EYE ON THE TIGERS

Princeton is 4-8 overall and coming off of a road sweep of Brown and Yale. The Tigers have beaten the last two nationally ranked squads they have played, including No. 10 Yale and No. 20 Clarkson. Princeton is 3-5 in the ECAC and has won its last three league games. Sporting the nation's fourth-best penalty kill at 90%, the team has allowed just four power-play goals this season.

Freshman Ryan Kuffner has been the leading scorer for the second straight week. He has eight points on four goals and four assist. Sophomore David Hallisey has seven points on a team-best five helpers and two goals. Sophomore Eric Robinson and freshman Max Véronneau have four goals and one assist apiece. Last weekend, five players had multiple points led by junior Ryan Siiro who had two goals and one assist. Junior Garrett Skrbich tallied two goals, while senior Kyle Rankin, senior Tommy Davis and sophomore Joe Grabowski had two assists each. Junior Colton Phinney has every decision in net, with a .940 save percentage, seventh best in the country, and a 2.38 goals against average. This past weekend he stopped 73 of 77 shots in the sweep.

SCOUTING THE NITTANY LIONS

Penn State is off to a 10-2-3 start and ranked No. 16 in the latest USCHO poll. All but two of those games have been non-conference, as the thick of the Big 10 schedule begins in the New Year. The Nittany Lions are unbeaten in their last eight games (6-0-2), with their last loss coming to St. Lawrence on Oct. 30, a 4-2 game. Most recently the team swept Michigan State at home. Penn State has the fourth best scoring offense in the country, averaging 4.27 goals per game, while allowing 2.27 gpg. It's power play, ranked second nationally at 28.8% (19/66) will meet the nation's fourth-best penalty kill in Princeton.

Senior Kenny Brooks leads the team in scoring with five goals and 11 assists for 16 points. Both senior Curtis Loik and junior David Goodwin have 15 points on four goals and 11 helpers. Freshman Chase Berger, younger brother of Princeton alum Jack Berger '13, is next in the scoring column with a team-high nine goals and five assists. Freshman Andrew Sturtz chips in eight goals and five assists for 13 points. Penn State uses two goaltenders, junior Eamon McAdam (NYI) and Matthew Skoff. McAdam is 7-1 with a .933 save percentage and a .201 GAA. Skoff is 3-1-3 with a .907 save percentage and a 2.58 GAA.

THE PRINCETON/PENN STATE SERIES

This is the first meeting between two teams. Penn State is coached by former Princeton head coach Guy Gadowsky. Gadowsky was head coach at Princeton from 2004-11 and led the team to two NCAA Tournament appearances in 2008 and 2009 and an ECAC Championship in 2009. He left Princeton after guiding the team to five straight home playoff series. While at Princeton he coached two ECAC and Ivy Players of the Year, who were also Hobey Baker candidates as well as a Hockey Humanitarian.

THE PRINCETON/USA SERIES

Princeton and the US Under-18 Team have meet three times before, in 2002 (W, 3-1), 2004 (W, 5-3) and 2007 (L, 2-4). The Tigers also played the 1936 (L, 1-2) and 1948 (W, 6-2) Olympic Teams, and the national team in 1971 (L, 3-8) and 1975 (L, 2-6).

SHUT THE FRONT DOOR

Princeton recorded a 3-0 shutout win over No. 20 Clarkson on November 21. It marked the first home shutout since Nov. 10, 2012 against Colgate - a 4-0 win, and first ECAC shutout since Feb. 9, 2013 when Princeton earned a 1-0 win at Cornell.

Princeton has won three straight ECAC Hockey games, defeating No. 20 Clarkson 3-0, Brown 4-2 and No. 10 Yale 4-2. This is the first time since 2010-11 that the Tigers won three consecutive league games.

HAND ME A BROOM

Princeton's sweep at Brown and Yale last week marked the first time the Tigers swept that road trip since 2007-08. It was also Princeton's first win at Yale since the 2012 ECAC first-round series.

COMING OUT ON TOP

Princeton's win over No. 20 Clarkson on November 21 marked the team's first win over a nationally ranked squad since a Nov. 23, 2013 when Princeton defeated No. 4 Quinnipiac 4-3 in Hamden. Phinney had firsts in both games: this year it was his first career shutout, in 2013 it was his first career win.

KILLING IT

Princeton's penalty kill is ranked fourth in the nation at 90 percent. The Tigers have killed off 36 of 40 penalties.

ONE-GOAL WONDERS

Four of Princeton's losses have been by one goal, while two others were essentially one-goal games decided by empty-net tallies. The Tigers were down 1-0 to Harvard before two empty netters in the last 56 seconds, and 2-1 to Yale before an power-play empty netter with 25 seconds left. That's six of Princeton's eight losses.

PUTTING ON A SHOW IN THE SHOW

Mike Condon '13, who played nine consecutive games for an injured Carey Price, will take over that role again as it was announced Price is out six week more weeks.

Condon is 9-4-3 with a 2.22 GAA and a .913 save percentage in 17 games.

- ... was named to the opening day roster on Oct. 5, replacing Dustin Tokarski as backup
- ...has been under contract with Montreal since 2013.

- ...went 6-0-2 to start his NHL career as Montreal had its best start in franchise history at 9-0

Princeton welcomes six freshmen as the Class of 2019. They are goalie Austin Shaw - the lone class member from the US, defender Josh Teves, and forwards Alex Riche, Spencer Kryczka, Max Véronneau and Ryan Kuffner.

BIGGER IS BETTER

Princeton is the third biggest team by height in the NCAA, according to College Hockey Inc., The team has an average height of 6-0.93 - behind Cornell (6-1.55) and Western Michigan (6-1.15). Princeton is the sixth biggest team, by weight - weighing an average 193.15. Western Michigan is the largest at 200.63 lbs.

Head Coach Ron Fogarty



Ron Fogarty, who leads all active NCAA coaches in win percentage, was named the head men's hockey coach at Princeton in June 2014.

Fogarty spent seven seasons as head coach at NCAA Division III Adrian College (Adrian, Mich.). He began the program at Adrian and grew it into a powerhouse.

In seven years, he posted a 167-23-10 record. The Bulldogs have competed in the NCAA tournament four times in the last five years and was the national runner-up in 2010-11, losing 4-3 in the national championship game. The Bulldogs won six regular-season titles competing in the Northern College Hockey Association (formerly Midwest Collegiate Hockey Association), and won five Harris Cup playoff championships.

Fogarty led the Bulldogs to unprecedented success as they set an NCAA single-season record for wins by a first-year program at 26-3 in 2007-08. Fogarty's success at Adrian continued, as the program became the fastest hockey program to reach the NCAA tournament and 100 wins. To his credit, Fogarty was named the MCHA Coach of the Year three times and was a four-time finalist for national coach of the year. Academically, the Bulldogs had a combined team GPA of 3.00 or greater in all seven years.

A 1995 graduate of Colgate University, Fogarty is no stranger to the ECAC. As a four-year right winger on the hockey team, he was named to the 1992 ECAC All-Rookie Team, and was a member of Raiders first three seasons under Don Vaughan. As a senior captain at Colgate in 1995, he helped Vaughan to his first 20-win season while earning the Coaches Award and the Terry Slater Award. After playing in the ECAC All-Star game following the completion of his senior season, Fogarty left Colgate ranked 20th on the all-time scoring list with 141 points.

Fogarty's coaching career began shortly thereafter, staying on at Colgate as an assistant coach for three years (1996-99). In 1999, he joined the hockey staff at Clarkson and remained with the Green & Gold through the end of the 2001-02 season. From 2002-06 Fogarty was an assistant coach at Bowling Green. In all, Fogarty coached and/or recruited four Hobey Baker finalists, three All-Americans, eight conference all-stars, four all-rookie selections and nine NHL players.

His professional hockey experience started with the Toledo Storm (ECHL) in 1995 and led to a stint with the Memphis River Kings (CHL) in 1995-96.

Historic Hobey Baker Rink



The spirit of Hobey Baker lives on in the rink bearing his name.

Some nine decades ago, in December 1921, it was announced that Princeton would build a hockey rink and name it after its greatest athletic hero, Hobart A.H. Baker '14.

Baker Rink is the second-oldest arena still in use in collegiate hockey.

There have been numerous improvements to the rink, the biggest in the 1980s that added locker rooms, equipment rooms and scoreboard. More major improvements came in the early 2000s when the lobby was upgraded at the north end to include trophy cases and photo montages to the history and tradition of hockey at Princeton. In the northwest corner of the lobby are trophy cases honoring both Hobey Baker and Patty Kazmaier. In 2010, in the southwest corner of the lobby, the Ken Scasserra Friends Room was dedicated. The room, which looks out onto the ice surface provides both teams with a place to meet and entertain perspective student-athletes and alumni.

The dasher boards at Baker Rink were replaced in the summer of 2010 and the facility has a modern ice plant and dehumidification system.

The varsity hallway lies under the east side of the building and features the Princeton locker rooms, equipment room, bike room, athletic training room, coaches rooms and a new kitchenette. Added in 2013, the kitchenette has a plus-size refrigerator, multiple blenders, microwaves and a coffee machine to keep the Tiger fueled throughout the year.

Last year the men's team converted its locker room space and now the players are met with individual dry stalls upon entering the locker room.

New graphics have been added to the hallway in the last few years as the tradition of Princeton hockey continues to build

More upgrades continue as the former weight room is being converted into a player lounge and video room.

Did You Know?

The first game to be played at Hobey Baker Rink was Princeton vs. St. Nick's Hockey Club on Jan. 5, 1923, a 3-2 victory for the Tigers.
