EYE ON THE TIGERS

Princeton is 1-1 on the season after last weekend's Capital City Classic opened the fresh season. The Tigers fell to Yale 3-1 in Game 1 and rebounded with a 3-1 win over Maine in the consolation game. Princeton and Yale were tied for all but four minutes of the game, before the go-ahead goal at 16:56 of the third followed by an empty-net tally. Against Maine, Princeton grabbed a 2-0 lead with goals 3:13 apart in the second and added an empty-netter to seal the victory. Princeton had 10 players record a single point during the weekend, with four different goal scorers, including senior Kyle Rankin, junior Ben Foster and sophomores Eric Robinson and Joe Grabowski. Junior Colton Phinney made 79 saves and has a .963 save percentage - fourth best in the league - and a 1.51 goals against average.

SCOUTING THE BIG RED

Cornell is 2-0 after a sweep of Niagara in a home-and-home series last weekend. The Big Red pulled out a 3-2 overtime game on the road before a 4-0 shutout at Lynah. Junior Jeff Kubiak has scored twice and adds one assist, while Anthony Angello (PIT) has two helpers and a goal to match Kubiak's three points. Freshman Mitch Vanderlaan and three defenders: Holden Anderson, Ryan Bliss and Alec McCrea all have two points. Junior Mitch Gillam played both games in goal and has a 0.99 GAA, the best goals against in the league, and a .955 save percentage.

THE PRINCETON/CORNELL SERIES

Princeton and Cornell split the series last year with each team winning on its home ice. In the all-time history its Cornell that leads, 84-54-8. Senior Kyle Rankin leads the Tigers in scoring against Cornell with three points, including two goals at Lynah last year. Junior Colton Phinney has made 65 stops on 69 shots in the series.

SCOUTING THE RAIDERS

Playing in the first college hockey game of the year, over one month ago on October 3, the Raiders have a five more games under their belts. Colgate is 3-4 overall and most recently dropped two games to reigning national champion Providence at home. The Brothers Spink lead the team in scoring with Tyson scoring a team-high six assists and adding three goals for nine points. Tylor has three goals and four assists for seven pints. Seniors Mike Borkowski and Darcy Murphy along with sophomore Mike Panowyk each have six points. Borkowski has scored the most goals on the team with five, while all of Panowyk's points have come from assists. Junior Charlie Finn owns every decision and has started in six games. He has a .900 save percentage and a 3.58 GAA. Sophomore Zac Hamilton has spent 42 minutes in goal.

THE PRINCETON/COLGATE SERIES

Colgate has won the last four meetings in the series and leads it 52-46-6 since it began in 1935. Senior Mike Ambrosia has two goals and two assists in the series to pace the Tigers in the series. Phinney has made 137 saves for .907 save percentage.

LET'S MAKE SOME CONNECTIONS

Princeton head coach Ron Fogarty and assistant coach Brad Dexter are both Colgate grads and played together in Hamilton. Dexter was the assistant coach at Colgate for nine years under Don Vaughn before coming to Princeton last year. Colgate's associate athletic director, Yariv Amir returned to his alma mater this summer after 13 years at Princeton. He was the Princeton hockey SID for nine of those years. Current Princeton hockey SID, Kristy McNeil came to Princeton in 2008 after three years in the athletics communications office at Colgate.

NEW GUYS

Princeton welcomes six freshmen as the Class of 2019. They are goalie Austin Shaw - the lone class member from the US, defender Josh Teves, and forwards Alex Riche, Spencer Kryczka, Max Véronneau and Ryan Kuffner.

BIGGER IS BETTER

Princeton is the third biggest team by height in the NCAA, according to College Hockey Inc., The team has an average height of 6-0.93 - behind Cornell (6-1.55) and Western Michigan (6-1.15). Princeton is the sixth biggest team, by weight - weighing an average 193.15. Western Michigan is the largest at 200.63 lbs.

OPEN SESAME

Princeton owns a 61-45-7 record on opening day. The Tigers lost a 3-1 game to Yale in this year's opener at the Capital City Classic. Princeton and Yale have been each others season opener seven times resulting with Yale breaking the statement this year to lead 3-2-2.

IT'S ABOUT TIME

Ivy League rules mandate that men's hockey teams can play regular season games beginning on Oct. 30. Friday's game will take place 27 days after the first regular season game of the season was played on Oct. 3.

TAKE A BREAK

Princeton University is in the middle of fall break this week. It was mid-terms week last week for the Tigers, during their season opener. Classes will resume on Nov. 9.

HOW IT ENDED

Princeton finished the 2014-15 season with a 4-23-3 overall record and was 2-18-2 in the ECAC and 1-8-1 in the Ivies.

POLL POSITION

Princeton was picked to finish 12th in both the ECAC Hockey Preseason Coaches poll and the media poll. The Tigers finished 12th last year.

AHEAD BY A CENTURY

This is the 112th season of varsity hockey at Princeton. Princeton is the fourth-oldest hockey program in the country. The first game was played on Nov. 30, 1900 against the Drisler School. Princeton did not compete for one year in WWI and two years during WWII.

STAND UP

Last year six of Princeton's 14 home games were standing-room only crowds. The highest home attendance this season was against RPI on Jan. 10, with 2,263.

Condon made his debut on Oct. 11 with a win at Ottawa and is now 4-0-1 on the season with a 1.60 GAA and a .941 save percentage for the Canadiens, who had a record start at 9-0 and lead the division at 11-2-1.

Head Coach Ron Fogarty



Ron Fogarty, who leads all active NCAA coaches in win percentage, was named the head men's hockey coach at Princeton in June 2014.

Fogarty spent seven seasons as head coach at NCAA Division III Adrian College (Adrian, Mich.). He began the program at Adrian and grew it into a powerhouse.

In seven years, he posted a 167-23-10 record. The Bulldogs have competed in the NCAA tournament four times in the last five years and was the national runner-up in 2010-11, losing 4-3 in the national championship game. The Bulldogs won six regular-season titles competing in the Northern College Hockey Association (formerly Midwest Collegiate Hockey Association), and won five Harris Cup playoff championships.

Fogarty led the Bulldogs to unprecedented success as they set an NCAA single-season record for wins by a first-year program at 26-3 in 2007-08. Fogarty's success at Adrian continued, as the program became the fastest hockey program to reach the NCAA tournament and 100 wins. To his credit, Fogarty was named the MCHA Coach of the Year three times and was a four-time finalist for national coach of the year. Academically, the Bulldogs had a combined team GPA of 3.00 or greater in all seven years.

A 1995 graduate of Colgate University, Fogarty is no stranger to the ECAC. As a four-year right winger on the hockey team, he was named to the 1992 ECAC All-Rookie Team, and was a member of Raiders first three seasons under Don Vaughan. As a senior captain at Colgate in 1995, he helped Vaughan to his first 20-win season while earning the Coaches Award and the Terry Slater Award. After playing in the ECAC All-Star game following the completion of his senior season, Fogarty left Colgate ranked 20th on the all-time scoring list with 141 points.

Fogarty's coaching career began shortly thereafter, staying on at Colgate as an assistant coach for three years (1996-99). In 1999, he joined the hockey staff at Clarkson and remained with the Green & Gold through the end of the 2001-02 season. From 2002-06 Fogarty was an assistant coach at Bowling Green. In all, Fogarty coached and/or recruited four Hobey Baker finalists, three All-Americans, eight conference all-stars, four all-rookie selections and nine NHL players.

His professional hockey experience started with the Toledo Storm (ECHL) in 1995 and led to a stint with the Memphis River Kings (CHL) in 1995-96.

Historic Hobey Baker Rink



The spirit of Hobey Baker lives on in the rink bearing his name. Some nine decades ago, in December 1921, it was announced that Princeton would build a hockey rink and name it after its greatest athletic hero, Hobart A.H. Baker '14.

Baker Rink is the second-oldest arena still in use in collegiate hockey.

There have been numerous improvements to the rink, the biggest in the 1980s that added locker rooms, equipment rooms and scoreboard. More major improvements came in the early 2000s when the lobby was upgraded at the north end to include trophy cases and photo montages to the history and tradition of hockey at Princeton. In the northwest corner of the lobby are trophy cases honoring both Hobey Baker and Patty Kazmaier. In 2010, in the southwest corner of the lobby, the Ken Scasserra Friends Room was dedicated. The room, which looks out onto the ice surface provides both teams with a place to meet and entertain perspective student-athletes and alumni.

The dasher boards at Baker Rink were replaced in the summer of 2010 and the facility has a modern ice plant and dehumidification system.

The varsity hallway lies under the east side of the building and features the Princeton locker rooms, equipment room, bike room, athletic training room, coaches rooms and a new kitchenette. Added in 2013, the kitchenette has a plus-size refrigerator, multiple blenders, microwaves and a coffee machine to keep the Tiger fueled throughout the year.

Last year the men's team converted its locker room space and now the players are met with individual dry stalls upon entering the locker room.
