Eye on the Tigers

Princeton is 14-3 overall and 3-0 in the Ivy League to sit in first-place with Harvard. The Tigers are averaging 69.5 points per game and are holding team's to just under 54 for a +15.6 scoring margin, a category Princeton leads the league in. The Tigers also lead the league in three-point shooting, hitting 40.7 percent of their shots. Princeton is second in the league, to Harvard, in field goal percentage at .441 and in free throw percentage at .698. Leading the Tigers in scoring is senior Addie Micir. She scores 13.6 points per game and is the team's top three-point and free-throw shooter. She has 53 three's to her name and has missed just four of her 43 free throws this season. Juniors Lauren Edwards and Devona Allgood are also in double digits in scoring, and ranked in the top 10 in the league in scoring. Edwards contributes 11.7 points per game and is second on the team in rebounding with 5.2 boards per game. Allgood is the team's leading rebounder with 6.9 boards per game and adds 11.6 points per game. Allgood has 24 blocks while Edwards has 15. Sophomore Lauren Polansky has a team-high 52 assists and 34 steals, while adding 4.3 rebounds and 2.2 points.

The Princeton/Harvard Series

Harvard owns a 37-29 advantage in the all-time series, which began in 1974, as Harvard's women's school was known as Radcliffe. Princeton won both games last season, ending Harvard's six-game win streak in the series. The Tigers are 10-21 when playing in Cambridge, winning just twice at Lavietes this decade.

Scouting the Crimson

Harvard is 11-6 overall and has won its last five games. The Crimson is the only other unbeaten team in the Ivy League with a 3-0 record, and is 5-1 at home this season, their lone loss against Sacred Heart. Harvard averages 73.5 points per game while its opponents average 66.3 points per game. The Crimson have the top field goal and free throw percentages in the league at 44.8 and 76.4 percents. Four players are in double digits in scoring. Junior Brogan Berry is second in the league in scoring with 14.1 points per game. She adds 4.6 rebounds per game and has a league-high 71 assists, and has picked up 21 steals. Sophomore Victoria Lippert adds 13.5 points per game. Senior Emma Markley contributes 12.8 points per game and is the team's leading rebounder with 5.8 boards per game. She also has a team-high 32 blocks. Rookie Christine Clark chips in 11.1 points per game, 4.6 rebounds per game and leads the team in steals with 22.

Last Time We Met

Princeton won the Ivy League Championship as the Tigers defeated Harvard 78-66 on March 6 at Lavietes.

Niveen Rasheed scored 23 points and had 10 rebounds, while Devona Allgood scored 15 and had a team-high 13 boards and two assists. Lauren Edwards was also in double figures with 17 points, four assists and four steals. Princeton shot 45.4 percent from the floor, 65.2 percent from the free throw line and 30 percent from long range.

Princeton started the game on a 9-2 run but Harvard responded with 12-5 to even the game 14-14 at 11:17. The Crimson would then take its first lead of the game on a Brogan Berry jumper and two minutes later her squad held a 21-16 lead with 9:25 to play. Princeton made it a one-point game at 7:24, before Harvard regained a seven-point edge, 30-23, with 3:46 remaining in the half. A layup by Rasheed sparked the offense and Princeton would close out the half on an 11-3 run.

Three minutes into the second half the Tigers worked their way to a five-point lead, 45-40. That lead was quickly stripped away by two layups by Emma Markley to make it a one-point game, 45-44 at 15:50.

From this point on the Crimson would score just four times from the field but its hot free throw shooting kept them in the game. The Crimson would be held scoreless from the field for the next four minutes, but got eight points from the free throw line to once again tie the game at 52-52 with 12:57 remaining.

Princeton would go on an 8-0 run over the next 5:16 but Harvard scored the next five unanswered to cut its deficit to four at 5:02. Rasheed dropped in two layups to give Princeton's its largest lead of the game 58-66 at 3:46. Addie Micir expanded the lead to 13 with a layup and a three pointer with a little more than two minutes to play. The teams would go back and forth through the final two minutes with Brown sealing the win with a pair of free throws with 21 second left.

Markley led the Crimson with 21 points, 10 rebounds and four blocks. Lippert finished with 15 points and Berry had 14 along with seven rebounds, seven assists and two steals. Jackie Alemany also pulled down seven boards while chipping in six points. Harvard shot 39 percent overall, 83.3 percent from the line and 29.4 percent from behind the arc. The loss was Harvard's first on its home court this season as the Crimson fall to 19-8 overall and 10-3 in the league.

The Princeton/Dartmouth Series

Dartmouth leads the all-time series, 43-21, since the teams started playing in 1977. Princeton swept the Big Green last year, ending Dartmouth's four-game streak in the series. The Tigers are just 7-24 at Leede and have won just twice there this decade.

Scouting the Big Green

Dartmouth enters the weekend with a 4-13 overall record. The Big Green are looking for their first Ivy League win, as they sport an 0-3 record, and are looking to snap a four-game losing streak. Dartmouth is 3-2 when playing at home this season. The squad averages 54.2 points per game and allow 69.3, a scoring margin of -15.1. Dartmouth hits 35.7 percent of its shots from the field, 30.6 percent of its long range balls and 60.8 percent from the charity stripe. Faziah Steen is team's leading scorer with 11.6 points per game. She adds 2.8 rebounds per game, leads the team in steals with 26 and chips in 34 assists. Cassie Cooper and Nicole Zimmer are the top rebounders on the team with 6.5 and 6.2 boards, respectively. Cooper also has the most assists on the team with 41. The pair each score eight points per game. Sasha Dosenko is second on the team in scoring with 8.6 points per game, while adding 4.9 rebounds and a league-high 37 blocks.

64-43 win over Dartmouth on Friday, March 5.

For the first time since Dec. 5 against Rutgers and for just second time this season Princeton found itself trailing at the half to defending Ivy League Champion Dartmouth, 26-21. A 43-17 second half was what the Tigers needed to secure the victory and its first share of the conference title since 2006.

The Tigers either had the lead or were tied with the Big Green up until the final five minutes of the first half. With Princeton holding an 18-15 lead, Dartmouth went on a 8-0 run hitting two three-pointers and a pair of free throws to take the 23-18 lead. Addie Micir answered with a jumper and a free throw but another three this time from Meghan McFee gave Dartmouth the five-point lead headed into the locker rooms.

Princeton started the second half getting five quick points. Niveen Rasheed had a three-point play and Devona Allgood added a layup to even the game at 26-26. Two minutes later the score remained tied at 30-30.

A reverse layup by Lauren Polansky would give the Tigers the lead, 32-30 at 16:01 and the Tigers wouldn't look back.

Midway through the half, Princeton had an eight-point lead 43-35 and they grabbed a double-digit lead at 7:18 on an Allgood layup.

After a basket by Brittany Smith the Tigers scored 12 unanswered, getting five baskets from five different players, to push their lead to 60-39 with less than two minutes to play. That 21-point differential would stand and the Tigers would celebrate knowing they are one win away from putting not one but both hands on the crown.

Lauren Edwards led Princeton in scoring with 16 points, while Allgood posted a double-double of 10 points and 10 rebounds. Rasheed also scored 10 points, had eight rebounds and recorded a game-high five steals. Micir and Polansky finished with nine and six points, respectively. The Tigers shot 43.1 percent overall, 83.3 from the line and 50 percent from the behind the arc. Princeton also won the rebound battle, 32-29.

Brittany Smith finished with 12 points and 10 rebounds, and Faziaah Steen added 11 points. McFee chipped in seven points and Betsy Williams had six points and led the team in steals with three. Margaret Smith and Sasha Donseko had five and four rebounds apiece. Overall the Big Green shot 36.4 percent from the floor, 87.5 from the charity stripe and 25 percent from long range.

Common Foes

Princeton and Dartmouth have not played a common opponent this season, while Princeton and Harvard both played Navy. The Tigers defeated Navy 74-61, while Harvard lost to the Mids, 65-60.

Let's Go Streaking

Princeton is on a six-game winning streak, winning every game since 2011. That places the team tied for 22nd in the NCAA. Harvard has won its last five, tied for 27th in the NCAA.

Game of the Week

Graham Hayes lists 'Princeton at Harvard' as the game to watch on Friday. He wrote, "Few teams were more dominant relative to their conference competition last season than Princeton. Friday night will reveal whether a repeat is in order. The Tigers improved to 3-0 in Ivy play with a victory at Yale on Saturday. All three wins came by double digits and all came without star forward Niveen Rasheed, out for the season with a knee injury. Without Rasheed, Addie Micir and Lauren Edwards have taken the scoring lead, and with the exception of the Yale victory, Princeton has relied more heavily on 3-pointers. Harvard point guard (and phenomenally named) Brogan Berry has 14 assists and just two turnovers during Harvard's 3-0 Ivy start."

Under My Thumb

Princeton is one of three schools in the nation that have both its men's and women's programs undefeated in league play. The Tigers' counterparts are also 3-0 in league play. Harvard's men are 4-0 and its women are 3-0. The Xavier women are 6-0 and the men are 7-0.

Welcome to the Club

Addie Micir scored her 1,000th career point on against La Salle on Jan. 4. She became the 18th women's basketball player in Princeton history to reach 1,000 points. She ranks 17th all-time in scoring.

First Month Figures

Princeton went 4-0 during the month of January, the second straight year the Tigers went undefeated in January. Princeton has gone undefeated in January four times in program history: 5-0 in 1998-99, 4-0 in 2005-06, 5-0 in 2009-10, 4-0 in 2010-11.

Honey I'm Home

Mad for Micir

Addie Micir was named the Ivy League Player of the Week and the GoPrincetonTigers.com Athlete of the Week, presented by Coach USA, for the week of Jan. 10. She led Princeton to a 2-0 week and scored her 1,000th career point on her way to her second Ivy League Player of the Week honor of the 2010-11 season. The senior guard became just the 18th player in Princeton women's basketball history to reach the mark and did so on her first shot of the game on Jan. 4 against La Salle, hitting her 38th three-point basket of the season. She finished the game with 17 points, four rebounds, three assists, two steals and one block. On Jan. 8, Micir scored 18 points to lead the Tigers' to a win over Penn in the 2011 Ivy League opener. The win extends the Tigers' conference win streak to 20, ranking third in the nation behind Connecticut and Stanford. When Penn cut a 19-point deficit to seven with 1:44 to play it was Micir that stepped up, hitting a three from the left wing and scored the game's next three points, all coming by way of free throws to give her team back a double-digit lead, 56-43, with 11 seconds left.

From Hollywood California.....Lauren Edwards

Lauren Edwards was named the Ivy League Player of the Week for the week ending January 2. In a 71-63 win over Wake Forest of the ACC, Edwards led all scorers with a season-high 21 points, shooting 6-for-13. She matched her career-best of four three pointers in a game while adding three rebounds, three assists, one block and one assist. On Rasheed fouling out after 16 minutes...

"This team is such a solid team, that when one of their teammates goes down, they rally around. They lost one of their own and they knew they had to come together to battle the adversity and they did that."

After Lafayette...

"Against Navy we felt that we put together 20 solid minutes defensively, and we were determined to play 40 solid defensive minutes. When we get stops it allows us to generate our transition game, and we're hard to guard over 94 feet."

After Navy...

"Navy is a really good team. They are well coached, they play hard and they have a great point guard. In the first half, we weren't as sharp defensively as we've come to expect from this team. But in the second half, it was a whole different story. We had active hands, active feet and most importantly we talked to each other."

After Rider...

"We share the ball well on offense, all looking to be a threat. It's hard to guard when we push the pace over 94 feet. It's nice to be back home."

After Delaware...

"It's our third game in six days, so we knew we would have to dig deep. We needed to be better on the defensive end, to defend without fouling and finish with a block out so that we could push the pace offensively. This game showed us that we still have a lot of work to do."

After Vanderbilt...

"We use the month of November to find out who we can be. The way the team competes, the way they are willing to get better in practice and the way they are willing to make adjustments in game, has shown to be our foundation. We came here to win two and we made a top-25 team, in its home gym, make really big shots to beat us. So we just keep trying to get better."

Vanderbilt's Coach Balcomb after playing Princeton...

"They turned it up. I like to give the other team credit when credit is due. I think they're a very good team. I think they're extremely well coached. They beat USC for a reason. We didn't take them lightly and they were ready to play with a lot of confidence. We came out real strong with a lot of energy on our home court and then they made a run and they stepped it up. They played that way for the rest of the game and maintained it."

5After USC...

"I've said it over and over again from the very beginning, I love the fight of this team. After the heartbreaker losing at the buzzer at Rutgers last week, I'm so proud that we were able to pull this one out. My team never stopped competing, they stayed composed and executed when we needed it most. We were a stop or a score away from beating Rutgers a week ago. This time we got what we needed. It was a gutsy performance and a total team win. I couldn't be prouder of them or happier for them."

December Digits

Princeton finished the final month of the calendar year with a 7-1 record, the best record during the month of December in program history. Last year the Tigers went 6-1 which became a new best after a 7-2 mark in 1974.

November Numbers

Princeton finished off the month of November with a 3-2 record. Last season, Princeton set a program record for the most wins during the month of November, going 4-1.

Open Sesame

All-time Princeton is 19-21 in season openers including this season's 78-37 win over FDU. The Tigers have won the last three season openers, and is 6-4 in the last 10 years.

Open Sesame Part II

Princeton is 17-12 in Ivy League openers since the league started its current format in 1982. The Tigers have played the Quakers in 15 openers and is 11-4 in those openers. Princeton has won its last six Ivy openers, all against Penn.

Preseason Prediction

Princeton was selected to win the Ivy League again this season in the 2010 Ivy League Preseason Media/SID Poll. The Tigers were nearly the unanimous first-place selection with 135 points and 16 first-place votes. Harvard received one first-place vote and 115 points as the runner-up. Dartmouth was picked third with 96 points, followed by Yale with 84, Columbia with 73, Brown with 50, Cornell with 39 and Penn with 19.

O Captain! My Captain!

The team has selected its two seniors to be team captains this season. Krystal Hill and Addie Micir were announced as captains at the end-of-year banquet in the spring of 2010.

Hey Rookie

Coach Banghart and her staff have brought in three newcomers as the Class of 2014. Joining the Tigers are local forward Kristen Helmstetter (Bridgewater, N.J./Bridgewater-Raritan), and guards Nicole Hung (Los Angeles, Calif./Harvard Westlake) and Alex Rodgers (Mouth of Wilson, Va./Oak Hill Academy). HoopGurlz ranked both Hung and Rodgers. Below are their ranks below in comparison to Niveen Rasheed who was ranked last season.

We Are The Champions

Princeton won the Ivy League in 2009-10, the program's eighth title. The team won five times in the 1970 and 80s prior to the NCAA Tournament. The Tigers earned a share of the title in 1999 and 2006 but lost the playoff game both years to Dartmouth. It marks the first time Princeton won the title outright since 1978.

Can They Go All The Way?

Princeton went undefeated in the Ivy League last season becoming one of six teams to go undefeated in Ivy League play. Harvard did so in 2002-03 and 96-97 and Penn was undefeated in 2000-01. Dartmouth went 7-0 in 1980-81, Yale

went 7-0 in 1979-80.

Going Dancing

Princeton made its first ever NCAA Tournament appearance in 2010. The team became a varsity sport in 1972 with the NCAA Tournament beginning a decade later in 1982. The Tigers fell to St. John's in the Tallahassee first round 65-47.

GAME #1

FDU 37 AT PRINCETON 78

PRINCETON, N.J. (11/13/10) - It was a banner night at Jadwin Gym for the Princeton women's basketball team as the Tigers defeated Fairleigh Dickinson 78-37 in the 2010-11 season opener.

Prior to the game the team unveiled its first NCAA Tournament banner after going 26-3 in 2009-10 and earning the Ivy League's automatic bid with a perfect 14-0 mark.

Princeton played all 13 members of the team with 12 players scoring. Three players were in double digits led by junior Devona Allgood's 20 points. She added seven rebounds, three blocks, three steals and one assist coming in 24 minutes of play. Sophomore Niveen Rasheed added 14 points, eight rebounds, four assists and one steal. Senior Addie Micir scored 12 points, hitting four three pointers and chipping in three assists, two steals and a rebound. Princeton shot 42.6 percent from the floor and missed just two of its 17 free throws.

Esther Wallace led the Knights with 13 points, while adding five rebounds and two blocks. Jasmrya Saunder had a team-best six rebounds and four steals while scoring five points. Mariyah Laury chipped in six points. As a team FDU shot 26 percent from the floor and 58.8 percent from the line.

The Tigers grabbed a 10-point lead, 19-9, at 12:48. During that time Allgood scored eight of those 19 points with Micir draining two of her four three pointers. Princeton continued to find the net scoring the next six points to make it 25-9 with a little more than nine minutes to play in the half.

The Knights were able to make it an 11-point game on three occasions including at the 1:55 mark of the first. However the Tigers would close out the first half on a 9-0 run to head into the locker room with a 39-20 lead.

Princeton's run wasn't over yet as the Tigers came out in the second and scored 17 straight points to go up 56-20 at 15:12.

A three-point basket by Alannah Driscoll-Sbar ended the drought for FDU at 12:58.

The Knights would only get within 30 points during the remainder of the game with came around the 10-minute mark. Back up by 36 points with 1:41 to play Princeton finished scoring the last seven points to wrap up the game 78-37.

Princeton will be on the road for the next five games first stopping off at Rutgers on Thursday, Nov. 18 for 7:30 p.m.

GAME #2

PRINCETON 53 AT RUTGERS 54

The banner of Hall-of-Fame coach Vivian Stringer looms over the court at the Lewis Brown Athletic Center, and the real-life version is still doing business on the home side bench. Clearly, this is not a place where visitors go home often with victories.

Two years ago to the day, after her team was a 48-point afterthought on this court, Courtney Banghart looked around and said that she'd back. She just didn't realize it would sting even more the second time around.

Khadijah Rushdan knocked down a jump shot with a 4.4 seconds left to give Rutgers a 54-53 win over Princeton in an early-season thriller in front of 2,518 at the RAC. Princeton rallied from 15 points back in the second half to take a lead down the stretch before Rushdan broke the Tigers' hearts.

The loss was Princeton's 14th straight to the Scarlet Knights, with the last Princeton win back in 1978. Rutgers improved to 104-16 in the last nine seasons at home.

Among those 104 wins was an 83-35 win over Princeton exactly two years ago.

That loss two years ago left Banghart at 8-24 in her young coaching career. Since then, she is 40-7, and her team is 22-2 since a 10-point loss to the Scarlet Knights a year ago, when she led Princeton to a 14-0 Ivy record and the first NCAA tournament bid in school history.

This year, Princeton came in off a 41-point win over FDU in its opener, while Rutgers lost to California by nine and No. 2 Stanford by 13 to open its season.

Rutgers led 35-22 at the half and 39-24 with 18 minutes to go before Princeton turned its game up on both ends. It took four minutes to get the lead under double digits and then just three more for Princeton to get its first lead at 42-41.

It would go back-and-forth from there with eight lead changes down the stretch, and Princeton would take a 53-52 lead on the seventh of those, when Lauren Edwards scored with 1:13 left.

The Tigers would get a stop after that, but the final sequence was set up when Niveen Rasheed's jumper hit the rim and bounded to the floor, where a mad scramble ensued. A held ball would have favored Princeton at that point, but the officials ruled that Chelsey Lee of Rutgers had possession and had called for a timeout before the ball was tied up.

As a result, the Knights had a chance to win the game, and Rushdan took full advantage, swishing a mid-range shot with 4.4 to play. Princeton was unable to get a shot off after that before the horn.

Rasheed led Princeton with 14 points and added seven rebounds, while Edwards and Addie Micir had 11 each. Devona Allgood had eight points and eight rebounds, and Kate Miller came off the bench to spark the comeback with seven points while drawing two key charges.

Rushdan led RU with 13. Rutgers shot 52% for the first half while making 4 of 5 three-pointers, but Princeton held the Knights to 23% shooting and 0 for 4 on three-pointers in the second half.

Princeton shot 32% in the first half and 45% in the second half, but the Tigers came away with 12 offensive rebounds and nine second-chance points after intermission.

Rutgers now leads the series with the Tigers either 15-1 or 15-3, depending on whether two early 1970s games against Douglass are counted. There is no disputing the current series streak, which now stands at 14 for the Scarlet Knights.

Of those 14 runs, six have been by at least 20 points and four have been by at least 40. The Scarlet Knights scored 110 against Princeton a year after the last Tiger win and 116 the year after that.

Those games - like the 48-point RU win two years ago - are just numbers in the record book now.

The one-point loss this time around stings, but it does show how far the Tigers have come in a short time.

GAME #3

PRINCETON 69 AT LEHIGH 52

BETHLEHEM, Pa. (11/21/10) - Lehigh's 33-game home winning streak is over. The Princeton women's basketball team delivered the Mountain Hawks their first loss at Stabler Arena since the 2007-08 season with a 69-52 game.

Four players were in double digits, led by sophomore Niveen Rasheed's first double-double of the season with 13 points and 10 rebounds. She added four steals and four assists. Juniors Devona Allgood and Laura Johnson and senior Addie Micir had 12 points apiece. Allgood added six rebounds, four steals, three assists and two blocks. Sophomore Lauren Polansky chipped in six rebounds, two steals and two points, junior Lauren Edwards had nine points, six rebounds and three assists.

Princeton took a seven-point lead 9-2 five minutes into the game, but an 8-0 Lehigh run over the next two minutes gave the Mountain Hawks a one-point lead, 10-9.

The teams would exchange leads five times over the next six minutes before a Laura Johnson three-pointer at 7:31 gave Princeton a two-point lead it wouldn't relinquish, sending the Tigers on a 20-5 run over the next five minutes.

Down by 14, 38-24, Lehigh would shoot 4-for-4 from the line and wasn't allowed a field goal for the final 3:41, to close out the half with a 10-point deficit on its home court.

The Tigers continued to build on their lead with freshman Nicole Hung giving Princeton a 20-point edge on a jumper at 7:34. Lehigh went on an 8-0 run over the next 1:23 to get within 14, 61-47, with just under six minutes to play. It would be as close as the Mountain Hawks would get as Princeton would close out the half on an 8-5 run for the 69-52 final score.

Of Lehigh's nine baskets from the field in the second half, five were three-pointers.

The Hun School product Emily Gratch paced the Mountain Hawks with 14 points, shooting a perfect 5-for-5 from the field. She added three steals and three blocks. Leading scorer Erica Prosser added 11 points, five rebounds and a team-high seven assists. Leading the team under the basket was Courtney Dentler who pulled down seven boards, while adding seven points and a team-best three blocks. Lehigh shot 41.3 percent from the floor (19-46), 60 percent from the line and 36.4 percent from behind the arc.

Princeton shot 43.3 percent from the floor (29-67), 50 percent from long range and 44.4 percent from the free-throw line. The Tigers outrebounded the opponent 43-28.

The Tigers improve to 2-1 on the season and will play in the Vanderbilt Tournament over Thanksgiving break to continue their five-game road swing. First up Princeton will meet with USC on Friday, Nov. 26 at 7 p.m.

GAME #7 RIDER 45 AT PRINCETON 87

PRINCETON, N.J. (12/5/10) - Sophomore Niveen Rasheed scored a season-high 22 points to lead the Princeton women's basketball team to an 87-45 win over Rider on Sunday, Dec. 5.

Princeton grabbed an 8-0 lead to start the game, prompting Rider to call a timeout. Bopp gave her team its first basket at 16:43 before Princeton's Lauren Polansky drained a three. The teams would trade baskets to make it 15-6 at 13:46 before Princeton went on a 9-3 run to take a 17-point lead, 28-11, with 7:11 remaining. Five minutes later a three pointer by Nicole Hung gave Princeton a 22-point lead. Rider had a 5-0 run over the next two minutes, but another three by Hung at 1:28 pushed the Tigers out ahead by 20+ points once again. Princeton would take a 20-point lead, 42-22, into the locker room.

The Tigers were unstopable in the second half, opening up with a 12-0 run to make it a 54-22 game at 16:06.

A basket by Alicia Hall at 14:13 brought her team within 30 but it would be as close as it would get as Princeton pushed its lead to as much as 42 to end the game, 87-45.

Junior post Devona Algood was second on the team in scoring with 12 points, while adding seven rebounds. Junior guard Laura Johnson had 10 points, five rebounds, two steals, two assists and one block. Junior forward Lauren Edwards led the team under the basket with eight rebounds, while freshman guard Alex Rodgers had six.

As a team Princeton had 21 assists on 34 baskets, to go along with nine steals and six blocks. The Tigers had 49 rebounds to Rider's 33.

GAME #8 NAVY 61 AT PRINCETON 74

PRINCETON, N.J. (12/10/10) - The Princeton women's basketball team shot 61.5 percent in the first half, but led Navy by just three at halftime. It was only a matter of time before the Tigers would start to pull away and a strong defensive showing in the second half led to a 74-61 victory.

Coincidentally, the last time Princeton shot that well in a half was November 2009 when the Tigers earned a 77-45 win over another Patriot League team, American. Despite the sharp shooting, Princeton struggled defensively against Navy, as the Mids hit six three-pointers in the first half and was 57.7 percent from the floor overall.

Princeton would hold Navy to 28.1 percent (9-for-32) shooting in the second half and gave up just one three-pointer.

Princeton jumped out to a 10-4 lead three minutes into the game and reached a nine-point advantage at 12:44. Navy went on a 7-0 run to make it a two-point game on a three-pointer by Cassie Consedine at 8:39.

Two minutes later Princeton had a 29-24 lead before Navy went on a 10-2 run to turn the tide and give the Mids a 34-31 lead with 3:01 to play in the first half.

A pair of free throws by Niveen Rasheed put Princeton back within one, 34-33. On the other end Angela Myers shot 1-for-2 from the line. Rasheed would get the rebound on the missed opportunity and ran down for a layup to tie the game 35-35 at 2:14.

Devona Algood would score back-to-back buckets and Lauren Edwards had a fast break basket to give Princeton a 41-35 lead. Myers would drain her third three of the half at the buzzer to set the halftime score at 41-38.

A basket by Consedine started the second half and made it a 41-40 game, but Rasheed scored two from the line and Edwards added a layup to give Princeton a 45-40 lead. The teams would trade baskets over the next five minutes to make it 49-44.

A layup by Audrey Bauer at 14:38 would be Navy's last basket for the next 8:41, as Princeton held Navy scoreless from the field and took off. The Tigers went on a 16-2 run to build a 17-point lead, 65-48.

Consedine ended the drought for the Mids at 5:52 but the Tigers continued to attack to go ahead by as much as 20 on a three by Krystal Hill at 2:15.

Navy would answer back with a three, and Aili Membrano would score the game's last four points.

Myers led Navy with 21 points and eight rebounds. She dished out four assists and had two steals. Consedine added 14 points and Membrano had 11 off the bench and earned six rebounds. Jade Geif would finish with eight points and seven boards. Navy concluded the game shooting 41.4 percent overall, 60 percent from the line and 38.9 percent from long range.

Pacing the Tigers was Rasheed with 21 points, six rebounds, four steals and four assists. Algood was also in double figures with 14 points and led the team on the glass with eight rebounds. Edwards chipped in 13 points, four rebounds and three assists. Senior Addie Micir and Hill would each contribute nine points. The Tigers shot a clip of 52.6 percent, shot 45.5 percent from behind the arc and was 9-for-12 from the free-throw line.

Navy falls to 5-5 overall, while Princeton improves to 6-2 overall and extends its home win streak to 12.

GAME #9 LAFAYETTE 58 AT PRINCETON 90

PRINCETON, N.J. (12/13/10) - Sophomore Niveen Rasheed scored a career-high 28 points, scoring 22 in the first half alone to lead the Princeton women's basketball team to a 90-58 win over Lafayette on Monday, Dec. 13.

Rasheed's 28 points is the most points scored in a game since Becky Brown had 28 against Penn on Jan. 7, 2006. In addition, her 22 first-half points is the most since Meagan Cowher had 22 in the first half against Columbia on Jan. 13, 2006.

It was the second straight game that the Tigers shot over 50 percent, as Princeton shot 53.6 percent from the field. Rasheed herself shot 11-for-15.

A third of Princeton's points came from the bench, while more than a third came off of Lafayette turnovers, 39 in fact.

In the first half, Lafayette had 11 of its 27 points come via free throws, as the Leopards went 11-for-13 from the line. The sharp free-throw shooting was clutch as Princeton held Lafayette scoreless from the field for more than seven minutes. The Leopards would hit seven free throws during that span.

Princeton began the game on a 17-2 run, with junior Devona Algood scoring eight of those 17 points. Lafayette was able to cut the lead back to nine, on a 10-4 run at 10:30.

Sophomore Kate Miller and Algood each scored to take a 13-point lead, 25-12. After Lauren Jackson's layup at 8:35, the Leopards would go cold on the court, not getting another bucket until 1:27. During that span Princeton would go on a 20-9 run with Rasheed scoring nine straight points for the Tigers who held a 47-25.

Rasheed wasn't done yet as she closed out the half scoring five more points to give the Tigers a 52-27 lead at halftime.

The Tigers continued to expand on their lead, taking their largest lead at 11:20, a 38-point advantage.

Algood finished the night with 14 points, six rebounds, three steals, one block and one assist. Junior Lauren Edwards added 10 points. Sophomore Lauren Polansky led the team in steals and assists with six apiece, while scoring two and pulling down five boards. Senior Krystal Hill scored seven points and pulled off the prettiest play on Carril Court, with a trick behind the back bounce pass to Rasheed for a lay-in.

Princeton had a 33-29 rebounding advantage, holding the Leopards to just seven offensive boards, all of which came in the second half.

LaKeisha Wright paced the Leopards with 15 points, while Danielle Fiacco had 10 points and led the team on the glass with eight rebounds. Elizabeth Virgin also contributed 10 points, while Lauren Jackson had nine. Overall, Lafayette shot 42.9 percent, 79.2 percent from the free-throw line and 30 percent from long range.

The Leopards drop to 5-6 on the season while Princeton improves to 7-2 overall and extends its home win streak to 13.

GAME #10 DREXEL 64 AT PRINCETON 52

PRINCETON, N.J. (12/17/10) - Trailing for the first time at home this season, the Princeton women's basketball team rallied to defeat Drexel 64-52 on Friday, Dec. 17 at Jadwin Gym. The win extends the Tigers win streak at home to 13, as Princeton completes 2010 with a perfect home court record.

Drexel held Princeton scoreless for 10:58, had four-point lead and forced Princeton's top player Niveen Rasheed into five fouls after playing 16 minutes. All had the workings of an upset. However, the Tigers rallied and found what they had to do to win.

Drexel had five turnovers in the first five minutes giving Princeton a 10-5 lead by the first media timeout at 14:31. Sharp three-point shooting by Jasmina Rosseel during a Drexel 10-4 run would help her team the lead.

The Tigers scored the next 10 points and made it a nine-point game, 24-15, at 8:12. However, a three by junior Laura Johnson at 9:21 would be Princeton's final basket from the field until 18:23 of the second half. Scoreless for 10:58, Princeton shot 0-for-11 during that stretch, while Drexel would score 10 points to take a 25-24 lead into the locker room.

Four minutes into the second half, Drexel reached its largest lead of the game, a four-point differential and had forced Rasheed into her third and fourth fouls and she took a seat on the bench.

The teams would trade buckets as Princeton couldn't yet find who would be its offensive spark. Hoping it would be Rasheed, she went back into the game and 10 seconds later would hit two free throws at 12:56 to get Princeton within one 33-32. Forty seconds later, Rasheed would foul out of the game, her first career disqualification.

That seemed to be the ignite the Princeton squad as the Tigers would take the lead three minutes later and wouldn't let go.

After Kamile Nacikaita drained a three, Princeton attacked and went on an 8-0. A three-pointer by Edwards at 9:07 would give the Tigers back the lead and Micir would drop in a jumper to make it a 40-35 with 8:25 left on the clock.

Drexel would score a string of free throws, five in fact, to tie the game up 40-40 at 6:32.

Devona Allgood and Edwards would each score points in the paint to help Princeton go up by four, 44-40 with a little more than five minutes left.

Nacikaita would go 2-for-2 from the line to get the Dragons within two, but it would be as close as they would get in the final minutes.

Micir and Edwards scored back-to-back three-pointers to make it an eight-point game. Another string of Drexel free throws, made it a four-point game, before Princeton went on a 8-2 run over the next three minutes to take its largest lead of the game, 58-48 with 53 seconds remaining on the clock.

Micir would go to the line six times in the final 45 seconds, as the Dragons purposefully fouled her twice to get possession. Entering the game shooting 100 percent from the foul line, Micir went 6-for-6 from the line to give the Tigers the 64-52 win.

Edwards had 17 points, five rebounds, five assists, two blocks and one steal. Micir was the leading scorer for Princeton with 18 points and had a team-high six rebounds. Allgood would also grab six boards and had 12 points. Princeton shot 44 percent from the field, 80 percent from the free-throw line and 44.4 percent from long range.

Nacikaita paced the Dragons with a double-double of 17 points and 10 rebounds. Rosseel had 11 points, four rebounds and two assists. The Dragons, who played just seven players, shot 35.6 percent overall, 40 percent from long range and 77.8 percent from the foul line.

Drexel falls to 6-2 on the season, while Princeton improves to 8-2.

Princeton will be back in action on Sunday, Dec. 19 when it travels to Philadelphia to take on St. Joseph's at 2 p.m.

GAME #11 PRINCETON 61 AT ST. JOE'S 70

PRINCETON, N.J. (12/17/10) - St. Joseph's snapped Princeton's five-game win streak as Michelle Baker scored a career-high 28 points to lead her team to a 70-61 double-overtime victory over Princeton in women's basketball on Sunday, Dec. 19 at Hagan Arena.

The story of the game was free throws. It's what won the game for the Hawks and what kept the Tigers from earning their ninth win of the season. Princeton shot 5 for 13 (38.5 percent) from the line, going 3 for 10 during regulation. Normally, the Tigers are a sharp free-throw shooting team, the second in the league at 76.3 percent. St. Joe's would score the game's last eight points from the foul line, shooting 8 for 8 to win the game.

St. Joseph's would hold the lead for nearly the entire first half with Princeton finally getting the go-ahead with 19 seconds to play, 26-24, on a basket by Lauren Edwards.

St. Joe's grabbed a 6-2 lead to start the game, getting all six points off of turnovers. Princeton committed five in the first five minutes. The Hawks continued to expand their lead working their way to a 10-point edge, 19-9 at 9:01. Baker led the way, scoring five of St. Joseph's 11.

A basket by Edwards sparked an 8-0 run by the Tigers. Kate Miller hit a three from the top of the key and Edwards would drain one from the left wing to get her team within two, 19-17 at 6:43.

Erin Shields hit a three-pointer for the Hawks before Devona Allgood scored her first of the game with a hook shot. Katie Kuester answered with a jumper to keep St. Joseph's ahead by five, 24-19 with 5:20 to play.

A steal by Edwards was converted into a three by Laura Johnson, and a steal and fast break by Niveen Rasheed resulted in her own basket to tie the game at 24 with 1:47 on the clock.

On the next run down the court, Rasheed blocked Ashley Primm's shot to get the Tigers possession and Edwards would hit a jumper to give Princeton its first lead since 19:01, 26-24, with 19 seconds to play.

Baker would sink her fourth basket to start the second half, to tie the game at 26, but Princeton would work its way up to a 10-point lead at 11:54 on a 14-4 run, with Micir scoring two from behind the arc during that time.

The lead would quickly be diminished as the Hawks answered with a 12-3 run to make it a one-point game, 43-42 with a little less than five minutes to play. Baker would score seven of her team's 12 points during the run.

Edwards tried to keep the lead strong with a jumper before the team's traded baskets.

Two fouls on Princeton led to St. Joe's getting the lead back for the first time since the first half, as Baker and Primm both shot 2-for-2 from the line to take a 48-47 lead.

Allgood would add a basket to retake a one-point lead and Rasheed would hit two free throws for a 51-48 lead with 1:03 to play. Baker wouldn't go away converting a three-point play to even the game with 51 seconds left.

Rasheed was fouled with 32.1 seconds left by Cavallo but Rasheed couldn't convert on the basket and St. Joe's got the defensive board to hang on for the last shot. The shot was long and Rasheed got the rebound and launched the ball from three-quarter court to send the game into overtime.

Rasheed and Micir gave Princeton a four-point lead in the first overtime, but the Hawks answered with two to tie it. With 15 seconds left, Micir took a shot that was partially blocked and a rebound was picked up by Kuester, who clearly didn't know how much time was on the clock as she launched a ball from midcourt that hit the rim for overtime two.

Tied 59-59 with 3:20 to play in the second overtime, Kuester hit two free throws to give the Hawks a 1-59 lead. A minute later one of the strangest things occurred. Allgood picked up her fifth foul on a shot by Prim. The officials sent Kuester to the line and she made one, before the officials realized it should be Prim shooting. After a discussion with both coaches and each other, the officials took the point off and gave Prim two shots. She made the first, missed the second. Rasheed got the defensive board and ran down to score to make it 62-61 game. For the final 1:13 the only points scored would be the eight from the St. Joe's foul line, as the Hawks improve to 49-1 over Ivy League teams.

Rasheed had a double-double with 18 points and 11 rebounds, as well as four assists, three steals and one block. Edwards had 15 points on 7-for-9 shooting and six rebounds. Allgood added 10 points and eight boards. Polansky led the team in assists with five. Princeton shot 35.2 (25-71) percent from the floor, 30 percent from three-point range.

Baker added seven rebounds, four assists in addition to her 29 points. Kuester had 11 points and Van Grinsven has 10 points and seven rebounds. Kelly Cavallo led the team on the glass with nine rebounds. The Hawks shot 43.1 (25-58) percent from the floor, 78.3 (18-23) percent from the foul line and 18.2 (2-11) percent from long range.

The Hawks move to 7-3 on the season, while the Tigers fall to 8-3 playing their first OT game since 2008. Princeton is now 7-10 when going into extra time.

GAME #13 PRINCETON 71 AT WAKE FOREST 63

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. (12/31/10) - Junior Lauren Edwards scored a season-high 21 points and matched her career-best of four three pointers in a game, to lead the Princeton women's basketball team to a 71-63 win over Wake Forest on New Year's Eve day at Joel Coliseum.

It marks Princeton first win over an ACC team since 1989 when the Tigers defeated North Carolina.

Senior Addie Micir added 15 points, and is now three away from 1,000 career points. Micir led the team on the glass with six rebounds, and had a team-best five assists. She also led the team in assists with five and had two steals. Junior Laura Johnson and sophomore Meg Bowen each added nine points.

Princeton had a different lineup for the second straight game, as the Tigers were without the league's leading scorer Niveen Rasheed. Rasheed suffered a knee injury in the Davidson game and will be evaluated by Princeton doctors upon return to the Garden State.

Wake Forest doubled the post, limiting points for center Devona Allgood and her fellow Tigers in the paint, however it left the wings wide open for three-point opportunities. Princeton shot 50 percent from long range (11-22), sinking nine in the first half. Allgood would pick up eight points and would get into foul trouble early in the second half.

The lead would change hands five hands in the first four minutes of the game. The Demon Deacons would go on a 6-0 run in a span of 1:35 to take a 10-5 lead at 14:14. The Tigers responded with their own 6-0 run to regain the lead, 11-10, on a three from sophomore Kate Miller at the top of the key, the Tigers' third of the half.

A three by Brittany Waters put Wake Forest back up by two but an old-fashioned three-point play by Bowen put Princeton back on top by one, 14-13 at 10:40.

Wake capitalized on Princeton turnovers getting 10 of 13 points off of the Tigers' eight turnovers midway through the first half.

Princeton would work its way up to a nine-point lead, 26-17, with Edwards, Johnson and Lauren Polansky all draining buckets from long range - Edwards getting two with a little more than five to play in the half.

A minute later Micir made it a 10-point game after getting fouled by Brooke Thomas taking a three, and making all three from the foul line.

The Deacons would cut the lead back to three, 29-26, with 2:20 to play, getting all three baskets off of Princeton turnovers at midcourt.

Princeton would respond on an 8-1 run, with Edwards hitting two more threes and Bowen knocking in a layup to take a 10-point edge once again, 37-27 with 33 seconds left.

Jaymee Carnes would drill a three from the top of the key with 24 seconds to play to make it a seven-point game, 37-30 at halftime.

Despite the 16 turnovers in the first half, Princeton shot 60 percent (12-20) and was 9-for-13 from long range, and 4-for-4 from the line.

Wake Forest started the second half on a 6-2 run to cut the lead back to three, 39-36. Bowen kept the Tigers in the game getting two in the paint to keep Princeton in the lead by five. A three by Micir pushed the lead back out to eight, 46-38 at 16:18.

The Deacons would take the lead, 49-48, at 10:42 on a 9-0 run, with Waters scoring the first five points.

Princeton couldn't get it going on offense, shooting 1-for-7 from behind the arc to this point in the second half.

Allgood would end Princeton's nearly six-minute scoring drought with a layup at 9:21, and Johnson would follow up with her third long ball of the afternoon, matching her season best from outside the circle to give Princeton a 53-49 edge.

Six minutes later, at 3:27, the Tigers retained the four-point lead. It would be a free-throw clinic the remainder of the game. Princeton collected the next four points to take back the eight-point game, 62-54. Micir would get the Tigers back out ahead hitting four straight free throws, to make it a 68-58 game with 28 seconds to play. Secily Ray would hit a jumper to make it 68-60 with 20 ticks left, and the Tigers would keep that lead to end the game, 71-63.

The Deacons were led by Brittany Waters who had 11 points on the afternoon, while Asia Williams recorded a double-double with 10 points and 12 rebounds. Mykala Walker, Brooke Thomas had 10 points apiece. Thomas would lead her team in assists, dishing out five, and had the lone block on the team. Wake Forest shot 50.9 percent from the floor, 35.7 percent from behind the arc and 44.4 percent from the line. The squad falls to 7-7 on the season.

Princeton shot 47.7 percent from the field and 27 percent from the charity stripe (18-25).

GAME #14 LA SALLE 51 AT PRINCETON 94

PRINCETON, N.J. (1/14/11) - Senior Addie Micir scored her 1,000th career point and led her Princeton women's basketball team to a 94-51 win over La Salle on Tuesday, Jan. 4 at Jadwin Gym.

Micir became the 18th women's basketball player in Princeton history to reach 1,000 points for her career. Micir joined the 1,000 Point Club on her first shot the game, hitting her 38th three-point basket of the season. She finished the game with 17 points, four rebounds, three assist, two steals and one block.

Junior Devona Allgood had 15 points, six rebounds, a block and a steal. Classmate Laura Johnson added a season-high 12 points and a game-high five steals and freshman Nicole Hung dropped in 10 points. Freshman Alex Rodgers matched Allgood in rebounds with six and added eight points, five assists and one steal. Sophomore Megan Bowen matched her career-high in points with nine.

As a team Princeton shot 54.7 percent (35-64), the third time the Tigers have finished a game shooting over 50 percent this season. From the foul line, Princeton hit 12-of-18, and was 52.2 percent from behind the arc, making 12-of-23.

Princeton quickly jumped out to a 10-point lead, 14-4, at 14:59.

However La Salle made it a three-point game, 18-15, nearly five minutes later. Ebonee Jones and Jessi Kocik combined for 15 points on the 11-4 run. The Tigers quickly ended the Explorers' run on a 10-3 streak, with Lauren Edwards, Micir and Johnson all draining three-pointers and Lauren Polansky burying a layup to make it a 14-point game, 29-15, at 7:02.

Ashley Gale would score her team's next five points to make it an 11-point game but it would be the Explorers' last points of the half.

Hung went on a personal 7-0 run, shooting 2-for-2 from the free-throw line, hitting a jumper and a long ball to put the Tigers ahead by 18, 38-20. Her seven points in less than three minutes surpassed her personal best of six points in a game, as she finished with 10.

Johnson added a long jumper and Micir hit her third three of the half to send her team into the locker room with a 43-20 lead.

Princeton shot 50 percent (17-34) in the first half, the eighth time the team has shot over 50 percent in a half this season. La Salle hit just nine of its 34, for 26.5 percent shooting.

La Salle continued its offensive struggles in the second half. It would be held without a basket from the field for 9:37, spanning both halves. Jones would end the drought at 15:02, but Princeton had expanded on its lead, and was up 53-20.

Four minutes later Princeton had a 40-point edge, 65-25 on a three from the wing by Rodgers. Micir would follow up with two threes herself making it 44-point game.

The team's would go back-and-forth for the remainder of the game, with 18 points coming from the free-throw line and 28 from the floor.

The Tigers would take their largest lead of the game, and of the season, a 47-point advantage with 2:11 to play on a three ball from Rodgers, 94-47. La Salle would close out the game with the final two baskets.

Tonight's game marked Princeton's largest margin of victory over an opponent this season and the third time this season the Tigers have beaten a team by 40+ points. It is also the most points amassed in a game this season for the Tigers.

Gale led all players with 23 points on 6-for-20 shooting. She added seven rebounds, four steals and one block and one assist. Jones finished with 13 points, four rebounds, two assists, two steals and a block. Kocik picked up a double-double with 12 points and team-best 10 rebounds.

La Salle shot 28.6 percent overall, 80 percent from the line and 15.8 percent from long range. The Explorers fall to 4-10 on the season.

Princeton improves to 11-3 overall and opens up Ivy League play on Saturday, Jan. 8 hosting Penn at 6 p.m.

PROVIDENCE, R.I. (1/28/11) - Junior Devona Allgood recorded a double-double and senior Addie Micir scored 18 as the Princeton women's basketball team posted a 70-48 win over Brown on Friday, Jan. 28 at the Pizzitola Sports Center.

The game was the Tigers' first in 24 days, due to exams and semester break. Princeton improves to 13-3 overall and 2-0 in the Ivy League.

Micir hit a three on Princeton's first possession as the Tigers held control of the game from the opening tip. However it would be the long ball that would give Brown a 12-11 lead at 13:42. All 12 points came off of three-point baskets from Lindsay Steele, Hannah Passafiume and two from Lindsay Nickell.

Nickel would score 11 points to lead the Bears in scoring. Aileen Daniels and Passafiume had seven each, while Dixon added six and a team-high four steals. Daniels and Passafiume had five rebounds apiece. Brown shot 29.5 percent (18-61) overall, 30 percent from long range (6-20) and went 6-for-9 from the line. Brown falls to 4-13 overall and 0-3 in the league.

GAME #17 PRINCETON 52 AT YALE 37

NEW HAVEN, Conn. (1/29/11) - It was a second half surge with junior Lauren Edwards leading the charge as Princeton women's basket turned in a 52-37 win over Yale on Saturday, Jan. 29 at Lee Amphitheater. After scoring just one basket in the first half, Edwards would score nearly half of her team's second-half points with 15 of the Tigers' 32.

It was a back and forth affair in the first half that saw eight lead changes and two scoring ties, as Princeton struggled to find its rhythm on either end of the court.

Mady Gobrecht opened the game with a layup and would be the only Bulldog to swish the net, as she scored nine points in the first 5:26. Princeton would get its nine points from Lauren Polansky, Allgood and Edwards, as the team's stood tied at 9-9 at 13:24.

Micir finished with a game-high 18 points and led the team on the glass with seven rebounds. Allgood would add nine and six rebounds. Miller led the team in steals with three steals while Polansky dished out a team-high four assists. Princeton shot 47.8 percent overall, 54.5 percent from the line and 25 percent from long range.

Gobrecht paced the Bulldog offense with 13 points, a team-high six rebounds, three blocks and three assists. Messimer and Graf contributed seven points. Aarica West added five rebounds. The team shot 30.2 percent overall, 61.5 percent from the charity stripe and 16.7 percent from behind the arc.

Princeton improves to 14-3 overall and 3-0 in the Ivy League, while Yale drops to 7-10 overall with its first league loss of the season to fall to 3-1 in conference play.
