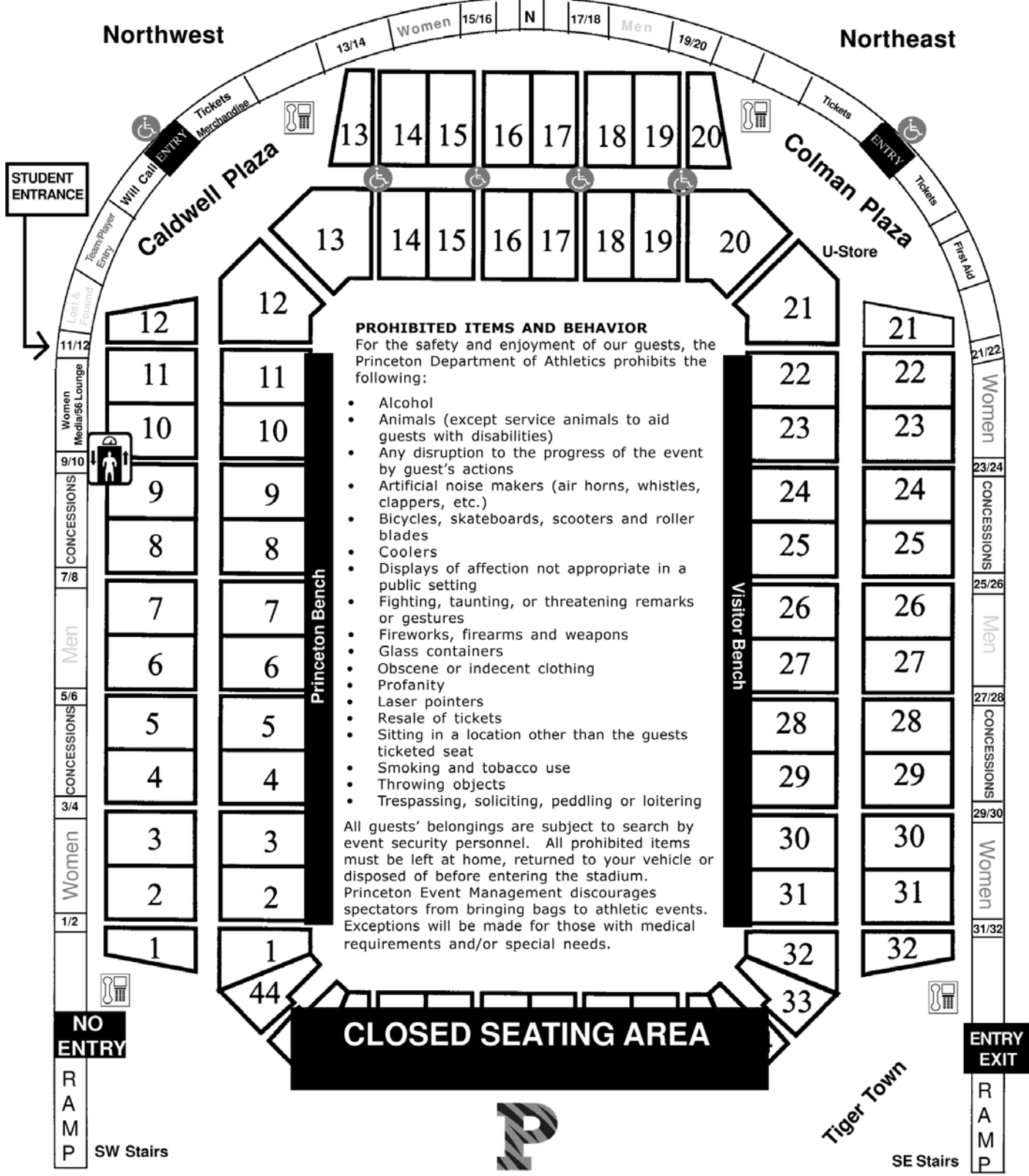


**Powers Field at Princeton Stadium**



**PROHIBITED ITEMS AND BEHAVIOR**  
 For the safety and enjoyment of our guests, the Princeton Department of Athletics prohibits the following:

- Alcohol
- Animals (except service animals to aid guests with disabilities)
- Any disruption to the progress of the event by guest's actions
- Artificial noise makers (air horns, whistles, clappers, etc.)
- Bicycles, skateboards, scooters and roller blades
- Coolers
- Displays of affection not appropriate in a public setting
- Fighting, taunting, or threatening remarks or gestures
- Fireworks, firearms and weapons
- Glass containers
- Obscene or indecent clothing
- Profanity
- Laser pointers
- Resale of tickets
- Sitting in a location other than the guests ticketed seat
- Smoking and tobacco use
- Throwing objects
- Trespassing, soliciting, peddling or loitering

All guests' belongings are subject to search by event security personnel. All prohibited items must be left at home, returned to your vehicle or disposed of before entering the stadium. Princeton Event Management discourages spectators from bringing bags to athletic events. Exceptions will be made for those with medical requirements and/or special needs.

### **ALCOHOL POLICY**

Possession and/or consumption of alcoholic beverages within Princeton Stadium are strictly prohibited. Any guests found in violation will be removed from the facility.

### **AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT (ADA)**

The stadium has permanent ADA spaces located around the cross-aisle (between upper and lower levels). Access to these spaces is at the north end of the stadium located at entrances for sections 13-14, 15-16, 17-18 & 19-20. Each space has an accompanying companion seat. Individuals requesting special accommodations should call 609-258-3538.

### **ANIMALS**

Animals are not permitted in Princeton Stadium with the exception of service animals or those training for guests with disabilities. All other animals are prohibited.

### **BAG SEARCH**

All bags are subject to search upon entry and within Princeton Stadium. This policy is in effect for everyone who attends Princeton athletic events.

### **BANNERS & SIGNS**

Signs must be handheld, event related and in good taste. Signs on poles or sticks are not permitted. Signs may not obstruct another guest's view. Management reserves the right to confiscate signs that are in violation of stadium policies.

### **CODE OF CONDUCT**

We ask all fans to "ACT WITH CLASS" in attending Princeton athletic events. Cheer for your team and be courteous and respectful of those around you. Abusive language and behavior directed towards officials, student-athletes or coaches will not be tolerated and are grounds for removal.

### **EMERGENCIES**

In case of an emergency, call Public Safety by dialing 911 or pressing the emergency button on a campus blue-light phone. Blue-light phones are located in the plaza areas in the four corners of the stadium. In the event of a serious emergency, pertinent information will be provided in regards to the emergency and evacuation procedures over the public address system. For non emergency, call Public Safety by dialing 8-3134.

### **ENTRANCES**

There are four (4) spectator entry points into Princeton Stadium. Entry gates are located in the following areas:

1. Northeast corner of stadium (Guests with disabilities);
2. Northwest corner of stadium (Guests with disabilities, Player/Team Ticket/Will Call entry points);
3. Southeast corner of stadium;
4. West side of stadium (Gates 11-12, Student entry gate).

### **FIRST AID**

Emergency medical care for spectators is located at the first aid station at the Northeast plaza level (Section 21). For assistance with an emergency situation, please contact the nearest Public Safety officer or event staff personnel.

### **LOST AND FOUND**

A lost-and-found service is maintained in the Northwest ticket office booth.

### **LOST CHILDREN AND GUESTS**

Lost children and guests should be taken or directed to an event staff member for assistance. The event staff will escort the lost person to the Northwest ticket booth.

### **MERCHANDISE**

Princeton merchandise and souvenir stands are located at the Northwest plaza area of the stadium.

### **PLAYING FIELD RULES**

*Princeton University and NCAA regulations prohibit spectators from being on the field or sidelines during and immediately following the game. Please utilize regular exits for departure from the stadium.*

### **PROGRAMS**

Programs are free and located at each of the four entry points leading into Princeton Stadium.

### **RE-ENTRY**

During ticketed events, guests will be allowed to re-enter upon receiving a stamp when exiting the stadium area. Spectators should re-enter at the main gate to show their stamped hand and ticket stub. Princeton Event Management reserves the right to prohibit re-entry to spectators at all athletic venues.

### **TELEPHONES**

Coin-operated telephones are located at the Northeast and Northwest main entrances. Campus blue light phones are located in all four plaza areas inside Princeton Stadium.

**All guests' belongings are subject to search by event security personnel. All prohibited items must be left at home, returned to your vehicle or disposed of before entering the stadium.**
