EYE ON THE TIGERS

Princeton is 2-6 on the season and most recently coming off of a 3-0 shutout of No. 20 Clarkson. The Tigers have played their last three games against nationally ranked squads and are now 1-5 in the ECAC. Sophomore David Hallisey has taken over the point scoring column with four, all coming by way of assist. Sophomore Eric Robinson and freshman Max Véronneau follow with three goals apiece. Junior Ben Foster, freshman Ryan Kuffner and freshman Alex Riche each add three points apiece. Junior Colton Phinney owns every decision and has a .943 save percentage and a 2.20 goals against average. Sophomore Ben Halford has seen limited action, just over 11 minutes and stopped six of seven shots.

SCOUTING THE BLACK BEARS

Maine is 2-8-3 overall and in the middle of a six-game homestand. The Black Bears most recently swept Vermont 3-2 and 4-1 last weekend. Four players sit atop the scoring column with six points, including senior Will Merchant and juniors Cam Brown, Blaine Byron (PIT) and Dan Renouf. Merchant has a team-high four goals while the three others have two goals and four assists apiece. Freshman Rob McGovern has played the majority of minutes, 440 and has a .922 save percentage and a 2.45 GAA. Junior Matt Morris has played in 330 minutes with a .932 save percentage and a 2.55 GAA.

GOING BACK

Princeton defeated Maine 3-1, in the consolation game of the Capital City Classic at the Sun National Bank Center on Halloween afternoon.

Senior Kyle Rankin gave Princeton a 1-0 lead and sophomore defender Joe Grabowski expanded it to 2-0 early in the second. Junior Ben Foster sealed the win with an empty-net goal with 2.7 seconds left. Junior Colton Phinney made 38 saves in net.

Princeton's first goal came at 2:42 of the second period. As Maine attempted to clear the puck down the boards, junior Tommy Davis came in to pinch and after sophomore David Hallisey delivered a check, senior Jonathan Liau came skating by to collect the puck. Liau circled behind the goal and came out with it on the left side and gave it to freshman defender Josh Teves at the point. He fired on frame and Rankin was on the doorstep to put it away.

Less than four minutes later, the Tigers added the insurance. It took just 13 seconds from the faceoff following Maine's penalty for Princeton to score the man-advantage marker. Junior Ryan Siiro bounced a Black Bear off the puck in the right corner and pushed it along the back wall to Hallisey. He slide the puck up the ice to Grabowski at the point and he scored through traffic.

The Tigers were able to kill off a five-minute boarding major that came at the conclusion of the second period, thanks in part two minutes being eaten away by Cam Brown's hooking call at 2:56 of the third. Princeton was 1 for 4 on the power play and 5 for 5 on the penalty kill.

Maine was able to break though at 6:08 of the third on a Dane Gibson goal. Colin Riley gloved down a clear in the neutral zone and skated in, dropping the puck off to Gibson at the top of the left circle. Gibson fired through traffic and into the net gloveside.

With 1:04 remaining, Maine netminder Rob McGovern went off. Princeton did a great job of trapping

the puck and it took 25 seconds before Maine was able to control it. A backdoor set-up was squashed by Rankin, before a drive from the point sailed wide. An ensuing face off was taken just inside the Princeton blue line and Foster took the draw and shot it into the corner where Maine had to chase it down. Junior Garrett Skrbich knocked down a long break out pass and sent it towards the goal and Foster popped it in for the empty netter.

THE PRINCETON/MAINE SERIES

Maine holds a one-game edge in the all-time series 6-5-1. Princeton won the last meeting, a 3-1 decision earlier this season on neutral ice at the Capital City Classic. The last three meetings between the teams have been on neutral ice, with two games at the Florida College Classic in 2009 and 2013. The last time Princeton traveled to Maine was in 1996 for the J.C.Penny Classic, where the Tigers defeated Union 6-3 before falling 6-1 to the host school.

SHUT THE FRONT DOOR

Princeton recorded a 3-0 shutout win over No. 20 Clarkson on November 21. It marked the first home shutout since Nov. 10, 2012 against Colgate - a 4-0 win, and first ECAC shutout since Feb. 9, 2013 when Princeton earned a 1-0 win at Cornell.

COMING OUT ON TOP

Princeton's win over No. 20 Clarkson on November 21 marked the team's first win over a nationally ranked squad since a Nov. 23, 2013 when Princeton defeated No. 4 Quinnipiac 4-3 in Hamden. Phinney had firsts in both games: this year it was his first career shutout, in 2013 it was his first career win.

KILLING IT

Princeton has the top ranked penalty kill in the nation at 95.8 percent. The Tigers have killed off 23 of 24 penalties.

ONE-GOAL WONDERS

Three of Princeton's losses were by one goal, while two others were essentially one-goal losses - decided by empty-net tallies. The Tigers were down 1-0 to Harvard before two empty netters in the last 56 seconds, and 2-1 to Yale before an power-play empty netter with 25 seconds left. Just one loss was handily decided - vs. St. Lawrence, a 5-1 game.

PUTTING ON A SHOW IN THE SHOW

Mike Condon '13 was recently relieved of his starting spot in net. He played nine consecutive games for the injured Carey Price. Condon is 7-2 with a 2.23 GAA and a .913 save percentage in 11 games.

NEW GUYS

Princeton welcomes six freshmen as the Class of 2019. They are goalie Austin Shaw - the lone class member from the US, defender Josh Teves, and forwards Alex Riche, Spencer Kryczka, Max Véronneau and Ryan Kuffner.

BIGGER IS BETTER

Princeton is the third biggest team by height in the NCAA, according to College Hockey Inc., The team has an average height of 6-0.93 - behind Cornell (6-1.55) and Western Michigan (6-1.15). Princeton is the sixth biggest team, by weight - weighing an average 193.15. Western Michigan is the largest at 200.63 lbs.

AHEAD BY A CENTURY

This is the 112th season of varsity hockey at Princeton. Princeton is the fourth-oldest hockey program in the country. The first game was played on Nov. 30, 1900 against the Drisler School. Princeton did not compete for one year in WWI and two years during WWII.

STAND UP

Princeton had its first standing-room only crowd of the season on Saturday, Nov. 14 against Harvard with attendance at 2,189.

Last year six of Princeton's 14 home games were standing-room only crowds. The highest home attendance being the RPI game on Jan. 10, with 2,263.

Head Coach Ron Fogarty



Ron Fogarty, who leads all active NCAA coaches in win percentage, was named the head men's hockey coach at Princeton in June 2014.

Fogarty spent seven seasons as head coach at NCAA Division III Adrian College (Adrian, Mich.). He began the program at Adrian and grew it into a powerhouse.

In seven years, he posted a 167-23-10 record. The Bulldogs have competed in the NCAA tournament four times in the last five years and was the national runner-up in 2010-11, losing 4-3 in the national championship game. The Bulldogs won six regular-season titles competing in the Northern College Hockey Association (formerly Midwest Collegiate Hockey Association), and won five Harris Cup playoff championships.

Fogarty led the Bulldogs to unprecedented success as they set an NCAA single-season record for wins by a first-year program at 26-3 in 2007-08. Fogarty's success at Adrian continued, as the program became the fastest hockey program to reach the NCAA tournament and 100 wins. To his credit, Fogarty was named the MCHA Coach of the Year three times and was a four-time finalist for national coach of the year. Academically, the Bulldogs had a combined team GPA of 3.00 or greater in all seven years.

A 1995 graduate of Colgate University, Fogarty is no stranger to the ECAC. As a four-year right winger on the hockey team, he was named to the 1992 ECAC All-Rookie Team, and was a member of Raiders first three seasons under Don Vaughan. As a senior captain at Colgate in 1995, he helped Vaughan to his first 20-win season while earning the Coaches Award and the Terry Slater Award. After playing in the ECAC All-Star game following the completion of his senior season, Fogarty left Colgate ranked 20th on the all-time scoring list with 141 points.

Fogarty's coaching career began shortly thereafter, staying on at Colgate as an assistant coach for three years (1996-99). In 1999, he joined the hockey staff at Clarkson and remained with the Green & Gold through the end of the 2001-02 season. From 2002-06 Fogarty was an assistant coach at Bowling Green. In all, Fogarty coached and/or recruited four Hobey Baker finalists, three All-Americans, eight conference all-stars, four all-rookie selections and nine NHL players.

His professional hockey experience started with the Toledo Storm (ECHL) in 1995 and led to a stint with the Memphis River Kings (CHL) in 1995-96.

Historic Hobey Baker Rink



The spirit of Hobey Baker lives on in the rink bearing his name. Some nine decades ago, in December 1921, it was announced that Princeton would build a hockey rink and name it after its greatest athletic hero, Hobart A.H. Baker '14.

Baker Rink is the second-oldest arena still in use in collegiate hockey.

There have been numerous improvements to the rink, the biggest in the 1980s that added locker rooms, equipment rooms and scoreboard. More major improvements came in the early 2000s when the lobby was upgraded at the north end to include trophy cases and photo montages to the history and tradition of hockey at Princeton. In the northwest corner of the lobby are trophy cases honoring both Hobey Baker and Patty Kazmaier. In 2010, in the southwest corner of the lobby, the Ken Scasserra Friends Room was dedicated. The room, which looks out onto the ice surface provides both teams with a place to meet and entertain perspective student-athletes and alumni.

The dasher boards at Baker Rink were replaced in the summer of 2010 and the facility has a modern ice plant and dehumidification system.

The varsity hallway lies under the east side of the building and features the Princeton locker rooms, equipment room, bike room, athletic training room, coaches rooms and a new kitchenette. Added in 2013, the kitchenette has a plus-size refrigerator, multiple blenders, microwaves and a coffee machine to keep the Tiger fueled throughout the year.

Last year the men's team converted its locker room space and now the players are met with individual dry stalls upon entering the locker room.

New graphics have been added to the hallway in the last few years as the tradition of Princeton hockey continues to build

More upgrades continue as the former weight room is being converted into a player lounge and video room.

Did You Know?

The first game to be played at Hobey Baker Rink was Princeton vs. St. Nick's Hockey Club on Jan. 5, 1923, a 3-2 victory for the Tigers.
