Eye on the Tigers

Princeton is 1-1 on the season after opening the 2010 campaign with a 41-point victory over Fairleigh Dickinson on Nov. 13. The Tigers lost a heart breaker at Rutgers on Thursday, Nov. 18. Up by one, 53-52, Rutgers turned the ball over with 43 seconds to play and sophomore Niveen Rasheed hit the rim on her jumper. A fight for the ball ensued and the Scarlet Knights were given possession. Following a timeout Khadijah Rushdan hit the basket with 4.4 seconds left. Princeton threw a hail Mary as the buzzer sounded in defeat. The Tigers had a rough foul shooting game hitting 45.5 percent of their shots, but the team finished just one rebound back from Rutgers, and had seven steals and forced Rutgers into 16 turnovers, four more than Princeton had itself.

Sophomore Niveen Rasheed and junior Devona Allgood both average 14 points and 7.5 rebounds per game. Rasheed adds five assists and four steals while Allgood had three blocks and steals apiece. Senior Addie Micir is scoring 11.5 points per game with seven three-point field goals and has four assists, two blocks and two steals. Junior Lauren Edwards contributes 9.5 points and 4.5 rebounds per game while adding five assists, four steals and three blocks. The Tigers are shooting 41.1 percent from the floor, 71.4 percent from the foul line and 25.7 percent from behind the arc. Princeton is averaging 65.5 points per game, a +20 margin over its opponents.

The Princeton/Lehigh Series

Princeton owns a 14-9 advantage in the all-time series with Lehigh, which began in 1983. The Tigers won last year's meeting 86-68 at Jadwin Gym. The last time Princeton was at Stabler Arena on Nov. 30, 2008, the Mountain Hawks took a 20-point game, 63-43.

Scouting the Mountain Hawks

Lehigh is 1-1 on the season after opening with a 70-65 loss at Duquesne before rebounding with a 72-64 win over Robert Morris exactly one week ago. Today's game will be Lehigh's home opener, which is significant for the Mountain Hawks. The team has not lost a home game in two seasons, a 33-game home winning streak, the third longest current streak in DI behind UConn and Stanford. The 2009 and 2010 Patriot League champion was picked to finish second to American in a close preseason poll with just two points separating the teams. Lehigh returns three of its starters from last season in Emily Gratch, aelxa Williams and leading scorer Erica Prosser. Prosser is leading the squad again this season, scoring 17.5 points per game and is clutch from the free-throw line shooting 76.9 percent. She also leads the team in assists with 10 and had a homecoming last week in Pittsburgh playing at Duquesne and RMU. Courtney Dentler averages 14.0 points per game and is the team leader under the basket with 7.0 rebounds per game, with all but one rebound coming on the defensive end. Kelly Peterson adds 7.5 points per game and Gratch chips in 7.0 points per game and is second on the team in rebounds with 5.5 per game. Gratch has a team-high five steals and has dished out four assists. The Mountain Hawkes are shooting 38.8 percent from the floor, 40 percent from long range and 65.9 percent from the line. Lehigh averages 68.5 points per game and hold teams to 67.0 points per game.

Last Time We Met (Dec. 2, 2009)

Four players reached double figures as Princeton knocked off defending Patriot League champion Lehigh, 86-68 on Wednesday, Dec. 2 at Jadwin Gym.

Sophomore Lauren Edwards and freshman Niveen Rasheed scored 21 points apiece. It marked a career-high for Rasheed, who also grabbed a team-best eight rebounds. Also picking up a career-best was sophomore Laura Johnson who knocked down 17 points, shooting 5 for 9 from long range. Princeton also got 11 points from junior Addie Micir. Sophomore Devona Allgood matched Rasheed in rebounds with eight and Edwards picked up seven.

It was a tale of two halves for the Tigers, who shot 52.6 percent in the first half compared to 29.4 percent in the second half. Princeton had a 58-27 lead at halftime, but Lehigh returned the favor with a 41-28 advantage in the second half.

The teams traded baskets to start the game but a layup by Edwards sparked a 10-0 run that gave Princeton a 15-4 lead at 14:13. The Tigers continued to hit their shots, scoring 16 points while holding Lehigh to just three baskets in a span of 5:20. That enabled Princeton to take a 20-point lead, 31-11, at 8:01. During that time Princeton got four points from junior Krystal Hill, while Johnson drained two three pointers and Micir and Kate Miller each added a long ball.

Princeton went on a 12-4 run in the next 3:44 to go up 43-15 with 4:17 to play in the first half. The teams traded baskets before a three by Micir, who followed up with two free throws gave the Tigers their largest lead of the game, a 32-point cushion at 54-22, with under a minute to play. The teams traded baskets and a three by Lehigh's leading scorer Erica Prosser with 10 seconds left made it a 29-point game. Rasheed put away a layup with three seconds to play to give Princeton a 58-27 lead at halftime.

In the first 10 minutes of second half, Princeton was held to just four baskets from the floor while the Mountain Hawks rattled off 16 points to get within 24 points, 71-47. The teams traded baskets during the next four minutes. Allgood had a three-point play to make it 83-56, before Lehigh scored four points from the free-throw line. Rasheed followed up with three points to make it 86-60 with less than three minutes to play but Lehigh closed out the game with two three balls and an additional two free throws, to end the game at 86-68. Lehigh's 18-point deficit was the closest the Mountain Hawks had gotten since 8:30 of the first half.

Princeton shot 42.3 percent from long range, going 9 for 16 in the first half for 56.3 percent compared to 2 for 10 in the second. The Tigers did fair better from the charity stripe in the second half, shooting 85.7 percent (6-7) compared to 9 for 13 in the first. The squad finished the game with 48 rebounds, 19 assists, seven steals and five blocks.

Alex Ross paced the Mountain Hawks offensively with 18 points, while Prosser added 14 and had six boards. Hun School product Emily Gratch scored 13 points and led the team under the basket with seven boards before fouling out. Courtney Dentler added 10 points. Lehigh shot 39.3 percent from the floor, 31.6 percent from long range and 64.3 percent from the free-throw line.

It's All Good

Junior Devona Allgood was named the Ivy League Player of the Week on Monday, Nov. 15. Allgood shares the honor with Harvard's Brogan Berry. Allgood led Princeton in scoring as the Tigers opened the season with a 78-37 win over Fairleigh Dickinson on Saturday, Nov. 13. The junior center scored 20 points, just one point shy of her career best. In addition she added seven rebounds, three blocks, three steals and one assist coming in 24 minutes of play.

We Are The Champions

Princeton won the Ivy League in 2009-10, the program's eighth title. The team won five times in the 1970 and 80s prior to the NCAA Tournament. The Tigers earned a share of the title in 1999 and 2006 but lost the playoff game both years to Dartmouth. It marks the first time Princeton won the title outright since 1978.

Can They Go All The Way?

Princeton went undefeated in the Ivy League last season becoming one of six teams to go undefeated in Ivy League play. Harvard did so in 2002-03 and 96-97 and Penn was undefeated in 2000-01. Dartmouth went 7-0 in 1980-81, Yale went 7-0 in 1979-80. Princeton is in the middle of a 19-game winning streak in the Ivy League that dates back to Feb. 27, 2009.

Going Dancing

Princeton made its first ever NCAA Tournament appearance in 2010. The team became a varsity sport in 1972 with the NCAA Tournament beginning a decade later in 1982. The Tigers fell to St. John's in the Tallahassee first round 65-47.

Preseason Prediction

Princeton was selected to win the Ivy League again this season in the 2010 Ivy League Preseason Media/SID Poll. The Tigers were nearly the unanimous first-place selection with 135 points and 16 first-place votes. Harvard received one first-place vote and 115 points as the runner-up. Dartmouth was picked third with 96 points, followed by Yale with 84, Columbia with 73, Brown with 50, Cornell with 39 and Penn with 19.

Open Sesame

All-time Princeton is 19-21 in season openers including this season's 78-37 win over FDU. The Tigers have won the last three season openers, and is 6-4 in the last 10 years.

November Numbers

Princeton is off to a 1-1 start during the month of November with three more games to play. Last season, Princeton set a program record for the most wins during the month of November, going 4-1.

Honey I'm Home

Princeton is in the middle of a 10-game home winning streak, dating back to Dec. 12, 2009. The Tigers set a record for wins at home last season going 12-1 on its home court. Princeton's last loss at home was its only loss at home last year, a 60-50 game to Rutgers.

On the Road Again

Princeton went 14-1 on the road last season, with its lone loss at UCLA. The Tigers have played just one road game this season, on Thursday, losing at the buzzer to Rutgers 54-53. Including today's game, Princeton will play its next four games away from Jadwin Gym.

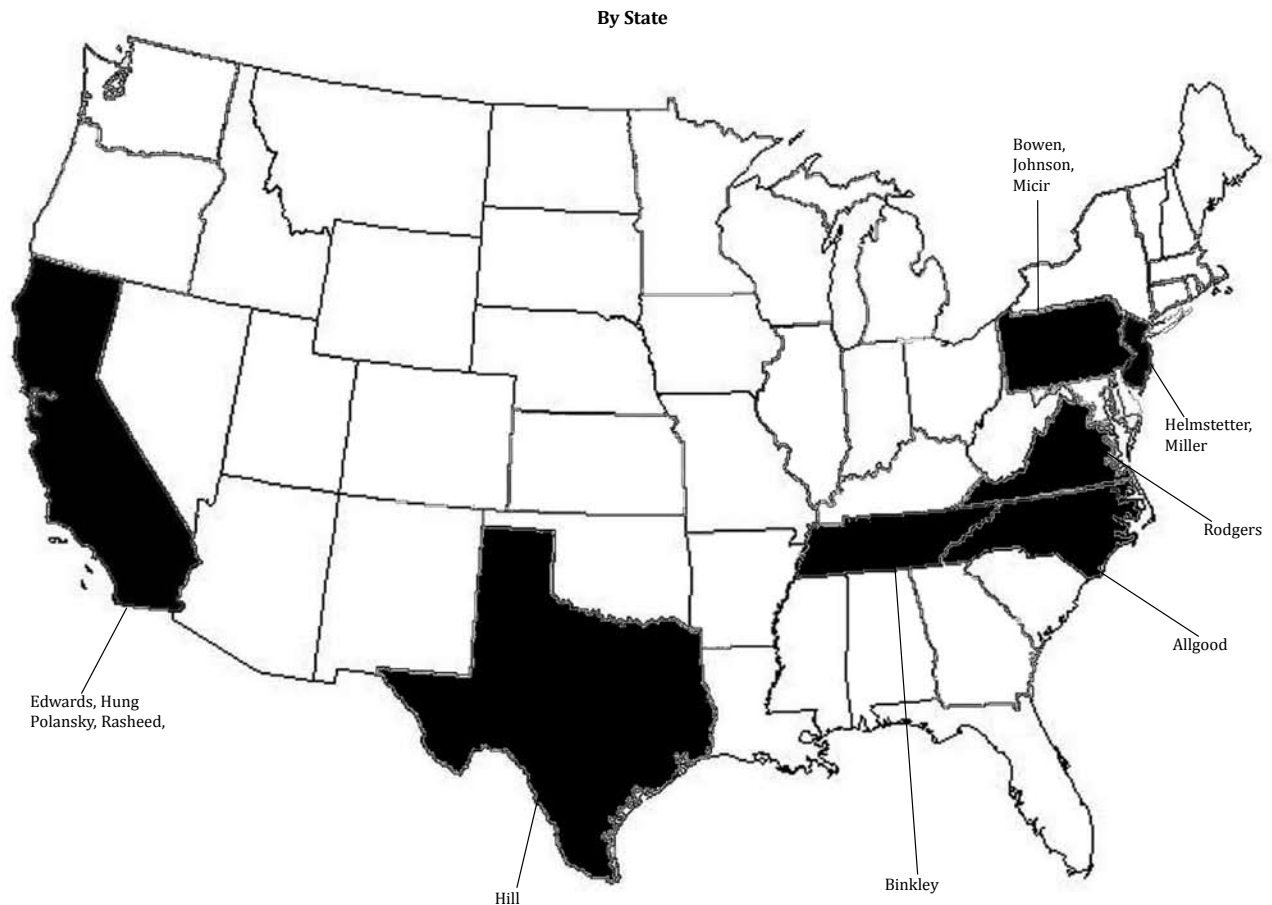

FDU 37 AT PRINCETON 78

PRINCETON, N.J. (11/13/10) - It was a banner night at Jadwin Gym for the Princeton women's basketball team as the Tigers defeated Fairleigh Dickinson 78-37 in the 2010-11 season opener.

Prior to the game the team unveiled its first NCAA Tournament banner after going 26-3 in 2009-10 and earning the Ivy League's automatic bid with a perfect 14-0 mark.

Princeton played all 13 members of the team with 12 players scoring. Three players were in double digits led by junior Devona Allgood's 20 points. She added seven rebounds, three blocks, three steals and one assist coming in 24 minutes of play. Sophomore Niveen Rasheed added 14 points, eight rebounds, four assists and one steal. Senior Addie Micir scored 12 points, hitting four three pointers and chipping in three assists, two steals and a rebound. Princeton shot 42.6 percent from the floor and missed just two of its 17 free throws.

Esther Wallace led the Knights with 13 points, while adding five rebounds and two blocks. Jasmyra Saundra had a team-best six rebounds and four steals while scoring five points. Mariyah Laury chipped in six points. As a team FDU shot 26 percent from the floor and 58.8 percent from the line.

The Tigers grabbed a 10-point lead, 19-9, at 12:48. During that time Allgood scored eight of those 19 points with Micir draining two of her four three pointers. Princeton continued to find the net scoring the next six points to make it 25-9 with a little more than nine minutes to play in the half.

The Knights were able to make it an 11-point game on three occasions including at the 1:55 mark of the first. However the Tigers would close out the first half on a 9-0 run to head into the locker room with a 39-20 lead.

Princeton's run wasn't over yet as the Tigers came out in the second and scored 17 straight points to go up 56-20 at 15:12.

A three-point basket by Alannah Driscoll-Sbar ended the drought for FDU at 12:58.

The Knights would only get within 30 points during the remainder of the game with came around the 10-minute mark. Back up by 36 points with 1:41 to play Princeton finished scoring the last seven points to wrap up the game 78-37.

Princeton will be on the road for the next five games first stopping off at Rutgers on Thursday, Nov. 18 for 7:30 p.m.

PRINCETON 53 AT RUTGERS 54

The banner of Hall-of-Fame coach Vivian Stringer looms over the court at the Lewis Brown Athletic Center, and the real-life version is still doing business on the home side bench. Clearly, this is not a place where visitors go home often with victories.

Two years ago to the day, after her team was a 48-point afterthought on this court, Courtney Banghart looked around and said that she'd back. She just didn't realize it would sting even more the second time around.

Khadijah Rushdan knocked down a jump shot with 4.4 seconds left to give Rutgers a 54-53 win over Princeton in an early-season thriller in front of 2,518 at the RAC. Princeton rallied from 15 points back in the second half to take a lead down the stretch before Rushdan broke the Tigers' hearts.

The loss was Princeton's 14th straight to the Scarlet Knights, with the last Princeton win back in 1978. Rutgers improved to 104-16 in the last nine seasons at home.

Among those 104 wins was an 83-35 win over Princeton exactly two years ago.

That loss two years ago left Banghart at 8-24 in her young coaching career. Since then, she is 40-17, and her team is 22-2 since a 10-point loss to the Scarlet Knights a year ago, when she led Princeton to a 14-0 Ivy record and the first NCAA tournament bid in school history.

This year, Princeton came in off a 41-point win over FDU in its opener, while Rutgers lost to California by nine and No. 2 Stanford by 13 to open its season.

Rutgers led 35-22 at the half and 39-24 with 18 minutes to go before Princeton turned its game up on both ends. It took four minutes to get the lead under double digits and then just three more for Princeton to get its first lead at 42-41.

It would go back-and-forth from there with eight lead changes down the stretch, and Princeton would take a 53-52 lead on the seventh of those, when Lauren Edwards scored with 1:13 left.

The Tigers would get a stop after that, but the final sequence was set up when Niveen Rasheed's jumper hit the rim and bounded to the floor, where a mad scramble ensued. A held ball would have favored Princeton at that point, but the officials ruled that Chelsey Lee of Rutgers had possession and had called for a timeout before the ball was tied up.

As a result, the Knights had a chance to win the game, and Rushdan took full advantage, swishing a mid-range shot with 4.4 to play. Princeton was unable to get a shot off after that before the horn.

Rasheed led Princeton with 14 points and added seven rebounds, while Edwards and Addie Micir had 11 each. Devona Allgood had eight points and eight rebounds, and Kate Miller came off the bench to spark the comeback with seven points while drawing two key charges.

Rushdan led RU with 13. Rutgers shot 52% for the first half while making 4 of 5 three-pointers, but Princeton held the Knights to 23% shooting and 0 for 4 on three-pointers in the second half.

Princeton shot 32% in the first half and 45% in the second half, but the Tigers came away with 12 offensive rebounds and nine second-chance points after intermission.

Rutgers now leads the series with the Tigers either 15-1 or 15-3, depending on whether two early 1970s games against Doulgass are counted. There is no disputing the current series streak, which now stands at 14 for the Scarlet Knights.

Of those 14 wins, six have been by at least 20 points and four have been by at least 40. The Scarlet Knights scored 110 against Princeton a year after the last Tiger win and 116 the year after that.

Those games - like the 48-point RU win two years ago - are just numbers in the record book now.

The one-point loss this time around stings, but it does show how far the Tigers have come in a short time.
