Eye on the Tigers

Princeton is 10-3 on the season after sweeping Davidson and Wake Forest on the road last week. The Tigers are shooting 43.8 percent from the field, 39.6 percent from behind the arc and 71.4 percent from the charity stripe. Princeton averages 70 points per game, a +13.4 scoring margin over its opponents.

Four Tigers are in double digits in scoring, led by sophomore Niveen Rasheed. Rasheed suffered a knee injury during the Davidson game and is being evaluated by the Princeton doctors and will not play tonight. Senior Addie Micir scores 12.4 points per game and has the most assists on the team with 28. She is the team's best free-throw and three-point shooter. She shoots 94.1 percent from the foul line, missing just two of her 34 chances, and is 41.1 percent from long range with 37 threes made, the most in the league. Junior Devona Allgood adds 12 points per game and is second on the team in rebounds with 6.8 per game. Classmate Lauren Edwards chips in 11.7 points per game, and 5.3 rebounds per game. Allgood and Edwards are best blockers on the team with 16 and 14, respectively. Sophomore point guard, Lauren Polansky is second on the team in assists with 37, and in steals with 26.

The Princeton/La Salle Series

Princeton leads La Salle in the all-time series, 4-1. The teams played four games against each other in the late 1970's, with Princeton winning three of the four. The series resumed last season, with the Tigers taking a 68-49 game in Philadelphia.

Scouting the Explorers

La Salle is 4-9 on the season and is looking for its first win in four games. The Explorers most recently dropped an 85-67 game at Lehigh. The team averages 60.3 points per game and allows 67.2. They are shooting 31.9 percent overall, 29 percent from long range and 74 percent from the foul line. Like the Tigers, the Explorers have four players in double digits in scoring led by senior Ashley Gale who has 16.3 points per game. She adds a team-high 49 steals. Ebonee Jones adds 11.6 points per game, while Alexis Scott and Nadia Duncan contribute 11 and 10.2 points per game, respectively. Jess Koci leads the team on the glass with 7.8 rebounds per game, while Chelsea Conner has a team-high 10 blocks for her team. Michael Bryant is the team's top assist leader with 36 in just 11 games.

Common Foes

Princeton and La Salle have five common opponents, Drexel, Delaware, Lafayette, Lehigh and Rider. Princeton is 5-0 against those teams, while La Salle is 1-4 with its lone win a 78-58 game over Rider.

Last Time We Met

Devona Allgood had 17 points and 13 rebounds to lead Princeton to a 68-49 win over La Salle on Tuesday, Jan. 5 at Tom Gola Arena. With today's win the Tigers set a program record for most non-conference wins since Ivy League play began in 1979-80.

It was a packed house as La Salle hosted over 1,500 local elementary school kids as part of Elementary School Day, explaining the noon start time.

Princeton held La Salle to 1-for-14 shooting in the first 10 minutes of the game as the Tigers grabbed a 20-2 lead.

A layup by Danielle Mickiewicz at 9:50 sparked the Explorers' offense, as the team went on a 23-8 run over the next seven minutes to make it a one-possession game, 28-25. Nine of those 23 points came from the free-throw line, as the Explorers shot 9 for 9 from the line.

Senior Tani Brown started to get the Tigers back on the right track when she hit a jumper near the home bench as Princeton took a 35-25 edge into the locker room.

An errant fire alarm that went off at halftime continued into the second half, as both coaches agreed to play through it. It didn't seem to bother either team as they traded baskets before the alarm went off three minutes into the half.

The Tigers took a 10-3 run en route to a 15-point lead, 47-32 at 11:08, with freshman Kate Miller

Jamie Walsh led the Explorers with 13 points and three assists. Morgan Robertson had 10 points and five rebounds, while Mickiewicz led the team on the glass with six rebounds and finished with six points.

Over 80

Princeton has scored over 80 points twice this season. The first was 87 points against Rider on Dec. 5 and the second was 90 points against Lafayette on Dec. 13. Since 2000, Princeton has scored 80+ points, 22 times. The 2002-03 team had seven 80+ games, while last year's team had four.

Shooter!

Princeton has shot over 50 percent in two games this season. The Tigers shot 52.6 percent against Navy and 53.6 percent against Lafayette for a +45 scoring margin.

Red Hot Rasheed

Niveen Rasheed scored a career-high 28 points, scoring 22 in the first half alone to lead Princeton to a 90-58 win over Lafayette on Monday. Rasheed's 28 points is the most points scored in a game since Becky Brown had 28 against Penn on Jan. 7, 2006. In addition, her 22 first-half points is the most since Meagan Cowher had 22 in the first half against Columbia on Jan. 13, 2006.

Down But Not Out

Princeton has battled back from double-digit deficits twice this season to make it a game until the very end. The Tigers were down by as much as 15 to Rutgers in the second half, before battling back to take the lead with 6:24 on the clock. Holding the lead with for the final minute, Rutgers hit a jumper with 4.3 seconds to win the one-point game, 54-53. Princeton was down by as much as nine to Vanderbilt but came back to take the lead with 11:59 to play in the game. Nine minutes later, Princeton found themselves in a 10-point hole with 2:57 remaining in the game, but quickly made it a three-point game. With 40 second to play it was a one-possession game, before Vanderbilt scored three free-throws to win 74-68.

The Fine Five

Eleven games into the season, injuries have forced Princeton to use a different starting lineup for the first time. This season the starting five have scored 696 of the squad's points for 76.4 percent of the points. Last year Princeton's starting five accounted for 74.8 percent of the team's points, scoring 1535 of 2051.

All About the Boards

Princeton is 8-1 when outrebounding its opponents or rebounds are even. When the opponent has more rebounds, Princeton is 2-2. The Tigers average 37.8 rebounds per game, a +3.9 margin over its opponents.

Get Ahead

Princeton is 8-1 when leading at halftime. It's lone loss was when leading St. Joseph's, 26-24 at halftime. When Princeton was won 50 percent of the games in which it has trailed at halftime. The Tigers are 9-1 when leading with five minutes to play, 1-1 when trailing and 0-1 when tied.

Make it a Double

Princeton is 7-0 when games are decided by more than 10 points. The Tigers have won 50 percent of their games when the game is decided by less, with a 3-3 mark. Princeton defeated USC by one, Davidson by six and Wake Forest by eight. They fell to Rutgers by one, Vanderbilt by six and St. Joseph's by nine.

Extra Basketball

Princeton played and lost a double overtime game at St. Joseph's on Dec. 19. It was Princeton's first overtime

game since 2008 and first double overtime game since 2005. The Tigers are now 7-10 when going into extra time.

Last Loss

Princeton's loss to St. Joseph's on Dec. 19 marked the Tigers first loss to a team not ranked or receiving votes since Nov. 25, 2009 when it fell to UCLA, 69-59 at Pauley Pavilion.

December Digits

Princeton finished the final month of the calendar year with a 7-1 record, the best record during the month of December in program history. Last year the Tigers went 6-1 which became a new best after a 7-2 mark in 1974.

Honey I'm Home

Princeton is in the middle of a 13-game home winning streak, dating back to Dec. 12, 2009. It is the 12th longest home court win streak in the NCAA. The Tigers set a record for wins at home last season going 12-1 on its home court. Princeton's last loss at home was its only loss at home last year, a 60-50 game to Rutgers.

On the Road Again

Princeton is 5-3 on the road this season, defeating Lehigh, USC, Delaware, Davidson and Wake Forest. The Tigers lost to Rutgers, Vanderbilt and St. Joseph's, all by single digits. Last year, Princeton went 14-1 on the road, with its lone loss at UCLA.

A+ Against the ACC

Princeton's win over Wake Forest on Dec. 31, marked the Tigers' first win over an ACC team since 1989. Princeton defeated North Carolina, 71-69 at Jadwin Gym during the Princeton Invitational in 1989. Princeton is now 3-13 against the ACC.

Leading the League

Princeton leads the league in eight of 11 categories including: scoring margin, field-goal percentage, three-point field goal percentage, rebounding margin, blocked shots, assists, steals and turnover margin. Princeton is second in the remaining three categories: scoring defense, scoring offensive and free-throw percentage.

Tigers at the Top

Niveen Rasheed leads the Ivy League in scoring with 16.4 points per game and in steals with 2.42 steals per game. Addie Micir is the league's best free-throw shooter, hitting 94.1 percent of her shots. She also has the most threes made in the league with 37.

Sharp Shooters

Princeton players make up four of the league's top 10 in field goal percentage. Devona Allgood is second in the league at .544, with Lauren Edwards fourth, Niveen Rasheed seventh and Addie Micir 10th.

She's Got It

Niveen Rasheed was named the Ivy League Player of the Week on Monday, Nov. 22. On Thursday at Rutgers, Rasheed scored 14 points and added seven rebounds against the Scarlet Knights, who received votes in both the preseason AP Poll and ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. She added three steals and one assist. Rasheed recorded her first double-double of the season in Princeton's 69-52 win over Lehigh, then ranked No. 18 in the CollegeInsider.com Mid Major Top 25. The victory halted Lehigh's 33-game home win streak as Princeton is the first team to win at Stabler Arena since the 2007-08 season. Rasheed scored 13 points and added 10 rebounds. She also led the team in steals with four and in assists with four. Rasheed finished the week with 27 points, 17 rebounds, seven steals and five assists.

She's Got It...Again

Niveen Rasheed earned her second Ivy League Player of the Week honor on Monday, Dec. 6. The sophomore led Princeton in scoring as the Tigers went 2-0 on the week and improve to 5-2 on the season. On Wednesday, Rasheed recorded a double-double against previously unbeaten Delaware. She scored 17 points and had a team-high 14 rebounds. She added four assists and three steals in the win. On Sunday, she scored a season-high 22 points in an 87-45 win over Rider. She shot 9-for-14 from the floor and hit all four of her free throws. She added two assists, one block and one steal. Rasheed did all of this in 20 minutes and was taken out of the game to allow her teammates time on the court.

It's All Good

Junior Devona Allgood was named the Ivy League Player of the Week on Monday, Nov. 15. Allgood shares the honor with Harvard's Brogan Berry. Allgood led Princeton in scoring as the Tigers opened the season with a 78-37 win over Fairleigh Dickinson on Saturday, Nov. 13. The junior center scored 20 points, just one point shy of her career best. In addition she added seven rebounds, three blocks, three steals and one assist coming in 24 minutes of play.

Mad for Micir

Addie Micir picked up three accolades on Monday, Nov. 29. She was named the Ivy League co-Player of the Week, the ECAC co-Player of the Week and the GoPrincetonTigers.com Athlete of the Week. She led Princeton to a 1-1 record at the Vanderbilt Tournament, stunning the USC and nearly knocking off No. 22/24 Vanderbilt. Micir scored both free throws with 5.0 seconds left to lift Princeton the 60-59 win over USC. She finished the

game with 10 points, two rebounds, two assists and a steal against the Trojans, a team receiving votes in both national polls. The Tigers nearly defeated the Commodores, falling 74-68, after battling back from a 10-point deficit to take the lead in the second half. With 40 seconds to play Princeton has down by just three. Micir led the team in scoring with a season-high 20 points. She shot 6-for-13 from long range, matching her career best of six three-pointers in the game, but this time all six game in a single half. Micir added three rebounds, one assist, one block and one steal. Micir was named to the five-member All-Tournament team for the her efforts this weekend.

Regional Rewards

Addie Micir was named the ECAC co-Player of the Week on Monday, Nov. 29. She earned the award along with Georgetown's Sugar Rodgers. The award is presented weekly by the nation's largest athletic conference of 300 member institutions, selecting among conference's players of the week. Essentially, Micir and Rodgers were the best players in the region as the ECAC member schools range from Maine to North Carolina to Illinois. Micir finished her weekend at the Vanderbilt Tournament averaging 15 points, hitting eight three-pointers, six against Vanderbilt, and going 4-for-4 from the free throw line, in addition to five rebounds, three assists, two steals and a block.

After Davidson...

"After a slow start, which can be expected given our travel saga, I thought we adjusted well at halftime. We utilized a very balanced attack. I thought Devona played very well in the second half and Addie was the floor leader that we needed tonight."

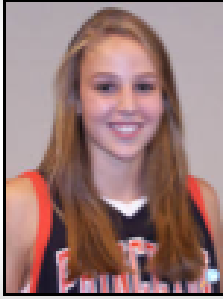

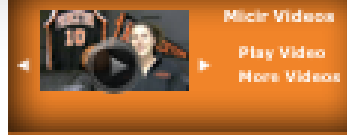

GAME #1

FDU 37 AT PRINCETON 78

PRINCETON, N.J. (11/13/10) - It was a banner night at Jadwin Gym for the Princeton women's basketball team as the Tigers defeated Fairleigh Dickinson 78-37 in the 2010-11 season opener.

Prior to the game the team unveiled its first NCAA Tournament banner after going 26-3 in 2009-10 and earning the Ivy League's automatic bid with a perfect 14-0 mark.

Princeton played all 13 members of the team with 12 players scoring. Three players were in double digits led by junior Devona Allgood's 20 points. She added seven rebounds, three blocks, three steals and one assist coming in 24 minutes of play. Sophomore Niveen Rasheed added 14 points, eight rebounds, four assists and one steal. Senior Addie Micir scored 12 points, hitting four three pointers and chipping in three assists, two steals and a rebound. Princeton shot 42.6 percent from the floor and missed just two of its 17 free throws.

Esther Wallace led the Knights with 13 points, while adding five rebounds and two blocks. Jasmrya Saunder had a team-best six rebounds and four steals while scoring five points. Mariyah Laury chipped in six points. As a team FDU shot 26 percent from the floor and 58.8 percent from the line.

The Tigers grabbed a 10-point lead, 19-9, at 12:48. During that time Allgood scored eight of those 19 points with Micir draining two of her four three pointers. Princeton continued to find the net scoring the next six points to make it 25-9 with a little more than nine minutes to play in the half.

The Knights were able to make it an 11-point game on three occasions including at the 1:55 mark of the first. However the Tigers would close out the first half on a 9-0 run to head into the locker room with a 39-20 lead.

Princeton's run wasn't over yet as the Tigers came out in the second and scored 17 straight points to go up 56-20 at 15:12.

A three-point basket by Alannah Driscoll-Sbar ended the drought for FDU at 12:58.

The Knights would only get within 30 points during the remainder of the game with came around the 10-minute mark. Back up by 36 points with 1:41 to play Princeton finished scoring the last seven points to wrap up the game 78-37.

Princeton will be on the road for the next five games first stopping off at Rutgers on Thursday, Nov. 18 for 7:30 p.m.

GAME #2

PRINCETON 53 AT RUTGERS 54

The banner of Hall-of-Fame coach Vivian Stringer looms over the court at the Lewis Brown Athletic Center, and the real-life version is still doing business on the home side bench. Clearly, this is not a place where visitors go home often with victories.

Two years ago to the day, after her team was a 48-point afterthought on this court, Courtney Banghart looked around and said that she'd back. She just didn't realize it would sting even more the second time around.

Khadijah Rushdan knocked down a jump shot with a 4.4 seconds left to give Rutgers a 54-53 win over Princeton in an early-season thriller in front of 2,518 at the RAC. Princeton rallied from 15 points back in the second half to take a lead down the stretch before Rushdan broke the Tigers' hearts.

The loss was Princeton's 14th straight to the Scarlet Knights, with the last Princeton win back in 1978. Rutgers improved to 104-16 in the last nine seasons at home.

Among those 104 wins was an 83-35 win over Princeton exactly two years ago.

That loss two years ago left Banghart at 8-24 in her young coaching career. Since then, she is 40-7, and her team is 22-2 since a 10-point loss to the Scarlet Knights a year ago, when she led Princeton to a 14-0 Ivy record and the first NCAA tournament bid in school history.

This year, Princeton came in off a 41-point win over FDU in its opener, while Rutgers lost to California by nine and No. 2 Stanford by 13 to open its season.

Rutgers led 35-22 at the half and 39-24 with 18 minutes to go before Princeton turned its game up on both ends. It took four minutes to get the lead under double digits and then just three more for Princeton to get its first lead at 42-41.

It would go back-and-forth from there with eight lead changes down the stretch, and Princeton would take a 53-52 lead on the seventh of those, when Lauren Edwards scored with 1:13 left.

The Tigers would get a stop after that, but the final sequence was set up when Niveen Rasheed's jumper hit the rim and bounded to the floor, where a mad scramble ensued. A held ball would have favored Princeton at that point, but the officials ruled that Chelsey Lee of Rutgers had possession and had called for a timeout before the ball was tied up.

As a result, the Knights had a chance to win the game, and Rushdan took full advantage, swishing a mid-range shot with 4.4 to play. Princeton was unable to get a shot off after that before the horn.

Rasheed led Princeton with 14 points and added seven rebounds, while Edwards and Addie Micir had 11 each. Devona Allgood had eight points and eight rebounds, and Kate Miller came off the bench to spark the comeback with seven points while drawing two key charges.

Rushdan led RU with 13. Rutgers shot 52% for the first half while making 4 of 5 three-pointers, but Princeton held the Knights to 23% shooting and 0 for 4 on three-pointers in the second half.

Princeton shot 32% in the first half and 45% in the second half, but the Tigers came away with 12 offensive rebounds and nine second-chance points after intermission.

Rutgers now leads the series with the Tigers either 15-1 or 15-3, depending on whether two early 1970s games against Douglass are counted. There is no disputing the current series streak, which now stands at 14 for the Scarlet Knights.

Of those 14 runs, six have been by at least 20 points and four have been by at least 40. The Scarlet Knights scored 110 against Princeton a year after the last Tiger win and 116 the year after that.

Those games - like the 48-point RU win two years ago - are just numbers in the record book now.

The one-point loss this time around stings, but it does show how far the Tigers have come in a short time.

GAME #3

PRINCETON 69 AT LEHIGH 52

BETHLEHEM, Pa. (11/21/10) - Lehigh's 33-game home winning streak is over. The Princeton women's basketball team delivered the Mountain Hawks their first loss at Stabler Arena since the 2007-08 season with a 69-52 game.

Four players were in double digits, led by sophomore Niveen Rasheed's first double-double of the season with 13 points and 10 rebounds. She added four steals and four assists. Juniors Devona Allgood and Laura Johnson and senior Addie Micir had 12 points apiece. Allgood added six rebounds, four steals, three assists and two blocks. Sophomore Lauren Polansky chipped in six rebounds, two steals and two points, junior Lauren Edwards had nine points, six rebounds and three assists.

Princeton took a seven-point lead 9-2 five minutes into the game, but an 8-0 Lehigh run over the next two minutes gave the Mountain Hawks a one-point lead, 10-9.

The teams would exchange leads five times over the next six minutes before a Laura Johnson three-pointer at 7:31 gave Princeton a two-point lead it wouldn't relinquish, sending the Tigers on a 20-5 run over the next five minutes.

Down by 14, 38-24, Lehigh would shoot 4-for-4 from the line and wasn't allowed a field goal for the final 3:41, to close out the half with a 10-point deficit on its home court.

The Tigers continued to build on their lead with freshman Nicole Hung giving Princeton a 20-point edge on a jumper at 7:34. Lehigh went on an 8-0 run over the next 1:23 to get within 14, 61-47, with just under six minutes to play. It would be as close as the Mountain Hawks would get as Princeton would close out the half on an 8-5 run for the 69-52 final score.

Of Lehigh's nine baskets from the field in the second half, five were three-pointers.

The Hun School product Emily Gratch paced the Mountain Hawks with 14 points, shooting a perfect 5-for-5 from the field. She added three steals and three blocks. Leading scorer Erica Prosser added 11 points, five rebounds and a team-high seven assists. Leading the team under the basket was Courtney Dentler who pulled down seven boards, while adding seven points and a team-best three blocks. Lehigh shot 41.3 percent from the floor (19-46), 60 percent from the line and 36.4 percent from behind the arc.

Princeton shot 43.3 percent from the floor (29-67), 50 percent from long range and 44.4 percent from the free-throw line. The Tigers outrebounded the opponent 43-28.

The Tigers improve to 2-1 on the season and will play in the Vanderbilt Tournament over Thanksgiving break to continue their five-game road swing. First up Princeton will meet with USC on Friday, Nov. 26 at 7 p.m.

NASHVILLE (11/26/10) - With her team up 59-58, USC's Cassie Harbets fouled the wrong Princeton basketball player - the team's best free-throw shooter, senior captain Addie Micir. Micir hit both of her free throws with five seconds left to give the Tigers a 60-59 victory over the Trojans on Friday, Nov. 26 at Memorial Gymnasium in the second game of the Vanderbilt Tournament.

USC would fumble down the court due to high pressure from guard Laura Johnson and didn't have enough time to get a decent shot off as Princeton celebrated on the opposite end of the court.

Princeton will play in the championship game against the host school Vanderbilt on Sunday, Nov. 28 at 2 p.m. The game will be webstreamed, with live audio and live stats available. Check back tomorrow for links as well as video footage of the win.

It was a back and forth affair in the first half. The lead changed hands six times and was tied four times. USC scored first but Princeton would take it's first lead on a Niveen Rasheed three-point play at 15:38, 5-4.

USC would regain the lead on a pair of free throws by Christina Marinacci and would go up by four, 11-7, before Princeton battled back to take the lead 14-13 when Rasheed stole the ball and ran down the court for a jumper in the lane.

USC scored the next five points, 18-14, but Princeton answered with seven straight with Rasheed scoring twice and Micir draining a three, to give the Tigers their largest lead of the half, 21-18.

The Trojans went on a 14-3 over the next 5:16 to take the 32-24 lead with 2:35 to play. Sophomore center Meg Bowen added two baskets to inch Princeton within four to head into the locker room with a 32-28 score.

At the end of the half both teams had committed eight turnovers, but it was the Tigers that capitalized getting 10 points off of them compared to USC's six.

The Women of Troy started the second half on a 9-5 run to regain an eight-point lead, 41-33 at 15:59. Rasheed scored the game's next six points, going 4-for-4 from the free-throw line and adding a jumper to make it a two-point game, 41-39 at 13:48. A pair of free throws by Harbets ended Rasheed's run but Bowen drew a charge on a jumper in the paint and made good on the three-point play to make it a one-point game, 43-42 with 11 minutes to play.

Ashley Corral and Marinacci teamed up to score the next six points to make it a 49-42 game. A free-throw by Lauren Edwards, followed by a basket by Rasheed after getting the offensive rebound on Edward's second free throw, and a basket in the paint by Allgood put Princeton back within two with seven minutes left.

A minute later the Tigers remained down by two, 53-51, before Marinacci and Harbets added four points. Princeton's Allgood responded going 2-for-2 and adding a basket to make it a 57-55 game with a little more than three minutes left.

Harbets followed with a basket before Edwards earned a steal and raced down the court for a layup. Harbets fouled Rasheed, who made the back end of the two shots to get Princeton within one with 1:08 to play.

The Trojans missed two three-pointers with Edwards getting the second rebound to give Princeton possession with 26 seconds. Bringing the ball down the court, Rasheed drove to the basket but missed the shot with Kari LaPlante getting the defensive rebound and a chance at two baskets as Rasheed was called for the foul.

LaPlante missed both shots and Johnson got the defensive board with 14 seconds to play.

Key to Princeton's success in the second half was its rebounding. USC had a 25-17 edge in boards in the first half, the most rebounds the Tigers have allowed in a half this season. The Tigers outboarded the Trojans 28-20 in the second half. Princeton also got 12 points on second-chance opportunities.

Allgood recorded her first double-double of the season with 12 points and 11 rebounds. Rasheed led the team in scoring with 18 points and had six rebounds, three assists and two steals. Edwards added seven points and 10 rebounds, while Micir contributed 10 points. As a team Princeton shot 32.8 percent from the floor, 80 percent from the line and 26.7 percent from long range.

GAME #5 PRINCETON 68 AT VANDERBILT 74

NASHVILLE (11/28/10) - The Princeton women's basketball team gave No. 22/24 Vanderbilt a game all the way to the end, but it was the Commodores who earned the 74-68 win in the championship game of the Vanderbilt Tournament on Sunday, Nov. 28 at Memorial Gym.

Down by as much as nine, Princeton battled its way back to take the lead midway through the second and continued to answer any scoring runs against the first ranked opponent it has played this season. Down by 10 with less than three minutes to play Princeton made it a three-point game and challenged for the win until the very end.

Poor shooting put Princeton in an early deficit, down by nine, 14-5 at 12:17. The Tigers shot 2-for-10 up until that point while the Commodores were shooting 6-for-9 and had eight rebounds to Princeton's three.

Sophomore Kate Miller seemed to spark Princeton's defensive effort when she grabbed a steal and went down for a fast-break layup and was fouled for a three-point play to get within six, 14-8.

Following the effort the Tigers started to explode defensively. Junior Laura Johnson got a block, sophomore Lauren Polansky forced a jump ball and senior Kristal Hill grabbed a steal. With that the Tigers started to chip away at the score. Princeton went on a 10-5 run over the next 4:15, to make it a three-point game, 23-20 with 4:42 to play.

Stephanie Holzer would hit two free throws before Edwards washed away those two points with a layup. Sophomore Niveen Rasheed would hit a jumper with help from sophomore Meg Bowen at 2:27 to make it a one-point game, 25-24.

During the next 2:27 Princeton had a number of chances to take the lead, but shot 0-for-3. Princeton also didn't allow Vandy to expand on its lead holding it to 0-for-4 shooting. Holzer would shoot a long ball for two at the buzzer to give the 'Dores a 29-26 lead headed into the locker room.

Hannah Tuomi and Jence Rhoads added to Vanderbilt's lead with buckets to start the second, 33-26. The teams then traded threes, with senior Addie Micir draining both for Princeton. Rasheed would have a three-point play at 16:16 to get Princeton back within four, 39-35.

Two minutes later Princeton remained down by four points before Tiffany Clarke hit a jumper to put the 'Dores ahead by six, 43-47.

Micir sank her third three-point of the half and Rasheed followed up with a basket in the paint to put the Tigers back within one, 43-32 with 13 minutes to play, forcing Vanderbilt to call a timeout. Rasheed would put back a backdoor pass from Miller at 11:59 to give Princeton its first lead of the game, 44-43.

Vanderbilt went on a 10-0 run for the next 2:18 with Tuomi scoring six of those 10 points to make it a 53-44 game.

Princeton held strong and responded with an 11-4 run. Micir would hit her fourth three, and Bowen and Rasheed would each score four points to bring the game back to two, 57-55 with 5:47 to play.

Vanderbilt regained a 10-point lead, 67-57 at 2:57 thanks to a 10-2 run. Princeton never gave up answering with an 8-1 run to make it a three-point game, 68-65 with 1:20 on the clock.

With 40 seconds left, Vanderbilt held the three-point lead, 71-68. A free throw by Rhoads made it a two-possession game with 30 seconds to play. Getting the rebound on a missed free throw by Rhoads, Princeton ran down the court and desperately tried to get a basket, shooting 0-for-3 in the next 20 seconds. Allgood would foul Holzer with eight ticks on the clock to try to get Princeton the ball back. Holzer made both of her shots but Princeton turned the ball over with four seconds left and the clock ran out.

Micir was named to the All-Tournament team for her efforts this weekend. Today she matched her career best with six three-point baskets en route to scoring a season-high 20 points. Rasheed added 15 points, six rebounds and four assists, while Edwards contributed 14 points and six rebounds. The Tigers shot 44.6 percent from the floor, 47.1 percent from long range and missed just one of their 11 free throws.

GAME #6 PRINCETON 68 AT DELAWARE 50

NEWARK, Del. (12/11/10) - When the Princeton women's basketball team arrived at the Carpenter Center the game plan on defending unbeaten Delaware changed. Star player Elena Delle Donne was not dressed for the game. The change in game plan didn't faze the Tigers as the ended Delaware's five-game win streak with a 68-50 win.

An illness would keep Delle Donne, a player that scores 41 percent of her team's points averaging 27.4 points per game, on the bench. Sarah Acker would start in her place but couldn't be the offensive threat the team needed.

The Tigers grabbed a six-point lead, 10-4, four minutes into the game before Delaware went on a run. The Blue Hens held the Tigers scoreless for the next five minutes as they scored 10 points to take the 14-10 lead at 12:25.

Addie Micir hit back-to-back threes to regain the lead for Princeton and Niveen Rasheed gave the Tigers the 18-14 lead.

Delaware scored the next three points to make it a one-point game, 18-17, but it would be as close as the Blue Hens would get as the Tigers went on a 15-0 run over that stretch from the final seven minute of the first half and into the second half to take a 33-17 lead.

The Blue Hens would use a number of substitutes in the first half to try to find the right combination but couldn't stop the sharp-shooting Tigers.

The Blue Hens would only get as close as 11 in the second half, as Princeton pushed its lead by as much as 24.

With the wide gap, Princeton was able to get all of its dressed players into the game with each putting in considerable minutes.

Micir hit a career-best six three-pointers for the second straight game, missing just one of her seven shots from behind the arc. She shot 6-for-8 overall to lead the team in scoring with 18 points. Rasheed earned a double-double with 17 points and a team-high 14 rebounds. She added four assists and three steals. Junior Devona Allgood was also in double digits with 13 points, while sophomore Meg Bowen finished the game with a career-high seven rebounds.

Princeton shot 41.1 percent from the floor, 47.4 percent from long range and 65 percent from the line, paced by Rasheed shooting 7-for-8.

The Tigers who entered the game ranked No. 5 in the mid-major poll, outboarded the Blue Hens, ranked No. 10 in the same poll, 41-35.

Danielle Parker led Delaware with a double-double of 14 points and 11 rebounds. Vanessa Kabongo had 12 points and a team-best three assists. Kelsey Buchanan added eight rebounds for the Blue Hens. Delaware shot 36.7 percent from the field, 52 percent from the line and 16.7 percent from long range, making just one of its six three's.

GAME #7 RIDER 45 AT PRINCETON 87

PRINCETON, N.J. (12/5/10) - Sophomore Niveen Rasheed scored a season-high 22 points to lead the Princeton women's basketball team to an 87-45 win over Rider on Sunday, Dec. 5.

All 13 players got in the game for the Tigers with the bench contributing 36 of the team's 87 points. Princeton shot 11-for-11 from the free-throw line and 53.5 percent from long range, hitting eight three's. She would finish the game with just six points. MyNesha McKenzie and Sarah Homan both had nine points to lead the Broncos offensively. McKenzie also had nine rebounds to lead the team on the glass.

Princeton grabbed an 8-0 lead to start the game, prompting Rider to call a timeout. Bopp gave her team its first basket at 16:43 before Princeton's Lauren Polansky drained a three. The teams would trade baskets to make it 15-6 at 13:46 before Princeton went on a 9-3 run to take a 17-point lead, 28-11, with 7:11 remaining. Five minutes later a three pointer by Nicole Hung gave Princeton a 22-point lead. Rider had a 5-0 run over the next two minutes, but another three by Hung at 1:28 pushed the Tigers out ahead by 20+ points once again. Princeton would take a 20-point lead, 42-22, into the locker room.

The Tigers were unstopable in the second half, opening up with a 12-0 run to make it a 54-22 game at 16:06.

A basket by Alicia Hall at 14:13 brought her team within 30 but it would be as close as it would get as Princeton pushed its lead to as much as 42 to end the game, 87-45.

Junior post Devona Algood was second on the team in scoring with 12 points, while adding seven rebounds. Junior guard Laura Johnson had 10 points, five rebounds, two steals, two assists and one block. Junior forward Lauren Edwards led the team under the basket with eight rebounds, while freshman guard Alex Rodgers had six.

As a team Princeton had 21 assists on 34 baskets, to go along with nine steals and six blocks. The Tigers had 49 rebounds to Rider's 33.

GAME #8 NAVY 61 AT PRINCETON 74

PRINCETON, N.J. (12/10/10) - The Princeton women's basketball team shot 61.5 percent in the first half, but led Navy by just three at halftime. It was only a matter of time before the Tigers would start to pull away and a strong defensive showing in the second half led to a 74-61 victory.

Coincidentally, the last time Princeton shot that well in a half was November 2009 when the Tigers earned a 77-45 win over another Patriot League team, American. Despite the sharp shooting, Princeton struggled defensively against Navy, as the Mids hit six three-pointers in the first half and was 57.7 percent from the floor overall.

Princeton would hold Navy to 28.1 percent (9-for-32) shooting in the second half and gave up just one three-pointer.

Devona Algood would score back-to-back buckets and Lauren Edwards had a fast break basket to give Princeton a 41-35 lead. Myers would drain her third three of the half at the buzzer to set the halftime score at 41-38.

A basket by Consedine started the second half and made it a 41-40 game, but Rasheed scored two from the line and Edwards added a layup to give Princeton a 45-40 lead. The teams would trade baskets over the next five minutes to make it 49-44.

A layup by Audrey Bauer at 14:38 would be Navy's last basket for the next 8:41, as Princeton held Navy scoreless from the field and took off. The Tigers went on a 16-2 run to build a 17-point lead, 65-48.

Consedine ended the drought for the Mids at 5:52 but the Tigers continued to attack to go ahead by as much as 20 on a three by Krystal Hill at 2:15.

Navy would answer back with a three, and Aïx Membreno would score the game's last four points.

Myers led Navy with 21 points and eight rebounds. She dished out four assists and had two steals. Consedine added 14 points and Membreno had 11 off the bench and earned six rebounds. Jade Geif would finish with eight points and seven boards. Navy concluded the game shooting 41.4 percent overall, 60 percent from the line and 38.9 percent from long range.

Pacing the Tigers was Rasheed with 21 points, six rebounds, four steals and four assists. Algood was also in double figures with 14 points and led the team on the glass with eight rebounds. Edwards chipped in 13 points, four rebounds and three assists. Senior Addie Micir and Hill would each contribute nine points. The Tigers shot a clip of 52.6 percent, shot 45.5 percent from behind the arc and was 9-for-12 from the free-throw line.

Navy falls to 5-5 overall, while Princeton improves to 6-2 overall and extends its home win streak to 12.

GAME #9 LAFAYETTE 58 AT PRINCETON 90

PRINCETON, N.J. (12/13/10) - Sophomore Niveen Rasheed scored a career-high 28 points, scoring 22 in the first half alone to lead the Princeton women's basketball team to a 90-58 win over Lafayette on Monday, Dec. 13.

Rasheed's 28 points is the most points scored in a game since Becky Brown had 28 against Penn on Jan. 7, 2006. In addition, her 22 first-half points is the most since Meagan Cowher had 22 in the first half against Columbia on Jan. 13, 2006.

It was the second straight game that the Tigers shot over 50 percent, as Princeton shot 53.6 percent from the field. Rasheed herself shot 11-for-15.

A third of Princeton's points came from the bench, while more than a third came off of Lafayette turnovers, 39 in fact.

GAME #10 DREXEL 64 AT PRINCETON 52

PRINCETON, N.J. (12/17/10) - Trailing for the first time at home this season, the Princeton women's basketball team rallied to defeat Drexel 64-52 on Friday, Dec. 17 at Jadwin Gym. The win extends the Tigers win streak at home to 13, as Princeton completes 2010 with a perfect home court record.

Drexel held Princeton scoreless for 10:58, had four-point lead and forced Princeton's top player Niveen Rasheed into five fouls after playing 16 minutes. All had the workings of an upset. However, the Tigers rallied and found what they had to do to win.

Drexel had five turnovers in the first five minutes giving Princeton a 10-5 lead by the first media timeout at 14:31. Sharp three-point shooting by Jasmina Rosseel during a Drexel 10-4 run would help her team the lead.

The Tigers scored the next 10 points and made it a nine-point game, 24-15, at 8:12. However, a three by junior Laura Johnson at 9:21 would be Princeton's final basket from the field until 18:23 of the second half. Scoreless for 10:58, Princeton shot 0-for-11 during that stretch, while Drexel would score 10 points to take a 25-24 lead into the locker room.

Four minutes into the second half, Drexel reached its largest lead of the game, a four-point differential and had forced Rasheed into her third and fourth fouls and she took a seat on the bench.

Hoping it would be Rasheed, she went back into the game and 10 seconds later would hit two free throws at 12:56 to get Princeton within one 33-32. After Kamile Nacikaita drained a three, Princeton attacked and went on an 8-0. A three-pointer by Edwards at 9:07 would give the Tigers back the lead and Micir would drop in a jumper to make it a 40-35 with 8:25 left on the clock.

Drexel would score a string of free throws, five in fact, to tie the game up 40-40 at 6:32.

Devona Allgood and Edwards would each score points in the paint to help Princeton go up by four, 44-40 with a little more than five minutes left.

Nacikaita would go 2-for-2 from the line to get the Dragons within two, but it would be as close as they would get in the final minutes.

Micir and Edwards scored back-to-back three-pointers to make it an eight-point game. Another string of Drexel free throws, made it a four-point game, before Princeton went on a 8-2 run over the next three minutes to take its largest lead of the game, 58-48 with 53 seconds remaining on the clock.

Micir would go to the line six times in the final 45 seconds, as the Dragons purposefully fouled her twice to get possession. Entering the game shooting 100 percent from the foul line, Micir went 6-for-6 from the line to give the Tigers the 64-52 win.

Edwards had 17 points, five rebounds, five assists, two blocks and one steal. Micir was the leading scorer for Princeton with 18 points and had a team-high six rebounds. Allgood would also grab six boards and had 12 points. Princeton shot 44 percent from the field, 80 percent from the free-throw line and 44.4 percent from long range.

Nacikaita paced the Dragons with a double-double of 17 points and 10 rebounds. Rosseel had 11 points, four rebounds and two assists. The Dragons, who played just seven players, shot 35.6 percent overall, 40 percent from long range and 77.8 percent from the foul line.

Drexel falls to 6-2 on the season, while Princeton improves to 8-2.

Princeton will be back in action on Sunday, Dec. 19 when it travels to Philadelphia to take on St. Joseph's at 2 p.m.

GAME #11 PRINCETON 61 AT ST. JOE'S 70

PRINCETON, N.J. (12/17/10) - St. Joseph's snapped Princeton's five-game win streak as Michelle Baker scored a career-high 28 points to lead her team to a 70-61 double-overtime victory over Princeton in women's basketball on Sunday, Dec. 19 at Hagan Arena.

PRINCETON 71 AT WAKE FOREST 63

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. (12/31/10) - Junior Lauren Edwards scored a season-high 21 points and matched her career-best of four three pointers in a game, to lead the Princeton women's basketball team to a 71-63 win over Wake Forest on New Year's Eve day at Joel Coliseum.

It marks Princeton first win over an ACC team since 1989 when the Tigers defeated North Carolina.

Senior Addie Micir added 15 points, and is now three away from 1,000 career points. Micir led the team on the glass with six rebounds, and had a team-best five assists. She also led the team in assists with five and had two steals. Junior Laura Johnson and sophomore Meg Bowen each added nine points.

Princeton had a different lineup for the second straight game, as the Tigers were without the league's leading scorer Niveen Rasheed. Rasheed suffered a knee injury in the Davidson game and will be evaluated by Princeton doctors upon return to the Garden State.

Wake Forest doubled the post, limiting points for center Devona Allgood and her fellow Tigers in the paint, however it left the wings wide open for three-point opportunities. Princeton shot 50 percent from long range (11-22), sinking nine in the first half. Allgood would pick up eight points and would get into foul trouble early in the second half.

The lead would change hands five hands in the first four minutes of the game. The Demon Deacons would go on a 6-0 run in a span of 1:35 to take a 10-5 lead at 14:14. The Tigers responded with their own 6-0 run to regain the lead, 11-10, on a three from sophomore Kate Miller at the top of the key, the Tigers' third of the half.

A three by Brittany Waters put Wake Forest back up by two but an old-fashioned three-point play by Bowen put Princeton back on top by one, 14-13 at 10:40.

Wake capitalized on Princeton turnovers getting 10 of 13 points off of the Tigers' eight turnovers midway through the first half.

Princeton would work its way up to a nine-point lead, 26-17, with Edwards, Johnson and Lauren Polansky all draining buckets from long range - Edwards getting two with a little more than five minutes play in the half.

A minute later Micir made it a 10-point game after getting fouled by Brooke Thomas taking a three, and making all three from the foul line.

The Deacons would cut the lead back to three, 29-26, with 2:20 to play, getting all three baskets off of Princeton turnovers at midcourt.

Princeton would respond on an 8-1 run, with Edwards hitting two more threes and Bowen knocking in a layup to take a 10-point edge once again, 37-27 with 33 seconds left.

Jaymee Carnes would drill a three from the top of the key with 24 seconds to play to make it a seven-point game, 37-30 at halftime.

Despite the 16 turnovers in the first half, Princeton shot 60 percent (12-20) and was 9-for-13 from long range, and 4-for-4 from the line.

Wake Forest started the second half on a 6-2 run to cut the lead back to three, 39-36. Bowen kept the Tigers in the game getting two in the paint to keep Princeton in the lead by five. A three by Micir pushed the lead back out to eight, 46-38 at 16:18.

The Deacons would take the lead, 49-48, at 10:42 on a 9-0 run, with Waters scoring the first five points.

Princeton couldn't get it going on offense, shooting 1-for-7 from behind the arc to this point in the second half.

Allgood would end Princeton's nearly six-minute scoring drought with a layup at 9:21, and Johnson would follow up with her third long ball of the afternoon, matching her season best from outside the circle to give Princeton a 53-49 edge.

Six minutes later, at 3:27, the Tigers retained the four-point lead. It would be a free-throw clinic the remainder of the game, Princeton collected the next four points to take back the eight-point game, 62-54. Micir would get the Tigers back out ahead hitting four straight free throws, to make it a 68-58 game with 28 seconds to play. Secily Ray would hit a jumper to make it 68-60 with 20 ticks left, and the Tigers would keep that lead to end the game, 71-63.

The Deacons were led by Brittany Waters who had 11 points on the afternoon, while Asia Williams recorded a double-double with 10 points and 12 rebounds. Mykala Walker, Brooke Thomas had 10 points apiece. Thomas would lead her team in assists, dishing out five, and had the lone block on the team. Wake Forest shot 50.9 percent from the floor, 35.7 percent from behind the arc and 44.4 percent from the line. The squad falls to 7-7 on the season.
