Lehigh 32 Princeton 21 SEPT. 15 • PRINCETON, N.J.

Prior to the 2007 season opener, Princeton head coach Roger Hughes said that his team would need to be fundamentally sound to have a chance against a talented Lehigh squad. He said that turnovers and special teams could both play major roles in the outcome.

Unfortunately, he was right. Five first-half turnovers, a blocked punt for a safety and miserable field position plagued the Tigers in a 32-21 loss to their Patriot League rivals on Powers Field at Princeton Stadium. It was the team's first home loss since the 2005 season.

"Lehigh did a good job, and I'm not taking anything away from them," Hughes said, "but you can't come out and turn the ball over five times in the first half. I told the guys to look around the locker room, because we aren't picking anybody up on the waiver wire. We need to improve, and we're going to work this week to get it done."

The Tigers were outgained by only three total yards, but turnovers did them in. Senior Bill Foran, making his first start at quarterback, completed 7-of-23 passes for 156 yards and two scores, but he also had two interceptions. Junior R.C. Lagomarsino fumbled on the first play from

scrimmage, and two more special teams fumbles kept the Princeton offense off the field.

The Princeton defense, led by a strong 17-tackle effort from senior Tim Boardman, held Lehigh as long as possible, but the field position was too much to overcome. Lehigh's average field position was the Princeton 48-yard-line, and it had more than 39 minutes possession time. Doori Song and Joe Cerreta both had eight tackles apiece, and Cerreta added his first career interception. Scott Britton made four tackles and recovered a fumble, while fellow sophomore Dan Kopolovich added three pass breakups.

After trailing 25-0, Princeton was able to get within 11 points following Foran touchdown passes to Rob Toresco and Adam Berry. Backup quarterback Greg Mroz came in and hit Will Thanheiser on a 21-yard touchdown pass, but that followed a 7:28 scoring drive by Lehigh that ended with a 2-yard run by Jaren Walker.

Lehigh scored three first-half touchdowns on plays all inside the 3-yard-line.

Princeton 20 Lafayette 14 SEPT. 22 • EASTON, N.J.

This one certainly resembled the team Princeton fans envisioned for the 2007 season. The defending Ivy League champions bounced back from an ugly opener to win a physical battle against the No. 22 Lafayette Leopards under the lights at Fisher Stadium. The Tigers, who didn't commit a single turnover and rallied from a pair of deficits, improved to 1-1 with a 20-14 victory over the previously unbeaten Leopards.

"I'm really proud of the team effort we put forth tonight," head coach Roger Hughes said. "I thought we were really physical, and I give a lot of credit to the offensive line. I thought it took control of the game late."

That offensive line assisted a Princeton rushing attack that gained 163 yards against one of the top-ranked defenses in the nation. Rob Toresco led the effort with 66 yards on nine rushes, while both R.C. Lagomarsino and Kenny Gunter had short touchdown runs to highlight strong performances. Senior quarterback Bill Foran was much more consistent in his second start, rushing 17 times for 45 yards while completing 18 of 24

passes for 190 yards. He was especially impressive on third downs and helped the Tigers convert on eight of 18 chances.

"The O-line made me look good tonight," said Gunter, who scored his first collegiate touchdown late in the second quarter. "I'm still learning the position, but those guys made it easy for me. They were blowing up holes tonight."

Meanwhile, the defense was closing holes. Outside of an 89-yard touchdown run in the second quarter, the Tigers held Lafayette to 209 total yards. Tim Boardman and Kevin Kelleher both had six tackles apiece, while Jon Stem had five to go along with a crucial sack. He also deflected a pass that was intercepted by Tom Methvin; the junior lineman added 1.5 tackles for loss to aid

a defensive line that kept the Lafayette offense from gathering any rhythm.

Junior punter Ryan Coyle, on his way to first-team All-Ivy honors in his first season as the starting Princeton punter, earned Ivy League Special Teams Player of the Week honors after averaging 45.3 yards per punt. He booted a career-best 69-yarder in the first quarter.

Columbia 32 Princeton 42

SEPT. 29 • PRINCETON, N.J.

In case anybody forgot, Ivy League wins don't come easily. Princeton recorded 570 yards of total offense, scored six touchdowns and converted on 11 of 15 third downs, but it still needed a fourth-quarter rally to defeat a game Columbia squad 42-32 in the Ivy League opener on Powers Field at Princeton Stadium.

Senior Bill Foran led Princeton in both rushing (84) and passing (236) yards, but it was reserve quarterback Greg Mroz who threw the Tigers' only touchdown pass of the game and led Princeton on a critical pair of scoring drives. Foran and R.C. Lagomarsino both rushed for two touchdowns, while Rob Toresco scored once and picked up 61 yards on the ground. Senior Brendan Circle had his strongest game of the season, catching eight passes for 140 yards, while classmate Jake Staser caught his first touchdown of the season.

The defense gave up nearly 400 yards and four touchdowns, but it also came up with key turnovers when needed. Senior Kevin Kelleher recorded two interceptions, including one to end

a potential go-ahead drive late in the game. Tim Boardman led Princeton with 11 tackles, while both Cart Kelly and Dan Kopolovich had eight apiece. Kelly added two pass breakups, while Blake Williams recorded a fumble recovery after a strip by Tom Methvin.

"I'm proud of the effort we put forth today," head coach Roger Hughes said. "I told [Columbia coach] Norries Wilson that his team showed as much fight as any Columbia team in some time. Maybe we showed a little too much relaxation there in the second quarter, so we need to find ways to play better in all phases at all times. But we made plays when we needed to, and I'm pleased about that."

After Austin Knowlin's second touchdown reception put Columbia ahead in the third quarter, Princeton scored three fourth-quarter touchdowns to claim the win. Lagomarsino used a strong second effort to break a tackle at the 4-yard-line and score the go-ahead touchdown.

Mroz added to the lead with a short play-action touchdown pass to Staser in the back of the end zone. Columbia cut it to a three-point game and had a chance to take the lead, but Kelleher intercepted a deep cross and returned it to the 43-yard-line. Foran returned to lead a scoring drive that he completed with an 8-yard run.

The first Princeton-Hampton showdown was everything that college football should be. In perfect conditions, and with two sides of excited fans, a pair of defending conference champions played the game at an extremely high level.

Unfortunately for the home Tigers, though, that level didn't last the full 60 minutes. Princeton saw a 27-14 halftime lead evaporate in a 34-0 second-half run for No. 21 Hampton, which left Powers Field at Princeton Stadium with a 48-27 win.

"This was a big-time college football atmosphere," a disappointed head coach Roger Hughes said afterwards. "I'm very proud of the way the team played, but we left points on the field because we didn't execute. We need to get that fixed."

Princeton outgained Hampton 484-353 in total offensive yards, but the Tigers had five turnovers, two of which were returned for touchdowns, and failed to score on fourth-and-goal at the 1-yard-line during the decisive second half. Interception returns of 80 and 65 yards surrounded a trio of short touchdown runs for the Pirates, who improved to 4-1 overall. Princeton fell to 2-2 with the loss.

Bill Foran led Princeton with 60 yards rushing and 181 yards passing, and he accounted for three touchdowns (two rushing, one pass-

ing). Three Princeton players had four receptions, including Will Thanheiser, who led the team with 82 yards receiving.

Dan Kopolovich led the Tiger defense with 11 tackles and an interception, while Kevin Kelleher had 10 stops. John Callahan and Tim Boardman, Princeton's leading tacklers, combined for 19 stops, and Callahan added two tackles for loss. Tom Methvin had two sacks and a forced fumble, while Collin McCarthy had 1.5 tackles for loss, a fumble recovery and a special teams surge that led to Princeton's last touchdown.

Two touchdown runs by Foran gave Princeton a 27-14 halftime lead, but an 80-yard interception return by Charles Robinson cut the deficit to 27-21. Three short TD runs, including two from Kevin Beverly, put the Pirates ahead to stay.

Princeton 24 Brown..... 33

OCT. 13 • PROVIDENCE, R.I.

The Princeton football team played with fire for a second straight week, and it left burned once again. Following a six-turnover loss to Hampton the previous week, the Tigers turned the ball over six more times in a 33-24 loss to Brown at Brown Stadium.

"I give credit to Brown and their players today," head coach Roger Hughes said. "I thought they played with more emotion than we played with, more passion than we played with. Obviously it gets down to turnovers as a major reason we've been losing games this year."

Princeton gained 430 total offensive yards, including 309 in the air. Senior quarterback Bill Foran, who also led the team in rushing with 77 yards, threw for a team-best 185 yards and accounted for all three of Princeton's touchdowns. He had scoring strikes of 48 and 39 yards, and he added a 64-yard touchdown run that ignited a near-dramatic Tiger comeback.

Rob Toresco rushed 11 times for 33 yards and caught eight passes for 56 yards, while Berry had five catches for 93 yards, including the 48-yard score. Greg Mroz completed 12

of 24 passes for 124 yards. Despite the yards, Princeton's offense was undone by turnovers, as both Foran and Greg Mroz threw interceptions to go along with four fumbles.

The Princeton defense, which often started in poor field position, allowed 453 total yards to the impressive Brown offense. Bears quarterback Michael Dougherty completed 26 of 46 passes for 360 yards and two touchdowns. Brown had two players with more than 100 receiving yards, Buddy Farnham (8-128) and Paul Raymond (7-116).

Princeton got a team-high seven tackles apiece from John Callahan, Cart Kelly and Wilson Cates. Aaron Carter, starting for the injured Tom Methvin, recorded two tackles for loss and a pass breakup, while Matt Koch had a fumble recovery and an interception. Princeton had seven pass breakups in the game, including three from team leader Dan Kopolovich.

Foran's touchdown run and 39-yard scoring pass to Circle both came in the fourth quarter, but the Tiger offense never got a chance to take the lead.

Princeton 10 Harvard..... 27

OCT. 20 • CAMBRIDGE, MASS.

The top two Princeton quarterbacks spent much of the second half injured. Harvard's starting quarterback spent much of the second half piling on passing yardage during a career day. Chris Pizzotti threw for 365 yards and a pair of touchdowns to lead the Crimson to a 27-10 home win in the 100th meeting between Princeton and Harvard.

Princeton, which didn't score in the second half after rallying from a 10-0 deficit, was outgained 478-222 in the contest. Starting quarterback Bill Foran and backup Greg Mroz both left with injuries during the game, forcing junior Brian Anderson into a tough situation during the second half. It was the first appearance of Anderson's career, but it also gave him some experience prior to his first career start, which came in the season finale at Dartmouth.

Junior R.C. Lagomarsino, who led Princeton in rushing with 40 yards, scored the Tigers' only touchdown of the game on a 29-yard option run in the second quarter. It was his first series since being injured against Hampton.

The defense was led by Joel Karacozoff, who had a career day following injuries to linemen Tom Methvin and Aaron Carter. The sophomore had four tackles, including 1.5 for loss, and

recorded a sack, a fumble recovery, three pass breakups and a quarterback hurry. Senior defensive back Kevin Kelleher recorded eight tackles, including five solo stops, while Doori Song added seven tackles.

Trailing 10-0, a series of misdirections got the Princeton offense on the move late in the first quarter. Following a 10-yard keeper by Foran, the Tigers ran end arounds with both Adam Berry and Will Thanheiser to get into Harvard territory. Consecutive option runs by Rob Toresco moved the ball to the Harvard 31-yard-line. A pass to Berry set up a 34-yard field goal by Connor Loudon.

An inspired Princeton defense allowed only one yard on Harvard's ensuing drive, and a roughing the passer call gave Princeton good field position. Foran moved the ball into Harvard territory by keeping on consecutive options, but suffered an injury on the drive. Greg Mroz came in with a short pass to Toresco and a third-down conversion run. Lagomarsino made his return to the field after suffering a concussion in the Hampton game and took an option from Mroz 29 yards down the left sideline for Princeton's only touchdown of the afternoon.

Unfortunately, the Crimson defense would prove stingy from there. Two years after a dramatic fourth-quarter rally helped Princeton to a 27-24 win, Harvard pitched a second-half shutout to preserve the win.

Sophomore Jordan Culbreath first announced his presence late in a 48-27 loss to Hampton, but it was barely noticed. That would be no such problem on a Friday night in late October, as the sophomore tailback set a rainy Princeton Stadium ablaze during a 34-31 victory over Cornell on ESPNU. Culbreath rushed for a career-high 145 yards and scored two touchdowns, including a 58-yard burst in the fourth quarter that provided the winning margin. That touchdown would be shown as SportsCenter's "Top Play," marking the second straight season a Tiger player has earned that distinction.

Culbreath, the No. 2 tailback following an injury to Kenny Gunter, took advantage of his opportunity. He became Princeton's first 100-yard rusher in 16 games, since Rob Toresco gained 130 yards in a 30-0 win at Dartmouth in the 2005 season finale, and he gained more yards than any Princeton rusher since Jon Veach ran for 205 yards in a 2003 game at Harvard.

Culbreath was the driving force, but he was far from the only Tiger to succeed in the running game. Despite missing rushing leader Bill Foran, Princeton ran for 283 yards and scored four touchdowns on the ground. Starting quarterback Greg Mroz ran the ball eight times for 64 yards and a touchdown, while Rob Toresco added seven rushes for 26 yards. Senior wide receiver Brendan Circle, who became the seventh Princeton player to record at least 100 career receptions, added a 22-yard touchdown run on a fake field goal.

Mroz' passing numbers may not have turned heads, but he led an efficient offense all night. He completed 10 passes, including a touchdown strike to Toresco, and was picked off only after a pass was tipped at the line of scrimmage. Circle caught five of the passes for 62 yards.

Junior Collin McCarthy led the defense with

Fellow linebacker Tim Boardman had 12 tackles, while defensive back Kevin Kelleher recorded seven. McCarthy, Doori Song and Pete Buchignani each recorded a sack, while Dan Kopolovich recorded a team-high two pass breakups.

Following a scoreless first quarter in which Princeton never moved past midfield, the Tigers nearly scored first on Greg Mroz' only drive at quarterback. Yale 27 Princeton 6

Nov. 10 • PRINCETON, N.J.

Princeton turned the ball over four times, including twice at the Yale 2-yard-line, and gave up an 80-yard touchdown pass in a 27-6 loss to the unbeaten Bulldogs on Powers Field at Princeton Stadium. Princeton outgained Yale 361-272, but its inability to convert in the red zone thwarted the upset attempt.

Princeton spread the ball around well, using seven different runners and receivers to attack the perimeter against a solid Yale defense. Senior quarterback Bill Foran led the team in rushing with 72 yards on 15 carries, while senior running back Rob Toresco added 52 yards on 10 carries. Will Thanheiser had five catches for 60 yards, while Adam Berry added five catches for 38 yards.

The Princeton defense did a good job containing national rushing leader Mike McLeod until the fourth quarter, when both McLeod and the Yale offensive line took over. Senior Kevin Kelleher recorded a career high 13 tackles, while classmate Tim Boardman recorded nine. McLeod, who had only 36 yards rushing in the first half, ended the game with 107 yards and a touchdown. Yale quarterback Matt Polhemus completed only five

passes, but he made them count. He hooked up with Chris Denny-Brown for a pair of scores, including an 80-yarder less than a minute into the second half.

Princeton opened the game with a 13-play, 61-yard drive that took the ball to the Yale 2-yard-line. An attempted end around to Berry resulted in a fumbled handoff, and Joe Hathaway pounced on it to end Princeton's first good scoring opportunity. The second one came two drives later, when Princeton again moved to the 2-yard-line. Foran tried to score on a keeper, but Nick Solakian drilled him from the side and jarred the ball loose. Paul Rice caught it in midair and returned it 55 yards before Adam Berry ran him down from behind to save a touchdown. Yale kicker Alan Kimball hit a 43-yard field goal six plays later to give the Bulldogs an improbable lead.

Princeton tied it up with three seconds left in the half, as Connor Loudon hit a 20-yard field goal to complete an 11-play, 51-yard drive. Denny-Brown's 80-yard score early in the third quarter gave Yale the lead for good.

The Princeton Tigers played their season finale with two goals in mind: sending their seniors out on the right note and sending everybody else into the offseason with positive momentum. They did both on the final play, as Connor Loudon connected on a 25-yard field goal in overtime to give Princeton a 17-14 win at Dartmouth.

"I'm really proud of my football team right now," head coach Roger Hughes said. "We hung around and found a way to make a winning play. I thought we lost a bit of that, especially after the Hampton game, but we got the job done today."

Princeton was one play away from winning the game in regulation, but Dartmouth quarterback Tom Bennewitz hit Phil Galligan on a six-yard slant with no time remaining to even the score at 14. It completed a 14-play, 85-yard drive by the Big Green, who seemed in total control of momentum heading into overtime.

That wouldn't last long, though. Princeton won the toss and elected to play defense first. On the second play, Nate Servis ran up the middle and was swarmed by an angry Tiger defense. Sophomore Jon Callahan stripped the ball and senior co-captain Jon Stem secured it amidst of full pile of players. It would turn out to be the final play of his career, and he made it count.
