CAPITAL CITY CLASSIC

Princeton hosted the last two season-opening tournaments at the Liberty Hockey Invitational at the Prudential Center in Newark. The year the tournament moves closer to home, to the Sun National Bank Center in Trenton, and re-named the Capital City Classic. This year's tournament features Yale, Maine and UMass.

EYE ON THE TIGERS

Princeton begins its second season under the tutelage of Ron Fogarty and his coaching staff. The Tigers graduated six seniors, but brought in six newcomers to replace them, and have 21 letterwinners back for the 2015-16 season. Princeton returns its top three scorers from last year in senior Jonathan Liau, junior Ben Foster and senior co-captain Kyle Rankin. Liau had 14 points on four goals and 10 assists, while Foster and Rankin had 10 points apiece. Co-captain Mike Ambrosia will be looked at for major point production as well. Junior Colton Phinney will be the backbone on the opposite end of the ice. He has started in 47 games already as he enters his junior year. Last year he posted a .910 save percentage and a 3.08 goals against average.

SCOUTING THE BULLDOGS

Yale lost seven players to graduation and return 21 lettermen from a team that went 18-10-5 overall closing out the season at the NCAA Northeast Regional semifinal in a 3-2 overtime loss to Boston University. Finishing third in the ECAC, the Bulldogs lost their three-game ECAC quarterfinal series to Harvard. With eight seniors on this year's squad, Yale has experience and leadership. The team returns its top-eight scorers from last year which includes leading scorer junior Frankie DiChiara. He has 23 points on nine goals and 14 assists. Junior Mike Doherty had a team-best 12 goals and added nine assists for 21 points, while All-America Rob O'Gara (BOS) matched the 21 points to pace the blueliners in scoring. First-team All-America Alex Lyon led the nation in goals against average with a 1.62 and save percentage with a .939 and is back for his junior season.

THE PRINCETON/YALE SERIES

Princeton and Yale are meeting for the 253rd time on Friday. The rivalry began back on January 19, 1901 and has since gone to lead Yale to a 138-103-10 advantage in the series. The Bulldogs are on a seven-game unbeaten streak that includes six wins. Princeton's last win came during the 2012 ECAC first-round series, a series Yale went on to win two games to one. On neutral ice Princeton has an advantage winning 27 games for a 27-24-4 record.

SCOUTING THE BLACK BEARS

Maine enters the tournament looking for its first win of the season. The Black Bears are 0-2-3 since they started their season on Oct. 9 - earning three straight ties with Michigan State, North Dakota and Union and has since lost to Union and Quinnipiac in shutouts. All five games have been neutral site or road games. The 4-0 loss to Quinnipiac on Oct. 20 was the last countable opponent for Maine. The team did play an exhibition game at home on Oct. 23, falling 5-1 to New Brunswick. Junior Blaine Byron (PIT) has a goal and two assist for three points and defender Eric Schurhamer has three assists. Junior Brian Morgan has a team-best two goals in four games. Maine has experimented with three goaltenders this season. Freshman Rob McGovern started the twice and posted a .973 save percentage and a 0.93 GAA. Junior Matt Morris started three games and has a .912 save percentage and a 3.33 GAA. Sophomore Sean Romeo has limited playing time with 20 minutes - stopping all seven shots faced.

THE PRINCETON/MAINE SERIES

The last time these teams met it was under the palm trees of Estero, Florida at the Florida College Classic on Dec. 28, 2013. Maine won that game 4-0 and improved to 6-4-1 in the series with Princeton. Currently the series is even, 1-1-1, on neutral ice.

SCOUTING THE MINUTEMEN

UMass comes to Trenton with a 3-0-1 record and is second in the nation in scoring offense, as it averages 5.25 goals per game. Sophomore Dennis Kravchenko leads the nation points per game, with 2.50, with five goals and five assists for 10 points in four games. Freshman Austin Plevy adds eight points on four goals and four assists and senior Shane Walsh has four goals and three assists for seven points. The Minutemen have split goaltending duties between sophomore Henry Dill and freshman Nic Renyard. Dill is 2-0 with a 4.26 GAA and an .887 save percentage, while Renyard has a 2.00 GAA and a .946 save percentage.

THE PRINCETON/UMASS SERIES

Princeton and UMass have not played each other since 2005. The Tigers hold a one-game edge in the series, 5-4. The two schools have one common head coach Don Toot Cahoon. Toot was the head coach at Princeton from 1991-2000, before he left to coach UMass for the next 12 years, retiring in 2012.

O CAPTAIN! MY CAPTAIN!

Senior Kyle Rankin and Mike Ambrosia will be co-captains this season.

NEW GUYS

Princeton welcomes six freshmen as the Class of 2019. They are goalie Austin Shaw - the lone class member from the US, defender Josh Teves, and forwards Alex Riche, Spencer Kryczka, Max Véronneau and Ryan Kuffner.

BIGGER IS BETTER

Princeton is the third biggest team by height in the NCAA, according to College Hockey Inc., The team has an average height of 6-0.93 - behind Cornell (6-1.55) and Western Michigan (6-1.15). Princeton is the sixth biggest team, by weight - weighing an average 193.15. Western Michigan is the largest at 200.63 lbs.

OPEN SESAME

Princeton owns a 61-44-7 record on opening day. The Tigers tied Yale in last year's opener 2-2 at the Liberty Hockey Invitational at the Prudential Center. Princeton and Yale have been each others season opener six times resulting in a 2-2-2 record.

IT'S ABOUT TIME

Ivy League rules mandate that men's hockey teams can play regular season games beginning on Oct. 30. Friday's game will take place 27 days after the first regular season game of the season was played on Oct. 3.

TAKE A BREAK

It's been a hectic week for the Tigers as Princeton is in mid-term test week. Exams began on Monday and conclude on Friday. Fall recess begins on Saturday, Oct. 31. Classes resume Nov. 9.

HOW IT ENDED

Princeton finished the 2014-15 season with a 4-23-3 overall record and was 2-18-2 in the ECAC and 1-8-1 in the Ivies.

POLL POSITION

Princeton was picked to finish 12th in both the ECAC Hockey Preseason Coaches poll and the media poll. The Tigers finished 12th last year.

AHEAD BY A CENTURY

This is the 112th season of varsity hockey at Princeton. Princeton is the fourth-oldest hockey program in the country. The first game was played on Nov. 30, 1900 against the Drisler School. Princeton did not compete for one year in WWI and two years during WWII.

STAND UP

Last year six of Princeton's 14 home games were standing-room only crowds. The highest home attendance this season was against RPI on Jan. 10, with 2,263.

Condon made his debut on Oct. 11 with a win at Ottawa and is now 2-0 on the season with a 1.50 GAA and a .947 save percentage for the Canadiens, who had a record start at 9-0.

Head Coach Ron Fogarty



Ron Fogarty, who leads all active NCAA coaches in win percentage, was named the head men's hockey coach at Princeton in June 2014.

Fogarty spent seven seasons as head coach at NCAA Division III Adrian College (Adrian, Mich.). He began the program at Adrian and grew it into a powerhouse.

In seven years, he posted a 167-23-10 record. The Bulldogs have competed in the NCAA tournament four times in the last five years and was the national runner-up in 2010-11, losing 4-3 in the national championship game. The Bulldogs won six regular-season titles competing in the Northern College Hockey Association (formerly Midwest Collegiate Hockey Association), and won five Harris Cup playoff championships.

Fogarty led the Bulldogs to unprecedented success as they set an NCAA single-season record for wins by a first-year program at 26-3 in 2007-08. Fogarty's success at Adrian continued, as the program became the fastest hockey program to reach the NCAA tournament and 100 wins. To his credit, Fogarty was named the MCHA Coach of the Year three times and was a four-time finalist for national coach of the year. Academically, the Bulldogs had a combined team GPA of 3.00 or greater in all seven years.

A 1995 graduate of Colgate University, Fogarty is no stranger to the ECAC. As a four-year right winger on the hockey team, he was named to the 1992 ECAC All-Rookie Team, and was a member of Raiders first three seasons under Don Vaughan. As a senior captain at Colgate in 1995, he helped Vaughan to his first 20-win season while earning the Coaches Award and the Terry Slater Award. After playing in the ECAC All-Star game following the completion of his senior season, Fogarty left Colgate ranked 20th on the all-time scoring list with 141 points.

Fogarty's coaching career began shortly thereafter, staying on at Colgate as an assistant coach for three years (1996-99). In 1999, he joined the hockey staff at Clarkson and remained with the Green & Gold through the end of the 2001-02 season. From 2002-06 Fogarty was an assistant coach at Bowling Green. In all, Fogarty coached and/or recruited four Hobey Baker finalists, three All-Americans, eight conference all-stars, four all-rookie selections and nine NHL players.

His professional hockey experience started with the Toledo Storm (ECHL) in 1995 and led to a stint with the Memphis River Kings (CHL) in 1995-96.

Historic Hobey Baker Rink



The spirit of Hobey Baker lives on in the rink bearing his name. Some nine decades ago, in December 1921, it was announced that Princeton would build a hockey rink and name it after its greatest athletic hero, Hobart A.H. Baker '14.

Baker Rink is the second-oldest arena still in use in collegiate hockey.

There have been numerous improvements to the rink, the biggest in the 1980s that added locker rooms, equipment rooms and scoreboard. More major improvements came in the early 2000s when the lobby was upgraded at the north end to include trophy cases and photo montages to the history and tradition of hockey at Princeton. In the northwest corner of the lobby are trophy cases honoring both Hobey Baker and Patty Kazmaier. In 2010, in the southwest corner of the lobby, the Ken Scasserra Friends Room was dedicated. The room, which looks out onto the ice surface provides both teams with a place to meet and entertain perspective student-athletes and alumni.

The dasher boards at Baker Rink were replaced in the summer of 2010 and the facility has a modern ice plant and dehumidification system.

The varsity hallway lies under the east side of the building and features the Princeton locker rooms, equipment room, bike room, athletic training room, coaches rooms and a new kitchenette. Added in 2013, the kitchenette has a plus-size refrigerator, multiple blenders, microwaves and a coffee machine to keep the Tiger fueled throughout the year.

Last year the men's team converted its locker room space and now the players are met with individual dry stalls upon entering the locker room.

New graphics have been added to the hallway in the last few years as the tradition of Princeton hockey continues to build

More upgrades continue as the former weight room is being converted into a player lounge and video room.
