only Princeton player to have a touchdown in both the 2010 and 2011 seasons.

## Go Fourth

While Princeton has shown resilience in its fourth-quarter offensive efforts, the Tigers will need to score more points in the first 45 minutes of games this season. In two games, Princeton has scored 12 points total in the first three quarters and 19 in the fourth quarter.

## Deep-Sixed

Princeton will need to do a better job limiting turnovers following its struggles last weekend against Bucknell. The Tigers committed six turnovers against the Bison, the most since a seven-turnover performance in Week 9 of the 2005 season, a 21-14 loss to Yale.

## Grounded

While Princeton's running backs have scored the team's two offensive touchdowns this season, the Tigers have not rushed for a touchdown since the fourth quarter of Game 6 (Cornell) of the 2010 season.

## Out Of The Gates

Princeton has gotten out to early leads in each of its first two games this season. Senior kicker Patrick Jacob, who leads the Ivy League in field goals and was the 2010 first-team All-Ivy kicker, has converted on field goals on each of Princeton's opening drives this season.

# LAST YEAR: COLUMBIA 42, PRINCETON 14

NEW YORK CITY — A record-tying day for Columbia quarterback Sean Brackett and an opportunistic Lion defense stifled the Princeton football team in the 2010 Ivy League opener for both teams. Columbia scored touchdowns on four straight possessions to break open a close game in a 42-14 victory.

After a Matt Zimmerman 4-yard touchdown run gave the Tigers a 7-0 lead, Columbia scored 35 unanswered points to jump out to a 1-0 start in the Ivy League for the second straight season.

Quarterback Tommy Wornham completed 27 of 43 passes for 252 yards and a touchdown. Senior wideout Trey Peacock had another strong day in his All-Ivy League season, catching 11 passes for 125 yards, while classmate Andrew Kerr caught six passes for 80 yards and a TD.

Sophomore linebacker Andrew Starks led the Princeton defense with 12 tackles, while lineman Adam Shippey added 10 tackles. Dan Fitzsimmons had a sack for the Tigers, who added three pass breakups in the game.

Brackett tied a Columbia record with five touchdown passes in the game, including two in a 20-second span late in the first half. Nick Gerst rushed for 124 yards for the Lions.

Princeton's first drive of the second quarter yielded the opening touchdown, as Zimmerman took a sweep four yards to the right side for a touchdown. The drive took 13 plays over 80 yards and included a pair of short third-down conversions, including a three-yard run by Zimmerman on 3rd-and-2.

A 50-yard kickoff return on the ensuing kickoff set Columbia up for a tying touchdown. Following a 16-yard completion to Andrew Kennedy, Brackett evened the score with a 13-yard touchdown pass to Nico Gutierrez, who found an open spot in a Tiger zone and held off a tackle attempt to fall into the end zone for the score. Columbia would add two touchdowns in the final minute of the first half to hold a 21-7 lead at the half.

The Lions added two more touchdowns before Princeton finally got back on the board with a 31-yard touchdown pass down the left sideline from Wornham to Kerr.

## DEFENSIVE NOTES AND ANECDOTES...

### Sparks By Starks

Junior linebacker Andrew Starks led Princeton with nine tackles last weekend against Bucknell, including 2.5 stops for losses. Starks recorded 12 tackles last season against Columbia, one short of his career best, and finished fourth in the Ivy League with 8.9 tackles per game.

Starks had one of his best games of the season last year at Columbia, recording 12 tackles and six solo stops. His career high is 13, recorded in the 2010 overtime win over Lafayette.

### Stop Them

Princeton has three of the Ivy League's top eight tacklers through two weeks of the season. Junior safety Mandela Sheaffer ranks seventh in the league with nine tackles per game, while junior linebackers Andrew Starks and Tim Kingsbury are both tied for seventh with 8.5 stops per game.

### Reid It And Weep

Junior Caraun Reid has already made at least one impact play in each of his first two games since returning from a season-ending injury last year. He blocked a field goal attempt in Week 1 and recorded Princeton's second sack of the season last weekend; he leads all Tiger linemen with 12 tackles this season.

### The Ship-vey Has Sailed

Defensive lineman Adam Shippey could make his return this weekend after suffering a preseason injury. Shippey had a career effort last season against the Lions, recording 10 tackles.

### What Can Brown Do For You

Cornerback Khamal Brown became the first Princeton freshman to start on the defensive side of the ball this season. He started for the injured Phillip Bhaya last weekend and has recorded six tackles already this season.

### Wrong Turn

The Princeton defense will be looking for improved play in the turnover department tonight. In their first two games, the Tigers haven't forced any turnovers.

Last season, Princeton forced at least one turnover in nine of the 10 games. The only opponent that didn't turn the ball over last season against Princeton was Columbia.

# Bob Surace '90

*The Charles W. Caldwell Jr. '25 Head Coach of Football*

Bob Surace '90, a key member of the 1989 Ivy League champion Princeton football team, is in his second season as the Charles W. Caldwell Jr.



'25 Head Coach of Football at Princeton University.

Now more than a full year into his term as the head coach at Princeton, he is excited at the prospects of getting the Tigers back into the Ivy League elite.

He was hired on Dec. 23, 2009, by Princeton Director of Athletics Gary Walters '67. Surace had been an assistant coach for the Cincinnati Bengals for the prior nine seasons and helped the team to an AFC North title in 2009.

The 22nd head coach at Princeton, Surace was a first-team All-Ivy center when he helped the 1989 Tigers to a 6-1 league mark and a share of the Ivy title. In addition to his tenure with the Bengals, Surace was also the head coach at Division III Western Connecticut State University, where he put together an 18-3 record in 2000 and 2001.

"We are thrilled that Bob Surace is our head coach," Walters said. "He is a product of and a believer in the Princeton concept of education through athletics."

Surace (pronounced "suh-RACE") had served as assistant offensive line coach for the Bengals for the final six years of his time with Cincinnati; prior to that, he served two seasons as an offensive staff assistant. In addition to his work with the line, he played a key role in the entire offensive staff's game preparation. In 2009, that offense helped the Bengals to a 10-6 record and a sweep of their AFC North rivals, including the defending Super Bowl champion Pittsburgh Steelers.

Under Surace's leadership, Western Connecticut advanced to the second round of the NCAA Division III Championship and won the Freedom Football Conference title in 2001; the win in the NCAA playoffs was the first in school history. In 2000, the Colonials won the Northeast Championship ECAC playoff game. In both of Surace's seasons, the team ranked in the top 25 nationally in the American Football Coaches Association poll.

Surace grew up in a coaching family. His father, Tony, was head coach for his high school football and baseball teams in Millville, N.J. He was also a teammate of the current head coach of the Dallas Cowboys, Jason Garrett '89.

Surace began his coaching career in 1990 as running backs coach at Springfield (Mass.) College, where he also earned a master's degree in sports management in 1992.

In 1994, when the Canadian Football League fielded teams in the U.S., Surace was with the Shreveport Pirates as the assistant to head coach and general manager Forrest Gregg, the former Bengals coach who guided Cincinnati to Super Bowl XVI.

His wife, Lisa, was a four-time letterwinner in women's soccer at Princeton and is a member of the Class of 1992. She holds a Ph.D. in psychology and is now the Lower School Head at Princeton Day School.

They have a daughter, Alison, and a son, A.J.

Surace is part of one of the richest traditions in all of college football. Princeton was involved in the first college football game ever played on Nov. 6, 1869, and has played a total of 778 all-time games with an all-time winning percentage of .675 and five former head coaches in the College Football Hall of Fame: William W. Roper, Fritz Crisler, Tad Wieman, Charles W. Caldwell, Jr. and Dick Colman.

# James Perry

*Offensive Coordinator/QBs*

James Perry, the all-time leading passer in Ivy League history, is in his second year as the offensive coordinator at Princeton.

While injuries took a toll on the Princeton offense during his first season, there were early glimpses of what this offense could become. In the first four weeks of the season, prior to a season-ending injury to starting quarterback Tommy Wornham, Princeton had the top-ranked wide receiver in the FCS (Trey Peacock) and the 12th-ranked player in total offense (Wornham).

A former Ivy League Player of the Year and quarterback for the 1999 Brown Ivy League championship squad, Perry came to Princeton after spending three years as a highly successful offensive assistant coach at his alma mater. He coached the quarterbacks and was named the recruiting coordinator at Brown.

In three years with the Brown coaching staff, Perry, a Bushnell Cup winners as an undergraduate, helped the Bears win an Ivy League title while helping develop quarterback Michael Dougherty into one of the top quarterbacks in the Ivy League football history.

As an undergraduate at Brown, Perry led the Bears to the Ivy League championship in 1999, and he holds virtually every school and Ivy League passing record, including passing yards in a season (3,255) and career (9,294), completions in a season (309) and career (789), touchdown passes in a game (6) and career (74), and total offense in a career (9,236). His 442 yards passing remains a single-game record at Princeton Stadium (1998).

Perry and his wife Abby have a son, Sam.



# Jared Backus

*Defensive Coordinator/LBs*

Jared Backus, who has 17 seasons of collegiate coaching experience, is in his second season as the defensive coordinator at Princeton after spending three years at Temple.

Last season, Backus saw three of his defensive players earn All-Ivy recognition. Linebacker Jon Olofsson earned second-team honors, while both lineman Mike Catapano and linebacker Andrew Starks earned honorable mention. Both Olofsson and Starks ended the season among the top four Ivy players in total tackles.

After coaching the defensive line for his first two seasons at Temple, Backus took over the linebacking corps during the fall of 2009. His only season as linebackers coach was one of the most memorable in the history of Temple athletics. The Owls won nine straight games and earned a berth in The EagleBank Bowl, Temple's first since 1979. Temple ranked in the Top 20 nationally in run defense and had a trio of All-MAC linebackers.

In 2008, the Owl defense helped Temple to the team's most wins most since 1990 and a second-place finish in the MAC East. The Owls were led by a pair of All-MAC honorees in DT Terrance Knighton, Temple's first first-team selection, and DT Andre Neblett.

During its inaugural season of MAC play in 2007, the Temple defense also thrived. Temple led the MAC in five defensive statistical categories, including red zone defense; that statistic also ranked first nationally.

Jared and his wife Amanda have three children: Garrett, Grace and Gavin.
