#### Eye on the Tigers

Princeton is 1-0 on the season after opening the 2010-11 campaign with a 41-point victory, 78-37, over Fairleigh Dickinson on Saturday, Nov. 13. All 13 members of the squad played in the game with all but one scoring a basket. Leading the Tigers offensively was junior Devona Allgood with 20 points, just one point shy of matching her career best. She added seven rebounds, three blocks, three steals and one assist. Sophomore Niveen Rasheed added 14 points and led the team in rebounds with eight and assists with four. Senior Addie Micir was also in double digits with 12 points, hitting four three pointers. The Tigers shot 42.6 percent from the floor, 88.2 percent from the line and 27.8 percent from long range. Princeton had a +5.0 rebounding margin and a +12.0 turnover margin in the game as Princeton scored 36 points off of turnovers. Also of note, the Tigers scored 28 points in the paint and 19 on second-chance opportunities.

#### The Princeton/Rutgers Series

Rutgers holds a 14-3 edge over Princeton in the all-time series, which includes two games when Rutgers was known as Douglass in the 1970s. The Scarlet Knights have won the last 11 games in the series including a 60-50 win last year.

#### Scouting the Scarlet Knights

Rutgers is 0-2 on the season after dropping a 66-57 game at California and a 63-50 game at Stanford last weekend. Erica Wheeler and April Sykes lead the team in scoring, averaging 16 and 10 points per game respectively. Chelsey Lee has a team-best 19 rebounds with Monique Oliver contributing 12. Khadijah Rushdan has dished out a team-high 11 assists and four steals, while Oliver is the team leader in blocks with seven. The Scarlet Knights are averaging 53.5 points per game and have a -11.0 scoring margin. They also run a deficit in rebounding at -12.5. Rutgers is shooting .387 from the floor, .294 from the three-point line and .455 from the free-throw line. The squad was predicted to finish seventh in the BIG EAST preseason poll after finishing last season with a 19-15 mark and advancing to the NCAA Tournament for the eighth consecutive season.

#### Last Time We Met (Dec. 5, 2009)

Princeton grabbed a 13-2 lead in its game with Rutgers, had three players in double digits and was down by just one at halftime, but couldn't pull off the win as Rutgers posted a 60-50 victory at Jadwin Gym.

Freshman Niveen Rasheed paced the Tigers with a 19-point effort, scoring 11 of her 19 points from the free-throw line. In addition, she had seven rebounds, two assists and team-best four steals. Sophomore Devona Allgood was one rebound shy of a double-double, scoring 14 points and collecting nine rebounds. Junior Addie Micir was also in double digits, with 10 points. The team outrebounded Rutgers 41-30 and had 20 offensive boards.

Princeton started the game grabbing an 11-point lead as the Tigers went on a 13-2 run in the first five minutes. Rutgers scored the next six points to make it a five-point game, 13-8, at 13:59.

A 9-3 Princeton run gave the Tigers a 22-12 lead with 8:29 left in the first half.

The teams exchanged layups in the next minute before Rutgers went on a 14-0 run that gave the Scarlet Knights their first lead of the game, 28-24, with 3:50 to play.

Rutgers then shot 0 for 5 and Princeton was 0 for 3 during the next three minutes. Rasheed finally got one to drop with 24 seconds remaining and followed up with a free throw as the teams went into the locker room with Rutgers up by just one, 28-27.

Rutgers started the second half on a 7-1 run to take a nine-point lead with 16:40 left to play. The Tigers responded with the game's next six points to come within three, 37-34, with 14:01 remaining.

Rutgers held Princeton scoreless for the next three minutes to grab a 10-point lead at 11:37 making it 44-34. The Tigers flipped the script and held Rutgers scoreless while scoring seven to again make it a three-point game, 44-41 with less than eight minutes to play.

A pair of free throws by Rasheed would be the only points the Tigers would pick up in the next 5:22

as Rutgers stretched its lead back up to 10 with 3:28 remaining.

The teams would each score seven points during the remainder of the game, Rutgers scoring all seven from the charity stripe and Princeton getting four points from Allgood and three from Rasheed to end the game in favor of the Scarlet Knights, 60-50.

Brittany Ray had a 20-point night for the Scarlet Knights, scoring nine of her points from the free-throw line. She also had a game-high six steals. Rashidat Junaid added 12 points and she and Chelsey Lee each had seven rebounds. Rutgers shot 40.8 percent as a team and was 81.8 from the free-throw line.

### It's All Good

Junior Devona Allgood was named the Ivy League Player of the Week on Monday, Nov. 15. Allgood shares the honor with Harvard's Brogan Berry. Allgood led Princeton in scoring as the Tigers opened the season with a 78-37 win over Fairleigh Dickinson on Saturday, Nov. 13. The junior center scored 20 points, just one point shy of her career best. In addition she added seven rebounds, three blocks, three steals and one assist coming in 24 minutes of play.

### We Are The Champions

Princeton won the Ivy League in 2009-10, the program's eighth title. The team won five times in the 1970 and 80s prior to the NCAA Tournament. The Tigers earned a share of the title in 1999 and 2006 but lost the playoff game both years to Dartmouth. It marks the first time Princeton won the title outright since 1978.

### Can They Go All The Way?

Princeton went undefeated in the Ivy League last season becoming one of six teams to go undefeated in Ivy League play. Harvard did so in 2002-03 and 96-97 and Penn was undefeated in 2000-01. Dartmouth went 7-0 in 1980-81, Yale went 7-0 in 1979-80. Princeton is in the middle of a 19-game winning streak in the Ivy League that dates back to Feb. 27, 2009.

### Going Dancing

Princeton made its first ever NCAA Tournament appearance in 2010. The team became a varsity sport in 1972 with the NCAA Tournament beginning a decade later in 1982. The Tigers fell to St. John's in the Tallahassee first round 65-47.

Graham Hayes had this to say about tonight's matchup. "With apologies to Monmouth, Seton Hall, NJIT and the rest, Garden State bragging rights are on the line when Princeton visits Rutgers. Princeton committed 28 turnovers in a 60-50 loss at home last season, so Tigers guards Lauren Polansky and Addie Micir are on the hot seat."

## Preseason Prediction

Princeton was selected to win the Ivy League again this season in the 2010 Ivy League Preseason Media/SID Poll. The Tigers were nearly the unanimous first-place selection with 135 points and 16 first-place votes. Harvard received one first-place vote and 115 points as the runner-up. Dartmouth was picked third with 96 points, followed by Yale with 84, Columbia with 73, Brown with 50, Cornell with 39 and Penn with 19.

## Open Sesame

All-time Princeton is 19-21 in season openers including this season's 78-37 win over FDU. The Tigers have won the last three season openers, and is 6-4 in the last 10 years.

## November Numbers

Princeton is off to a 1-0 start during the month of November with four more games to play. Last season, Princeton set a program record for the most wins during the month of November, going 4-1.

## Honey I'm Home

Princeton is in the middle of a 10-game home winning streak, dating back to Dec. 12, 2009. The Tigers set a record for wins at home last season going 12-1 on its home court. Princeton's last loss at home was its only loss at home last year, a 60-50 game to Rutgers.

## O Captain! My Captain!

The team has selected its two seniors to be team captains this season. Krystal Hill and Addie Micir were announced as captains at the end-of-year banquet in the spring of 2010.

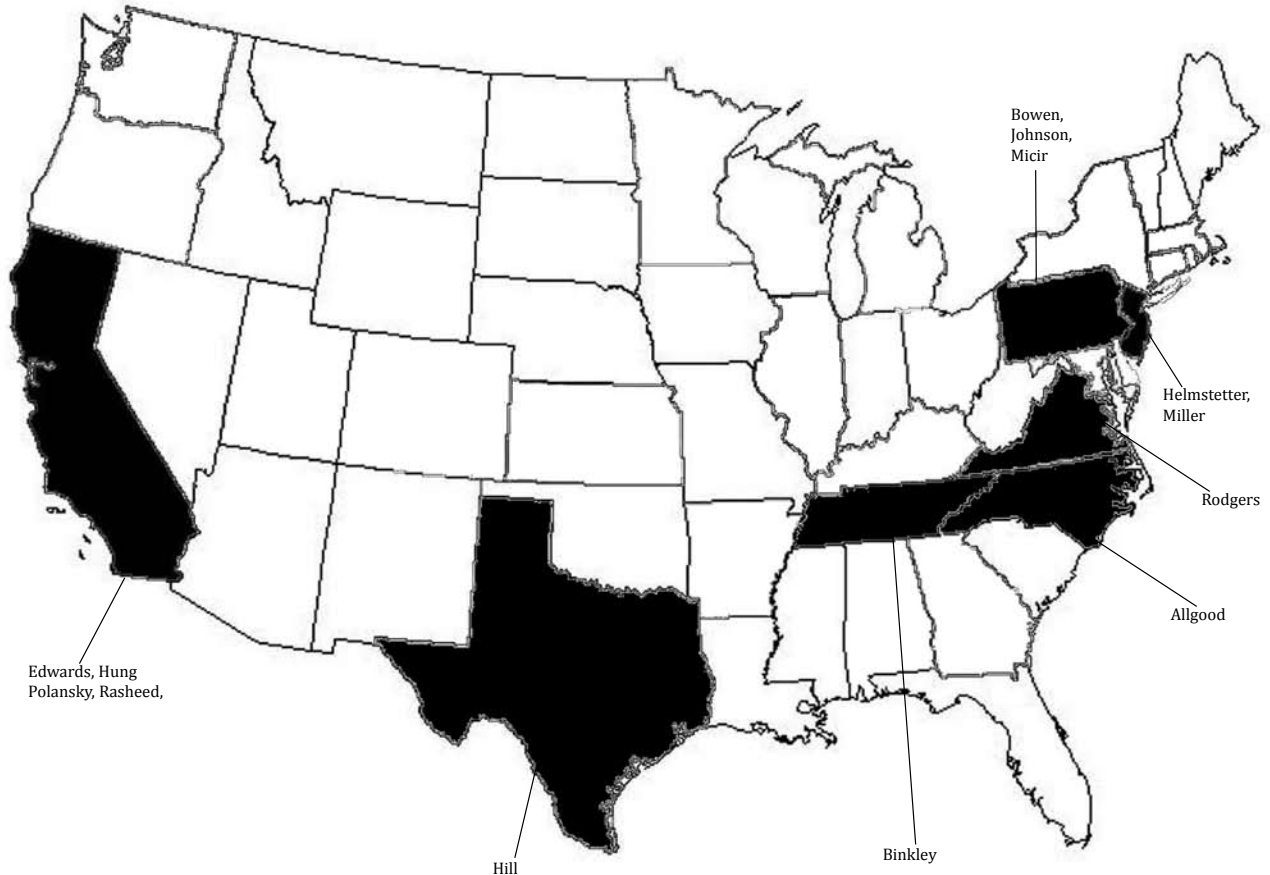

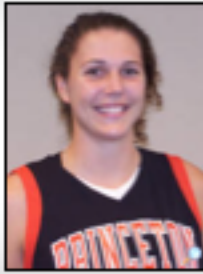

**FDU 37 AT PRINCETON 78**

PRINCETON, N.J. (11/13/10) - It was a banner night at Jadwin Gym for the Princeton women's basketball team as the Tigers defeated Fairleigh Dickinson 78-37 in the 2010-11 season opener.

Prior to the game the team unveiled its first NCAA Tournament banner after going 26-3 in 2009-10 and earning the Ivy League's automatic bid with a perfect 14-0 mark.

Princeton played all 13 members of the team with 12 players scoring. Three players were in double digits led by junior Devona Allgood's 20 points. She added seven rebounds, three blocks, three steals and one assist coming in 24 minutes of play. Sophomore Niveen Rasheed added 14 points, eight rebounds, four assists and one steal. Senior Addie Micir scored 12 points, hitting four three pointers and chipping in three assists, two steals and a rebound. Princeton shot 42.6 percent from the floor and missed just two of its 17 free throws.

Esther Wallace led the Knights with 13 points, while adding five rebounds and two blocks. Jasmrya Saunder had a team-best six rebounds and four steals while scoring five points. Mariyah Laury chipped in six points. As a team FDU shot 26 percent from the floor and 58.8 percent from the line.

The Tigers grabbed a 10-point lead, 19-9, at 12:48. During that time Allgood scored eight of those 19 points with Micir draining two of her four three pointers. Princeton continued to find the net scoring the next six points to make it 25-9 with a little more than nine minutes to play in the half.

The Knights were able to make it an 11-point game on three occasions including at the 1:55 mark of the first. However the Tigers would close out the first half on a 9-0 run to head into the locker room with a 39-20 lead.

Princeton's run wasn't over yet as the Tigers came out in the second and scored 17 straight points to go up 56-20 at 15:12.

A three-point basket by Alannah Driscoll-Sbar ended the drought for FDU at 12:58.

The Knights would only get within 30 points during the remainder of the game with came around the 10-minute mark. Back up by 36 points with 1:41 to play Princeton finished scoring the last seven points to wrap up the game 78-37.

Princeton will be on the road for the next five games first stopping off at Rutgers on Thursday, Nov. 18 for 7:30 p.m.
